INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and a peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2021 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing crime for the year 2021:-

- Geographical spread.
- Reasons for commission of crime, especially in offences against persons.
- Investigation process followed.
- Recovery of property.
- Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

ten years trends of incidence of and rate total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & (2012-2021)Special Laws presented in Table-1.2 at the end of the chapter. A total of 18833 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2021. These comprise 13041 cases under IPC and 5792 cases under (SLL) Special & Local Laws. (Table-1.1 and Chart-1.1 & 1.2)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2012-2021)





CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2021, cases of cognizable crime have decreased by **8.71%** (-1797) as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes has recorded a decrease of **11.90%** and Special & Local Laws crime has recorded a decrease of **0.60%** in 2021 as compared to the previous year.

A total of 13041 IPC cases were reported in the State during 2021, as against 14803 cases in 2020 (11.90% decrease). District Kangra has recorded crime incidents between 2001 to 3000 IPC cases. Shimla, Mandi and Bilaspur districts have recorded crime incidents between 1001 to 2000 IPC cases. Sirmaur, Kullu, Una, Baddi, Hamirpur, Chamba and Solan districts have recorded crime incidents between 501 to 1000 IPC cases. The crime incidents in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, in the Railway & Traffic Unit and the CID Unit have remained below the figure of 500 cases. The district wise volume of crime is depicted in Table

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Kangra (2470 cases) followed by Shimla (1994), Mandi (1789), Bilaspur (1022), Sirmour (944), Kullu (819), Una (775), Baddi (734), Chamba (726), Solan (705), Hamirpur (686), Kinnaur (257), Lahaul & Spiti (80), CID PS (26), GRP (13) and Cyber PS The details of number of (1).falling under different districts ranges of incidents of IPC crimes during the year 2021 are presented in Table 1.3.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)


As compared to 2020, this year the incidents of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Dowry Death have shown an increases, while incidents of Murder, Attempt to murder, Rioting, Assault on women, Cruelty to women, Grievous Hurt, Culpable Homicide and Accident have shown a decrease. There is no increase or decrease in Robbery cases.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The District wise Crime Rate is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2021 was 190.2. The highest Crime Rate districts are Kinnaur (304.9) followed by Baddi (286.5),

Bilaspur (267.5), Lahaul and Spiti (253.7), Shimla (245.1), Solan (220), Kullu (187.2), Mandi (179), Sirmaur (178.1), Kangra (163.9), Hamirpur (151) and Una (148.7). The lowest crime rate was recorded in Chamba (139.9) district.

Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics shows the following trends:-


(i) Murder: (Decrease of 5.49%)

The incidents of murder (86) in 2021 decreased by 5.49% as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents of murder were reported in Kangra (14 cases) and Mandi (13), contributing 31.39 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 4 cases are Baddi (12), Una (11), Shimla (9), Solan (07) Kullu (6) and Chamba (5). The lowest number of incidents of murder were reported

in Bilaspur, Sirmaur (03 each), Kinnaur (2) and GRP (01). No Incident under this head was reported in Hamirpur and Lahaul & Spiti districts. The number of cases registered in the previous 10 years (2012-2021) under this head are presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the revealed causes has that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercations were the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or factor involved caste in the commission of murders.

INCIDENTS OF MURDER DURING (2012-2021)




(ii). Attempt to commit

Murder: (Decrease of 1.42%)

The incidents of Attempt to Commit Murder (69) reported during this year have decreased by 1.42 %. The highest incidents under this head were reported in districts Kangra and Shimla (12 each), followed by Una (9), Chamba (8),

Mandi (7), Bilaspur (6), Baddi & Hamirpur (04 each), Solan (03), Sirmaur (02), Kinnaur (01) and Kullu (01). No incident under this head was reported in Lahaul-Spiti district, GRP and CID unit. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.5.

INCIDENTS OF ATTEMPT TO MURDER DURING (2012-2021)




(iii). Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: (Decrease of 20%)

Total 8 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2021, showing a decrease of 20% over the previous year (10 cases). The highest number of incidents 04

cases were reported in Kangra district, followed by Una (02), Bilaspur and Hamirpur (01 each). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.6.

DURING (2012-2021)




(iv). Rape: (Increase of 8.15%)

Total 358 cases of Rape were reported during 2021; an increase of 8.15% over the previous year (331 cases). The highest incidents of Rape were reported in district Kangra (58), followed by

Mandi, Shimla (57 each), Sirmaur (50), Baddi (31), Chamba (24), Kullu (18), Bilaspur (17), Solan (16), Una (15), Hamirpur (8), Kinnaur (6) and Lahaul & Spiti (01). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1. 7.

INCIDENTS OF RAPE DURING (2012-2021)




(v). Kidnapping and Abduction:

(Increase of 25.4 %)

During the year 2021, a total number of 430 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported; an increase of 25.4% as compared to the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Shimla (69), followed by Kangra (67),

Mandi (60), Solan (38), Sirmaur (37), Hamirpur (32), Baddi (31), Bilaspur, Una (22), Chamba (20) and Kullu (19). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (12) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.8.



(vi). Dowry Death: (Increase of 100%)

2 incidents of Dowry Death, one each in districts Chamba and Mandi were reported during the year 2021, as compared to 1 incident during the previous year. No incident of dowry death was reported in the other districts. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

CHART-1.9 INCIDENTS OF DOWRY DEATH DURING (2012-2021)




(vii). Dacoity: (Increase of 50%)

During the year 2021 a total number of 03 cases, 1 each in districts Baddi, Kangra & Una, with an increase of 50% as compared to the previous year have been registered. No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts of the State. The previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(viii). Robbery: (Increase of 0%)

During the year 2021, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in the State as compared to 8 cases in the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra (5), followed by Baddi (1), Solan (1) and Una (1). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

CHART-1.10 INCIDENTS OF DACOITY AND ROBBERY DURING (2012-2021)




(ix). Burglary: (Increase of 6.18%)

The incidents of Burglary (292) recorded an increase with 6.18% during the year 2021 as compared to the previous year. The highest number of Burglary cases (59) were reported in district Kangra, followed by Shimla (48), Sirmaur (43), Baddi (34), Kullu (24), Hamirpur (17),Bilaspur (14),

Chamba & Mandi (13 each), Solan & Una (11 each) and Kinnaur (5). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. The highest crime rate under this head was 13.27% in Baddi district and the lowest in Mandi 1.30%, as against the State average of 4.26%. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.11.

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2012-2021)




(x). Theft: (Increase of 36.88%)

The Incidents of Theft (475) recorded an increase of 36.88% during the year 2021 over the previous year. Shimla district has reported the highest incidents (76 cases), followed by Kangra (67), Sirmaur (65), Baddi (63), Solan (48), Mandi (36), Bilaspur (31), Una (28), Kullu (24), Hamirpur (19), Chamba

(09), Kinnaur (07), Lahaul & Spiti and GRP (01 each). The highest crime rate under this head was in Baddi district (24.59%) and the lowest (1.73%) in Chamba district as against the State average of 6.93%. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

INCIDENTS OF THEFT DURING (2012-2021)




(xi).Riots: (Decrease of 23.17%)

Incidents of Riots (315) registered during the year 2021 recorded a decrease of 23.17% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra (61), followed by Mandi and Shimla (58 each),

Sirmaur (34), Baddi (31), Una (30), Bilaspur (26), Kullu (24), Solan (15) and Hamirpur (10). Lowest incidents were reported in district Chamba (07), Kinnaur (04) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.13.

INCIDENTS OF RIOTING DURING (2012-2021)




(xii). Grievous Hurt: (Decrease of 10.66%)

A total number of 427 cases under the crime head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2021; a decrease of 10.66% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (115) under this head,

followed by Mandi (53), Shimla (39), Chamba (34), Una (31), Sirmaur (29), Hamirpur (28), Bilaspur (27), Kullu (25), Solan and PD Baddi (15). The least number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (13) and L&S (3). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.14.

INCIDENTS OF HURT DURING (2012-2021)




(xiii). Assault on Women: (Decrease of 9.5%)

A total of 487 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 9.5% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (91), followed by Mandi

(75), Sirmaur (52), Shimla (50), Hamirpur (40), Bilaspur (44), Chamba (43), Kullu & Solan (26 each), Baddi (23), Una (15) and Kinnaur (2). No case was reported in Lahual & Spiti district. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.

DURING (2012-2021)




(xiv). Cruelty to women: (Decrease of 14.6%)

A total of 221 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 14.6 % over the previous year. 37 cases were reported in district Mandi, followed by Kangra (32), Sirmaur (30),

Shimla (19), Hamirpur (17), Una (20), Bilaspur (13), PD Baddi & Chamba (16 each), Kullu (10), Solan (9), Kinnaur and Lahul & Spiti (1 each). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.

INCIDENTS OF CRUELTY TO WOMEN DURING (2012-2021)




(xv). Accidents: (Decrease of 21.63%)

A total of 1750 cases of accident were registered during the year 2021 as against 2223 cases in the previous year. The highest number of accidents were registered in district Kangra with 283 cases, followed by Shimla (254), Mandi

(222), Sirmaur (188), Bilaspur (154), Una (137), Solan (125), Kullu (120), Baddi (115), Hamirpur (75), Chamba (42). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (24), Lahaul & Spiti (11). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17.

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes (Increase of 13.78 %)

Cognizable IPC Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as "Other IPC Crime". As many as 8110 other IPC crimes, accounting for 62.18% of the Total IPC crimes, were registered in the State during 2021.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise), along with percentage

share, are presented in Table-1.6. The ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.18.

INCIDENTS OF OTHER IPC CRIMES DURING (2012-2021)



FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2012-2021)





CHART-1.20 PERCENTAGE VARIATION OF IPC CRIMES FOR THE YEAR 2021 OVER 2020



1.8 Crime under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-II. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2012 to 2021 are presented in Table-1.10.

A total of 5792 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2021. The head-wise

percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2012 to 2021 is presented in Table-1.11. There is a decrease of 0.60% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in Table-1.12.

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws are elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act: (Decrease of 25%)

During this year, 21 cases of Arms Act have been registered, depicting a decrease of 25% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents (6) under this head were reported in district Kangra, followed by Kullu (4), Shimla (03), Mandi (03), Sirmaur (2) Baddi, Bilaspur and Hamirpur (01 case each). No case under this Act was reported in the remaining districts.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS): (Decrease of 0.07%)

A total of 1537 cases were registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in the year 2021, as compared to 1538 cases during previous year, showing a decrease of 0.07%. Cases under this Act constituted 26.53% against the total Local & Special Law cases reported during 2021. The highest number of incidents (231) under this head were reported

in district Shimla, followed by Kullu (206), Kangra (194), Mandi (185), Bilaspur (156), Una (118), Solan (108), Chamba (87), Sirmaur (85), Baddi (65) Hamirpur (63), Kinnaur (35), CID (02) and Lahaul & Spiti (2).

The main concentration on incidents registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Kangra, Mandi, Bilaspur and Una districts, with 70.92% of the total registered cases. Analysis reveals that the main sources/areas of drugs are Shimla, Kullu, Kangra, Mandi, Bilaspur and Una district. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile of the accused shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (48.5%). About 37.4% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Those above 45 years were 12.5%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.80%). 50 foreigners were involved in this activity, which include 16 African, and 34 Asian (Nepalese). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.21.



(iii). Gambling Act: (Increase of 66.47%)


A total of 556 cases under the Gambling Act have been registered during 2021. The highest number of cases (191) were reported in district Una, followed by Baddi (107), Sirmaur (91) Kinnaur (37), Kullu, Shimla (35 each), Chamba (22), Kangra (11), Mandi & Solan (8 each) Hamirpur (5) Bilaspur (3) and L&S (3). No incident under this head was reported in CID and GRP.

(iv). Excise Act: (Increase of 5.25%)

The cases registered (2821) under the Excise Act showed

an increase of 5.25% over the previous year. Cases under this Act contributed 51.26% against the total cases under Local & Special Law (SLL) reported during 2021. The highest number (619) of cases were reported in district Kangra, followed by Mandi (467), Chamba (377), Kullu (281), Shimla (253), Una (197), Sirmaur (162), Kinnaur (130), Hamirpur (109) Solan (111), Bilaspur (107), and Baddi (106). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in L&S (42) CID (4) and GRP (1). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.22.

CHART-1.22 DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING 2012-2021




(v). Forest Act: (Decrease of 23.08%)

The number of cases (169) registered under the Forest Act showed a decrease of 23.08% over the previous year. Shimla district has reported the highest number of cases (29), followed by Kullu (20), Mandi (17), Una (13), Sirmaur (12), Baddi & Chamba (10)each) Bilaspur, Kangra & Kinnaur (6 each). The lowest registration under this Act was seen in Solan (1). No case under this head was reported in districts Hamirpur, Lahaul & Spiti, and in CID and GRP.

The analysis reveals that majority of the cases have been registered in districts Shimla, Chamba and Mandi. These cases involve encroachment on forest land, smuggling of forest produce such as Timber, Fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut Bark, Brich Bark, Brahmi leaves and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.23.

(vi). Protection of Civil RightsAct: (Decrease of 75%)

During the year 2021, 1 incident under the PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.


(vii). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act: (Increase of 4.31%)

A total of 218 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act, as against 209 cases during the previous year; an increase of 4.31%. The highest numbers of (64) cases were reported in district Mandi,

followed by Kangra (38), Shimla (27), Hamirpur (22), Bilaspur (19), Kullu (15), Una (15), Solan (07) and Sirmaur (06). The lowest number of case under this Act were registered in Police District Baddi (03) and district Chamba (02). No incidents under this Act were reported in L&S, Kinnaur, CID and GRP.

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high Mandi. Kangra, Shimla, in Hamirpur and Bilaspur districts. most common reason for The registering cases under this Act is a feeling of hurt when one is called by derogatory names. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(viii). Other Local & Special Law Cases (including Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc.)

A total of 360 Local & Special Law cases were reported under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown a decrease of 50.28% over the previous year (732 cases). The highest number of cases were reported from district Shimla (49).

During 2021, a total of 5792 cognizable crimes were

reported in the State under various heads of Local & Special Laws (SLL), which shows a decrease of 6 % over the previous year.

It is observed that 7 specific crime heads accounted for 93.78% of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 6.22% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.25.

DURING 2012-2022




CHAPTER-2

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity.** The head wise analysis of crime against property for the year 2021 is as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

Increase of 36.88 % & 6.18% respectively

During the year 2021, 475 cases of theft and 292 cases of burglary were registered, which is an increase of 128 cases in theft and 17 cases in burglary over the previous year. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major heads namely: - Auto theft, theft of Cash & Jewelry, Cultural Property theft, theft of electronic components and theft of other materials.

Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 7 districts i.e. Shimla, Sirmaur, Baddi, Kangra, Solan, Mandi and Bilaspur.

(ii) Robbery: No increase

During the year 2021, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in the State as compared to 8 cases during

the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra (5), followed by Solan (1), Una (1) and PD Baddi (1). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(iii) Dacoity: Increase of 50%

During the year 2021, 3 cases of Dacoity were registered; an increase of 1 case over the previous year. One case each under this head was registered in districts Baddi, Kangra and Una.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

Recovery increased by 2.11%

During the year 2021, property worth Rs.1309.67 lakhs was reported stolen in 635 cases, as compared to Rs.903.77 lakhs in 632 cases during the previous year.

Property worth Rs. 720. 83 lakhs was recovered during 2021. The percentage of recovery is 55.03%. The value of property recovered showed an increase of 2.11% over the previous year.


The details of property stolen and recovered, along with percentage of recovery during the last 10 years (2012 to 2021) and corresponding variations are presented in Table 2.1.


VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING


THE PERIOD 2012-2021

Crime head and district wise value of property stolen recovered, including percentage of recoveries, is presented in Table 2.3.

Kangra district reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 3,64,84,123/-) followed by Shimla (Rs. 2,46,51,166/-, Baddi (Rs.1,92,48,208/-)and Sirmaur (Rs. 1,05,07,867). Rest of the

districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.

The highest value of recovery was seen in District Kangra (Rs. 1,99,26,896 /-).


The highest recovery percentage of stolen property was seen in district Lahaul & Spiti (97.47%), followed by Bilaspur (81.47%), PD Baddi (76.22%), Kinnaur (75.17%), Kullu (74.52%) and Mandi (66.94%).

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among the four different types of property crimes, the maximum stolen value of property (Rs.673.47 Lakhs) and share (51%) were seen under the head Theft. The minimum stolen value of Rs. 12.70 Lakhs and share (2%) was seen under the head Robbery.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Dacoity (97.52%), followed by Theft (67.90%), Robbery (56.27%) and

Burglary (35.23%). The crime headwise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2012 to 2021) is presented in Table 2.4.

2.4 Nature of Property:

Nature of property under heads Theft and Burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewelry, theft of Cultural Property, Theft of electronic items, Household articles/furniture. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as 'other kind of property'. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in Table 2.5.

DURING THE YEAR 2021



(WORKED OUT) -2021




2.6 Crime against Persons:-

Crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime viz. heads Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Murder, Attempt to Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry Deaths.

The analysis reveals that a total of 2403 cases of crime against persons have occurred during 2021, which comprises 18.42% of the total IPC crime. The

highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC crimes was recorded in districts Sirmaur (25.1%), PD Baddi (22.2%), Chamba (21.08%), Hamirpur (20.4%), Una Mandi (19.1%),(20%),Kangra (18.4%),Solan (17.6%),Kinnaur (16.0%),(15.8%),Kullu Bilaspur (15.6%),**GRP** (15.4%),Shimla (14.7%), L&S (8.8%) and CID (0%). The district-wise details have been calculated and presented in Table 2.7. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in Chart 2.6.


CHART 2.5

The highest number of incidents of crime against persons have been recorded in district Kangra (454), followed by Mandi (341), Shimla (293), Sirmour (237), PD Baddi (163), Bilaspur (159),Chamba (158),Una (155),Hamirpur (140), Kullu (129), Solan (124), Kinnaur (41), Lahaul & Spiti (7), and GRP (2). The District-wise details have been calculated and presented in Table 2.8.

The head - wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2012 to 2021) has been reviewed. During the year 2021, 2403 incidents have been recorded; a decrease of 128 cases over the previous year. The head-wise figures for the last 10 years are presented in Table 2.9. Chart 2.6 shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and their comparison with those of the previous year is as under:-

(i) Murder: Decrease of 5.49%

During the year 2021, 86 incidents of Murder were reported, as compared to 91 cases of the previous year. Analysis of these cases has revealed that no organized gang is operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime was committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal vendetta or enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercation was the reason for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of these murders.

(ii) Attempt to Murder: Decrease of 1.42%

69 incidents of Attempt to Murder were reported during the year 2021 as compared to 70 cases during the previous years. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under the head 'Murder'

(iii) Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder:

Decrease of 20%

8 incidents of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during the year 2021, a decrease of 2 cases over the previous year.

(iv) Rape: Increase of 8.15%

358 cases of Rape were reported during the year 2021, an increase of 27 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction: Increase of 25.36%

During 2021, 430 cases were registered; an increase of 87 cases over the previous year. Analysis shows that 45.58% cases of Kidnapping & Abduction were reported in districts Shimla, Mandi and Kangra.

(vi) Grievous Hurt:

Decrease of 10.66%

A total of 427 incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported during 2021. Analysis shows that 56.44% incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported in districts Chamba, Kangra, Mandi and Shimla.

(vii) Rioting: Decrease of 23.17%

During the year 2021, 315 incidents of Rioting were reported in the State, as against 410 cases during the previous year; a decrease of 95 cases. Analysis shows that 54.28% incidents of rioting were reported in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Sirmaur.

(viii) Cruelty to Women: Decrease of 14.67%

A total of 221 cases of Cruelty to Women were reported in the State during the year 2021, a decrease of 38 cases over the previous year. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".

(ix) Assault on women:

Decrease of 9.47%

During the year 2021, 487 incidents of Molestation were reported in the State, as against the 538 incidents of the previous year; a decrease of 51 cases. The cases under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women"

(x) Dowry Deaths:

Increase of 50%

During the year 2021, 02 cases of Dowry Death one each in districts Chamba and Mandi were reported. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".

2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

(i) The incidence of crime against persons is higher in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Sirmaur as compared to the other districts of the State. Offences of murder have however taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.

(DISTRICT WISE)



TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2021 a total of 16520 including cases, cases pending from the previous years, were under investigation. Out of these, 13729 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 2791 remain pending cases investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise Police disposal during 2021. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and of disposal of under type investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2021 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

3.1.2 Pendency:


On an average, 16.89 % cases remained under investigation. the following units/districts, pendency was the highest:

3.1.3 Cases under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at Table-3.4 of the total 6890 cases (including pending

cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 86.9% cases. Chart-3.3 presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2021





3.2 Disposal by Courts

3.2.1 Cases under IPC:

Disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2021 is presented in Table 3.7. During 2021 there were 114427 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years). 110934 of IPC cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage disposal during the year was 3.1%.

The District wise disposal figures are presented in Table-3.8 and percentage of disposal is presented in Table-3.9. The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Distt. Kangra (99.1%), followed by CID (98.4%). The largest number of cases are also pending trial in Kangra district (27541), which has a pendency of 24% of state level.

Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2021.

3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2021 is presented in Table-3.10. There were 32951 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2021. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 29115. The percentage of disposal is 11.6%.

CASES BY COURTS DURING-2021



CASES BY COURTS DURING 2021



DISPOSAL OF (IPC) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2021



CONVICTED CASES (IPC) DURING 2021



CONVICTED CASES (SLL) DURING 2021





CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crimes which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crimes against Women. They may be broadly classified under the following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder (Sec. 302, 303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec. 304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (iv) Acid Attack
- (v) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (vi) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363, 366 IPC)
- (vii) Rape
- (viii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (ix) Assault on Woman with intend to outrage her modesty Sec.354 IPC)
- (x) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of laws affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some Acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are:-

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restraint Act.
- (iv) Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act
- (v) Sati Prevention Act.

Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. Special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the resources of the community.

Crime against women witnessed a minor decrease during

the year 2021 in comparison to the previous year. The last 10 years annual average of crime against women is 1516. During the year 2021, 1599 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to the 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report incidents which took place with them and there have also been certain changes of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

The HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has been constituted at

the State CID Hdqrs. 06 Anti Human Trafficking Units (AHTU's) have also been established in Shimla, Kangra, Sirmaur, Kullu, Solan & Chamba. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the State. No special organized gang is operative in the State to commit crime against women.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Decrease of 0.92%

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2020 and 2021, along with percentage variation, are presented in Table 4.1.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (44.27%). There were also a number of instances (22.38%) of rape and (21.51%) Kidnapping and Abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2021 are presented in Table 4.2, Chart 4.3 and Chart 4.4.

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2021




CHART 4.2

DURING 2021 OVER 2020




CHART 4.3
DISTRICT WISE REGISTRATION AND RATE OF CRIME DURING 2021






CHART 4.4

The head and district wise incidents, their rate and percentage has been calculated and presented in Table 4.3.

The total figures of crime against women for the last 10 years (2012-2021) are presented in Table 4.4 and Chart 4.5.





From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that registration of cases of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction insult to outrage modesty, immoral trafficking was higher during the year 2021 as compared to the previous year.

The districts which reported the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-

Spiti (04) Kinnaur (17), Una (77) Kullu (80) Solan (97).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2021 is as under:

(i) Murder: (Decrease of 100%)

No incidents under this head was reported in any of the districts.

(ii) Rape: (Increase of 8.16%)

A total of 358 cases of Rape were reported, which is an increase of 8.16% over the previous year (331 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in district Kangra (58), followed by Mandi, Shimla (57 each), Sirmaur (50), Baddi (31), Chamba (24), Kullu (18), Bilaspur (17), Solan (16), Una (15), Hamirpur (8), Kinnaur (6) and L&S (1).

Reasons:-

- 1. Revelation of Illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties leading to registration of cases.
- 2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.
- 3. False registration due to enmity.
- 4. Rapes of minors.

(iii) Dowry Deaths: (Increase of 50%)

Under this head 02 incidents were reported in Chamba and Mandi districts (01 each). No incidents under this head were reported in rest of the districts.

(iv) Kidnapping & Abduction:

(Increase of 22.41%)

During the year 2021, 344 incidents of Kidnapping Abduction were registered; increase of 22.41% over the previous year (281 cases). Kangra district reported the highest incidents (56 under this crime head, cases) followed by Mandi (52), Shimla (48), Solan (36), Sirmaur (29), Hamirpur (25), Baddi (23), Bilaspur (21), Chamba (19), (Una (15), Kullu (14) and Kinnaur (6).

(v) Assault on women with intend to outrage modesty (Sec.354)

(Decrease of 9.47%)

487 cases of Assault on women with intend to outrage modesty were registered during the year 2021; a decrease of 9.47% over the previous year. Kangra district recorded the highest (91 cases), followed by Mandi (75), Sirmaur (52), Shimla (50), Bilaspur (44), Chamba (43), Hamirpur (40), Kullu & Solan (26 each), Baddi (23), Una, (15) and Kinnaur (2). No cases under this head were reported in L&S district.

(vi) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Decrease of 10.52 %)

A decreasing trend is seen under this head with a 10.52% decrease over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra district (13), followed by Baddi (7), Bilaspur & Mandi (6 each), Hamipur (5), Una (4), Chamba (3), Kullu, Shimla & Sirmaur (2 each) and Solan (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

(vii) Cruelty to Women: (Decrease of 14.67%)

221 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2021. This head showed a decrease of 14.67% over the previous year. The highest number of cases (37) were registered in Mandi

district, followed by Kangra (32), Sirmaur (30), Una (20), Shimla (19), Hamirpur (17), Baddi, Chamba (16 each), Bilaspur (13), Kullu (10), Solan (9) Kinnaur and L&S (1 each).

Reasons:-

- 1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
- 2. Harassment and torture of women by her in laws i.e. husband, mother in law, father in law etc. on the pretext that she is not capable to doing house hold and agriculture activities.
- 3. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to illicit relationship of the husband with another woman.
- 4. Torture/harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
- 5. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father in law and mother in law of the victims.

(viii) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC): (Increase of 6.82%)

There was an increase in registration under this head by 6.82% over the previous year. The number of cases registered were Mandi (24), Hamirpur (16), Shimla (12) Kangra (8) Bilaspur (6) Sirmaur, Una (5 each), Baddi, Chamba, Solan

(4 each) Kullu (3), Kinnaur (2) and L&S (1).

(ix) Immoral Trafficking

(Increase of 600%)

Total of 06 case of Immoral Trafficking was registered during the year 2021, as compared to zero registration in the previous year.



CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Crime against children includes violations under certain sections of the Indian Penal Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

- i. Murder
- ii. Abetment to Suicide
- iii. Infanticide
- iv. Exposure and Abandonment
- v. Hurt/Grievous Hurt
- vi. Kidnapping and abduction
- vii. Rape
- viii. Attempt to commit Rape
- ix. Assault on girl

- x. Insult to the modesty of a girl
- xi. Protection of Children from sexual offences
- xii. Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- xiii. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xiv. Other crimes committed against Children


5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and Chart 5.1 depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2021.

5.3 Incidents:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

A total of 740 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. Kidnapping Abduction constituted the largest category with 393 cases (53.11%) the year. reported during The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Shimla district (65 cases), followed by Kangra (62), Mandi, (55), Solan (36), Sirmaur (30), Baddi (28), Hamirpur (26) Bilaspur & Una (22 each), Chamba & Kullu (17 each), Kinnaur (12), and L&S (01).

The second most prevalent Crime against Children

was Rape along with POCSO Act, which accounted for 215 cases (29.05%). The highest number of Rape cases were reported in Districts Shimla & Sirmaur (37 each), followed by Mandi (30), Kangra (25), Baddi (21), Una (13), Bilaspur & Kullu (12 each), Chamba (11), Solan (07), Kinnaur (06), Hamirpur (03) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

O5 cases under the head Murder of Children were reported in the State. 1 each in Baddi, Chamba, Mandi, Solan and Sirmaur. No case of Murder of children has been reported in rest of the districts of the State.

The incidence and percentage contribution of crimes against children head and district wise is presented in Table.5.2.





CHAPTER-6 ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

A total of 17802 persons (11693 under IPC & 6109 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2021 in 18833 cases (13041 under IPC & 5792 Local & Special Laws), which is a decrease of 7.4% when compared with the arrests of 19222 persons (12921 under IPC & 6301 under Local & Special Laws) in the year 2020.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:


Increase of 2.38%

During the year 2021 as many as 11693 persons were arrested in 13041 cases registered under IPC, as against 12921 persons in 2020. Chart 6.1 depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2019-2021.

Table 6.1 gives details of arrests made under IPC crime during the last 3 years 2019-2021.

Table 6.2 gives agegroup wise and gender wise break up of persons arrested in districts.

District Mandi tops in arresting 3319 persons in 1789 cases during 2021, followed by district Shimla by arresting 2569 persons in 1994 cases and Sirmaur by arresting 1180 persons in 944 cases.

In Una 775 cases were registered and 1026 persons arrested. District Baddi has 734 registered cases and arrested 903 persons, Kullu 832 persons were

arrested against the registration of 819 cases during the year 2021. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in Table 6.3.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC crime during the years 2021 and Chart 6.3 depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC crime cases during the year 2021 in descending order.

CHART- 6.2 AGE-GROUP WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2021




DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2021




(ii) Persons arrested under SLL cases: (Decrease of 3.05%)



District Mandi has arrested the highest number (1100) of persons with (778) cases registered during the year 2021, followed by district Shimla by arresting (1011) persons in (627)

cases, Kullu (941) persons in (594) cases, Una (737) persons in (580) cases, Kangra (462) persons in (920) cases registered.

Sirmaur has registered 392 cases with 394 persons arrested, Kinnaur has 214 cases with 357 person arrested, Solan 248 cases with 348 persons arrested, and Baddi 317 cases with 338 persons arrested.

2021



CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However, sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare development of its people in general vulnerable of sections particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by constitution of India, which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental Rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to

support programmes for social, economic and educational advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in particular.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force including from time to time, privileges by way of reservations.

Following are two of the major legal enactments sponsored by Centre:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled **Tribes** (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments extended have the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that more stringent than for are corresponding offences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, the National Commission for SCs and STs was

constituted w.e.f 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socioeconomic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes against weaker sections identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights
 Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crimes under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC

and SLL respectively and have been discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:

As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 25.19% of the total population in the State, while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 5.7%. District Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Castes (21.15%), followed by Mandi (17%) and Shimla with (12.47%).

7.5 Incidents of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidents of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 251 cases in the State during 2021. Head wise details of crime against weaker sections for the last 3 years, including percentage change over the previous years, is presented in Table 7.1. Chart 7.1 depicts the head wise

position of the crime incidents. The district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in Table 7.2.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2020. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year 2021 are given below:

(i) Murder: (Increase of 50%)

During the year 2021, 2 incidents were reported in Kullu & Mandi (one each) districts under the head Murder against weaker sections in the state.

(ii) <u>Rape:</u> (Decrease of 7.14%)

During the years 2021, 13 incidents of rape were reported in the State. The highest numbers of incidents under this head were reported in district Una & Mandi (03 each), followed by Kullu, Shimla & Solan (02 each), Hamirpur. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.


(iii) SC/ST Protection of Civil

Rights Act: (Decrease of 75%)

During the year 2021, only 1 incident of PCR Act was

reported in Kinnaur district under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv) <u>SC/ST (Prevention of</u> Atrocities) Act 1989 only:

(Increase of 6.22%)

During the year 2021, 222 incidents were reported under this head; an increase of 13 cases over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this

head were reported in district Mandi (64), followed by Kangra (39), Shimla (27), Hamirpur (22), Bilaspur (19), Una & Kullu (15 each), Solan (07) Sirmaur & Baddi (06 each) and Chamba (05). No incident under this head was reported in rest of the districts.



CHAPTER-8 SUICIDAL DEATHS

8.1 General:

According to the Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The word 'suicide' has its origin in the Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'cardere' [kill]. It is a step which is generally taken by one in an emotionally or mentally weak moment, when he or she feels that coping with life is impossible.

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2021 was 889, as against 857 during 2020, indicating an increase of 3.73%.

Kangra district recorded the highest number of suicides during 2021 (208), followed by Mandi (113), Shimla (80), Solan (73), Sirmaur (72), Una (71), Hamirpur (65), Baddi (65), Bilaspur (57). Suicides during the period 2012-2021 are presented in Chart 8.1

District-wise break-up of suicides during 2021 is presented in Table 8.1. Comparative suicidal deaths for the last 10 years (2012-2021) including male and female is presented in Table 8.1. Chart 8.2 depicts the district wise incidence of suicidal deaths during 2021.

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2012-2021




From the above table it is revealed that there has been an increase of over 3.73% (from 857 to 889) in suicide cases during the year 2021 over the year 2020. The increase has been witnessed in

Baddi (52 to 65), Bilaspur (42 to 57), Chamba (26 to 34), Kangra (185 to 208), Sirmaur (59 to 72) and Solan (57 to 73). However, there has been a decrease in rest of the districts of the State.

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in Baddi, Hamirpur, Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, Solan and Una has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned during the years 2020 & 2021. In other words, these 07 districts have higher rates of

suicidal deaths as compared to the other districts of the State.

It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (69.7% males as against 30.93% females in 2021) and (65.5% males as against 34.5% females in 2020).

It is further revealed that there has been an increase of 9.4% in the male suicide cases (from 561 to 641) and a decrease of 7.09% in the number of female suicides cases (from 296 to 275) during the year 2021 as compared to the year 2020.




From this table, it is revealed that most of those who committed suicide, whether males or females, were married (68.4% in 2020 and 70.41% in 2021).



The causes that top the list which led to suicides are Family problems (51.7% in 2020) and (46.6%

in 2021), followed by illness (15.06% in 2020 and 25.87% in 2021).






The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus, it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (70.36% in 2020 and 70.30% in 2021). This fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.



and **housewives** in case of females (21.37%). This fact can again be corelated to the age profile falling within 18-45 years.



The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have suicide committed hanging. by (44.3% in 2020 and 45.82% in 2021). This is followed by consuming **poison** (49.0% in 2020 and 48.36% in 2021).

8.11. Conclusions:


- i) There has been an increase in the suicide cases committed by men during the year 2021 as against the year 2020.
- ii) Kangra, Mandi, Sirmour, Solan, Una and Shimla districts reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 07 districts of the State.
- iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems', followed by 'illness'.
 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of

- suicides as it contributes less than 20% of total suicide cases.
- iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form a major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 2.7% to the total suicide cases.
- v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- vi) The most common means for committing suicide in the year 2021 was taking 'poison', followed by 'hanging'.

MAP-8.1 SUICIDES - 2021






ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in Table-9.1

Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo account for the largest number of

accidents. During the year 2021, 38.7% of the road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2021 is presented in Table-9.2. 2408 road accidents were reported during the year 2021 out of which 1032 accidents were fatal.

Accidental Deaths:

Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo responsible for 38.7% were of accidental deaths during 2021. Out of the 1032 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 536 were involved in accidents with these types of vehicles. Table-9.2 gives details of road accidental deaths for the year 2021 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. District Shimla reported the highest (188) numbers of accidental deaths, followed by Kangra (125) Sirmaur (111), Mandi (110), Baddi (98), and Una (95). Chart-9.1 depicts road accidents that occurred during 2012-2021.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type

of vehicles during the year 2021 is presented in Chart-9.2.

VEHICLES DURING 2021)



DISTRICT WISE TOTAL ACCIDENTS DURING 2021 (FATAL AND NON FATAL)






CYBER CRIME

10.1 Definition of Cyber Crime:

"Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer."

Computer and Telecommunications are the key areas of Cybercrimes. In Cybercrimes, Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of Cybercrime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a Computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for Cybercrime when it becomes

a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale networks and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.
- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a

protected computer programmes.

- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
- (ix) Alteration of computer

 data or computer

 programmes
- (x) Computer espionage
- (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
- (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected Computer programmes.

10.3. Incidents of ComputerCrime: (Decrease of 28.6%)

During the year 2021, 70 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act only 54 cases, IPC with IT act 16 cases) were registered in the State and during 2020 this figure was 98.

Chart 10.1 depicts the incidents of Cyber Crimes reported from 2019-Table 10.1 carries 2021. the district-wise details of cases registered under the IT Act. Table gives the details of Cyber 10.2 Crimes registered and persons arrested under the I.T. Act during 2019-2021 :-



DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES (ND&PS) ACT

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh:-

The State of Himachal Pradesh is well known for its natural beauty and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. Unfortunately, this beautiful State has also come to be known for illicit cultivation of cannabis and opium poppy. Illicit drugs produced in the State attract drug traffickers. Generally, the youth seem to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, nonmedical use of limited number of substances. Most of such drugs have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined inappropriate, by statute to be undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Alcohol, heroin, cocaine, opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh, there are 17495 villages out of which in 402 villages of the following five Districts cannabis grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis:

Narcotic Drugs:

The term 'narcotic' originally referred medically to any psychoactive compound with numbing or paralyzing properties. In large doses, such drugs can cause stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like

 Pethidine.

11.2 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means 'Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The psychotropic drugs include:

1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.

- 2) **Hypnotics:** Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) **Stimulants:** These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.

4) Tranquillizers:

Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.

11.3 Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates and opiates.



The drug-wise detection during the year 2021 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the Chart 11.1. The major detection of poppy husk (1903.244 kgs) has been made during the year 2021 followed by Charas (597.341Kgs.), Ganja (813.962 kgs), Opium (40.720 kgs). Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ heroin etc. has also been made during the year 2021.

11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The incidence (1537) under the ND&PS Act showed a decrease of 0.06% over 2020. Cases under this Act contributed 26.4% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2021. The highest number of cases (231) under this head were reported in


District Shimla, followed by Kullu (206), Kangra (194), Mandi (185), Bilaspur (156), Una (118), Solan (108), Chamba (87), Sirmaur (85), Baddi (65), Hamirpur (63), Kinnaur (35), Lahaul & Spiti (2). CID (02)

The main concentration on the cases registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Kangra and Mandi districts, with 53.09% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are districts Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 80.8% belong to Himachal Pradesh. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (55.5%). About 34.8% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 9.7%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.8%). Only seven Foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in Chart-11.1

12.1 Police Strength:

(298),Inspectors Sub-Inspectors (744)Assistant Sub-Inspectors (1197).The strength of Head Constables and Constables 15949, (HCs-3045 and Const.-12904). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 345, Class-IV 559. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in Table 12.1.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2021, Zone. were 1 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 13 Districts (including one Police District at Baddi), 34 Police Sub-Divisions. 139 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and two Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in Table 12.2.

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is

depicted in Table 12.4. During the budget year 2021-22, Himachal Pradesh Police Budget accounted for 2.70% of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2021 are presented in Table 12.5. There are 74 HF Sets, 1091 VHF Sets, 2220 Walkie Talkies and 30 other equipments available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 493 Motor Cycles, 226(Gypsy/Jeep/Bolero/Tata Mobiles), 169 Heavy Vehicles and 32 Vans & others. The district wise details are given in Table 12.6.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge Sheeting Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and Final Report presented in court to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.


Property Offence:
