CHAPTER-1

INCIDENCE AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

The Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and peaceful state. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2011 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing the crime for the year 2011:-

- ➡ Geographical spread.
- ➡ Reasons for commission of crime especially in offences against persons.
- ➡ Investigative process followed.
- ➡ Recovery of property.
- ➡ Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidence of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incidence and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local and Special Laws (2010-2011) is presented in Table-1.2 at the end of the chapter. Total numbers of 18875 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2011. This comprise of 14312 cases under IPC and 4563 cases under (SLL) Local & Special Law. (Table-1.1 and Chart-1.1 & 1.2)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEAR (2002-2011)**

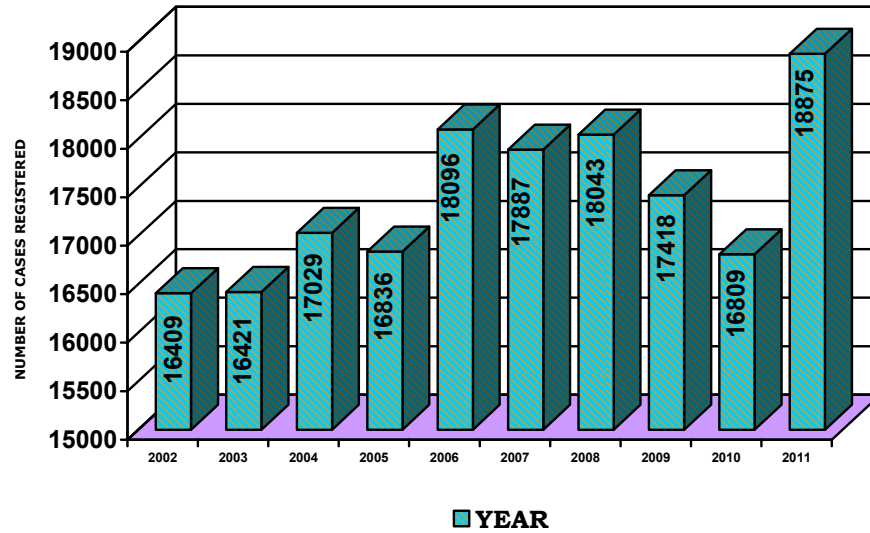
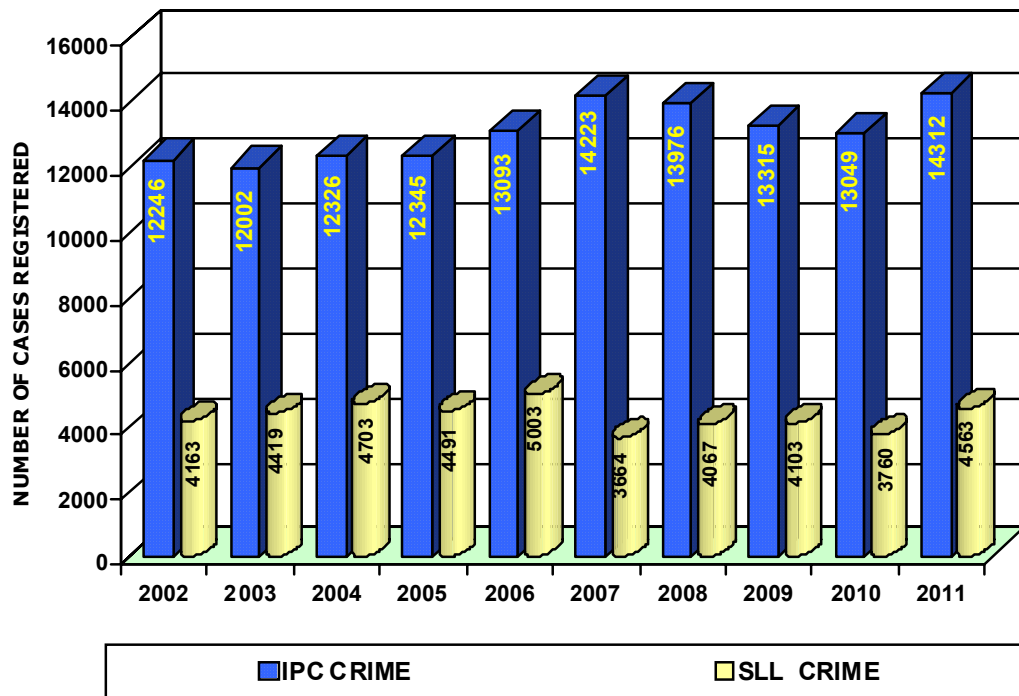

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidence:

During the year 2011, cases of cognizable crime have increased by 12.29% (2066) when compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in both IPC crimes and Special & Local Laws crime have recorded increased of 9.68% and 21.36% respectively in 2011 as compared to the previous year 2010.

Total 14312 IPC cases were reported in the State during the year 2011, as against 13049 cases during 2010 (9.68% increase). District Shimla, Kangra, Mandi and Hamirpur have recorded crime incidence between 1000 to 3000 IPC cases in each, district Solan, Una, Kullu and Sirmaur have recorded crime between 800 to 1000 IPC cases each, Hamirpur, Chamba and Baddi have recorded crime between 500 to 700 IPC cases each. The crime in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic unit and CID Unit have remain below the figure of 200 cases. The district wise detailed volume of crime is depicted in the Table-1.3.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crimes Trends:

The highest incidence of IPC cases was reported in District Shimla (2866 cases) followed by Kangra (2709), Mandi (1640), Bilaspur (1077) Solan (959), Kullu (934), Una (921), Sirmaur (866), Hamirpur (793), Chamba (678), Baddi (579) Kinnaur (162), and Lahaul & Spiti (102). The detail of number of districts falling under different ranges with incidence of IPC crimes during the year 2011 is presented in Table-1.3.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)

As compared to 2010, this year incidences of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Dowry Death, Hurt, Accident, Burglary, Theft and other IPC cases have shown increase while Murder,

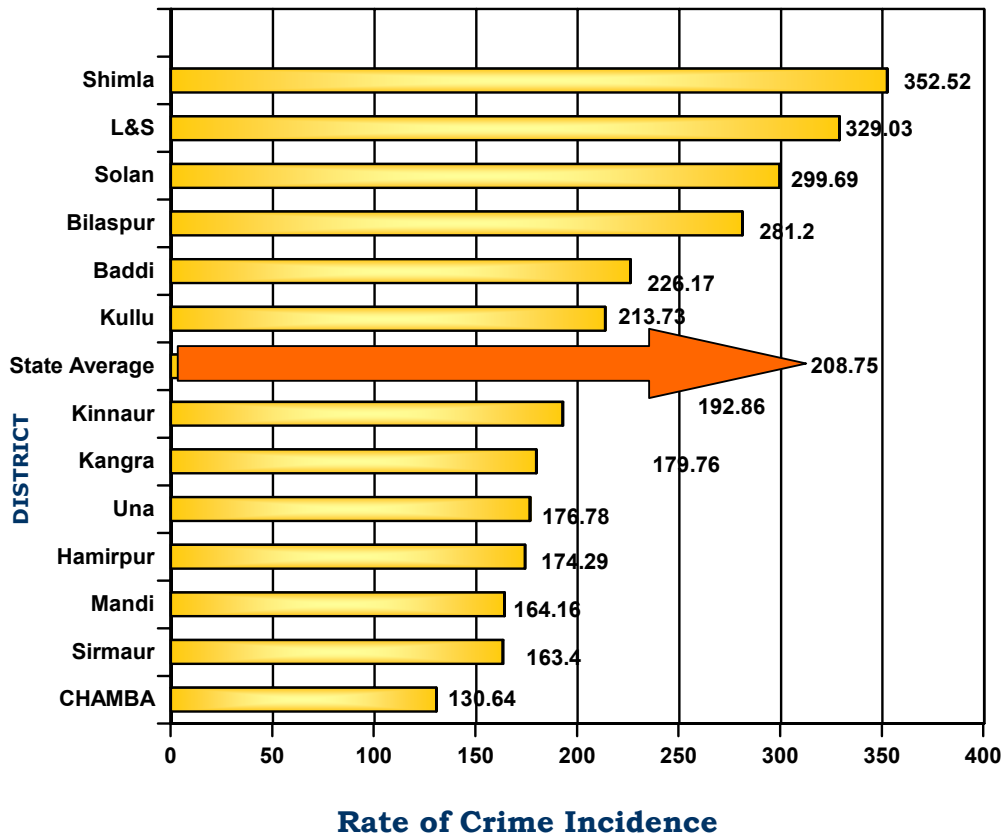
Culpable Homicide, Attempt to murder, dacoity, robbery, Cruelty to women, molestation and rioting cases have reported a decrease.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The Crime Rate, District wise is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2011 was 208.75. The Crime Rate was the highest in Shimla (352.52) followed by Lahaul & Spiti (329.03), Solan (299.69), Bilaspur (281.20), Baddi (226.17), Kullu (213.73, Kinnaur (192.86), Kangra(179.76), Una 176.78) Hamirpur(174.29) and the lowest crime rate were found to be in districts Mandi (164.16), Sirmaur (163.4) and Chamba. (Chart-1.3) and Table 1.4.

1.7. Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics indicates the following trends:-

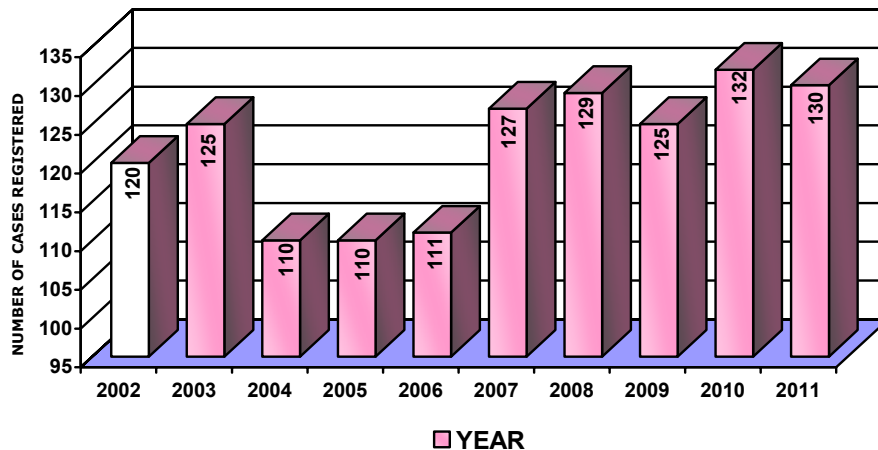
(i) Murder : (Decrease 1.52 %)

The incidence of murder (130) in 2011 decreased by 1.52% as compared to the previous year 2010. Highest incidence of murder was reported in Kangra (21 cases) district, contributing 0.11 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 10 cases were Shimla (20), Chamba (15), Solan (14) Kullu and Mandi (13 cases each)). The lowest incidence of murder was reported in districts Sirmaur (9), Bilaspur (8), Baddi and Una (6 each), Hamirpur (3) and Kinnaur (2) . No incidence of murder was reported in district Lahaul & Spiti. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases crime was committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercations were the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.

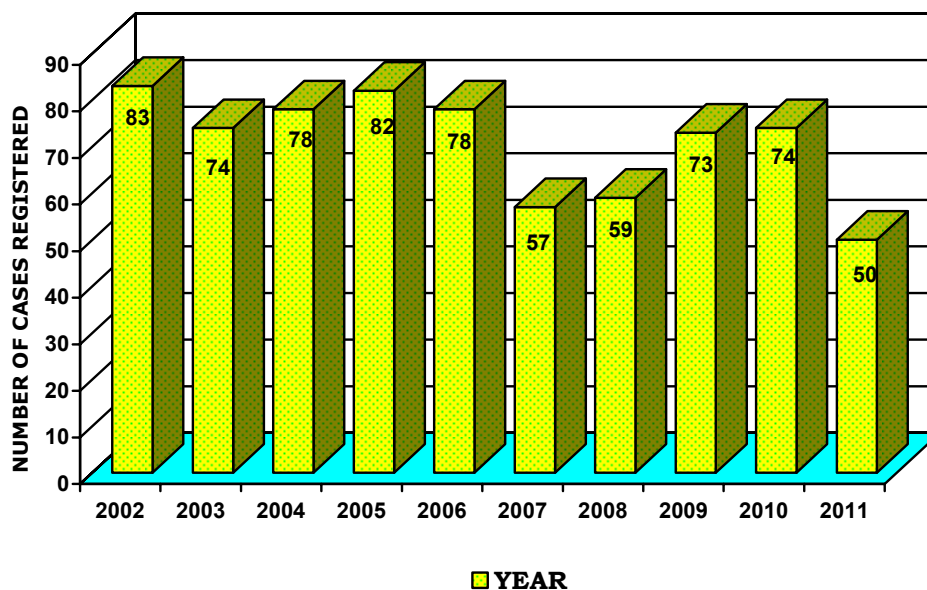
INCIDENCE OF MURDER DURING (2002-2011)



(ii) Attempt to commit Murder: (decrease 32.43%)

The incidence (50) of Attempt to Commit Murder during this year has decreased by 32.43 percent. The higher incidence of cases under this head was reported in Shimla (10) followed by Kangra (7), Baddi, Hamirpur and Mandi (5 each), Sirmaur and Una (4 each). The lowest incidence under this head was reported in Solan (3), Bilaspur, Chamba and Kullu (2 each) and Kinnaur (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.5.

DURING (2002-2011)

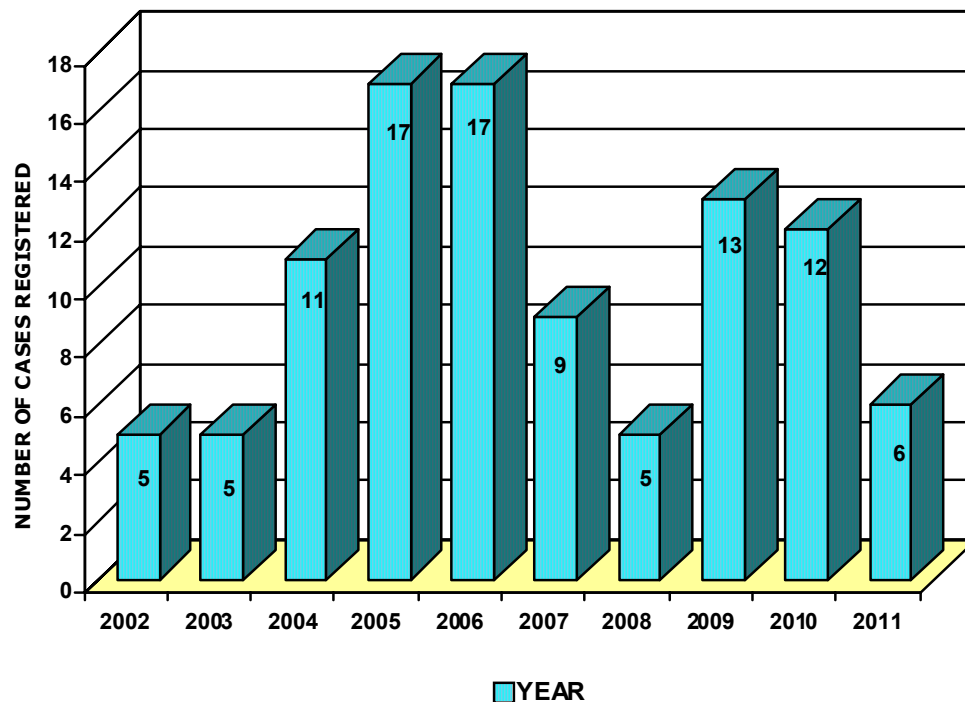


(iii). C.H. not Amounting to Murder: (Decrease 50%)

6 cases of Culpable Homicide not Amounting to Murder were reported during the year, showing decrease of 50% percent over the previous year (12 cases). The highest incidence (2 cases each) was reported in Kangra and Shimla districts followed by Chamba and Una (one each). No incidence under this head was reported in remaining

districts of the state. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.6.

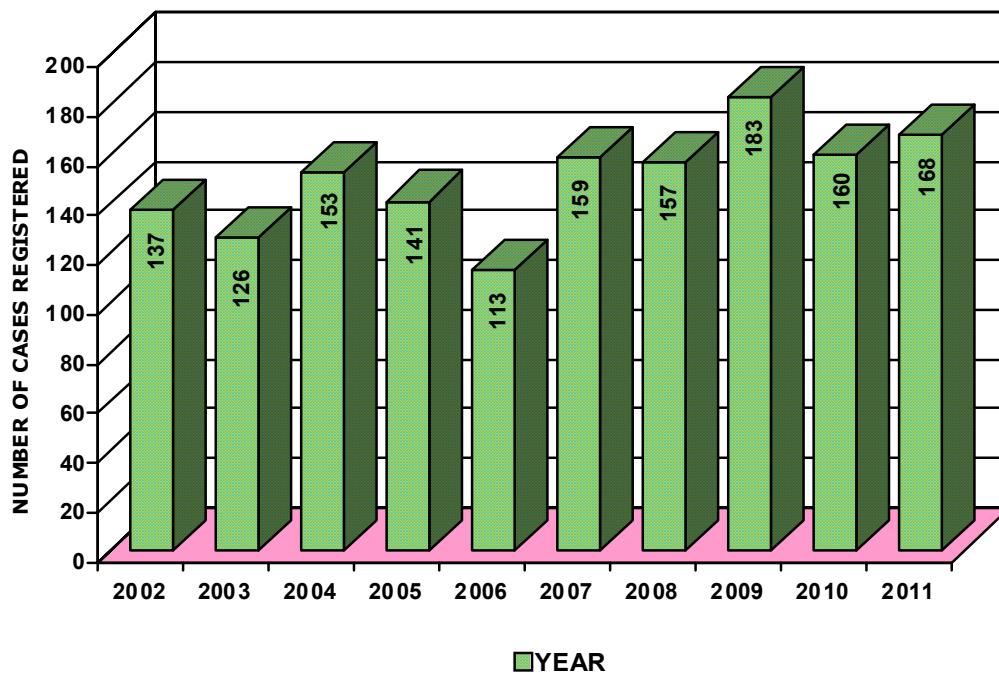
CHART-1.6

(iv). Rape : (Increase 5%)

Total 168 cases of Rape were reported which has shown an Increase of 5 percent during 2011 over previous year 2011 (160 cases). The highest incidence of rape was reported in Kangra (32) followed by Mandi (26), Shimla (22), Kullu (20), Sirmaur (12), Solan and Una (11 each), Baddi and Bilaspur (8 each), Chamba and Kinnaur (6 each), Hamirpur (5). The lowest number of cases were reported in Lahaul & Spiti (1) district.. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1. 7.

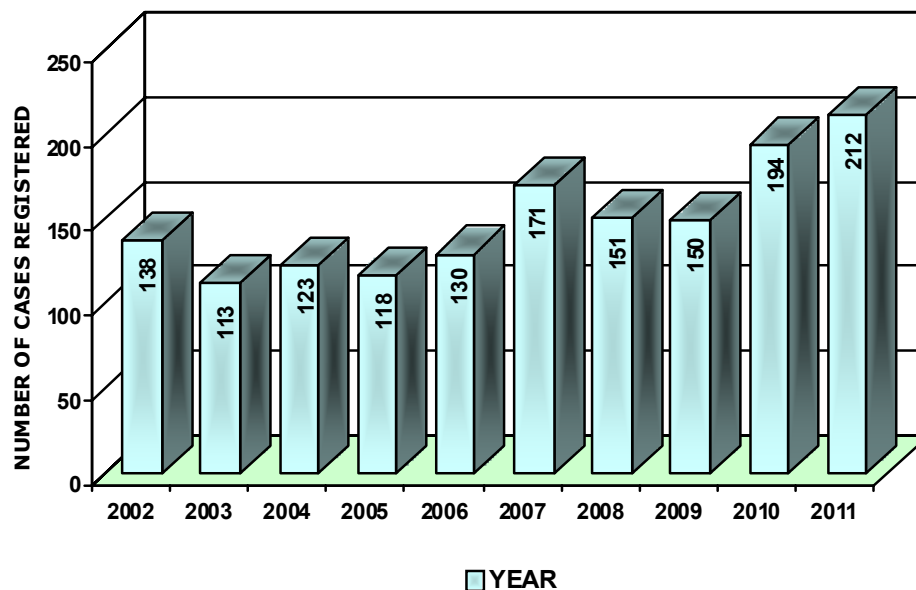
CHART-1.7

(v). Kidnapping and abduction: (Increase 9.28 %)

During the year 2011 a total number of 212 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported with an increase of 9.28 percent compared to previous year 2010. The highest incidences were reported in Kangra (68) followed by Shimla (24), Chamba (19), Baddi, Mandi and Sirmaur (17 each), Kullu and Solan (13 each), Una (12), Hamirpur (8). The lowest number of cases was reported in Bilaspur (3), Kinnaur(1). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.8.

DURING (2002-2011)



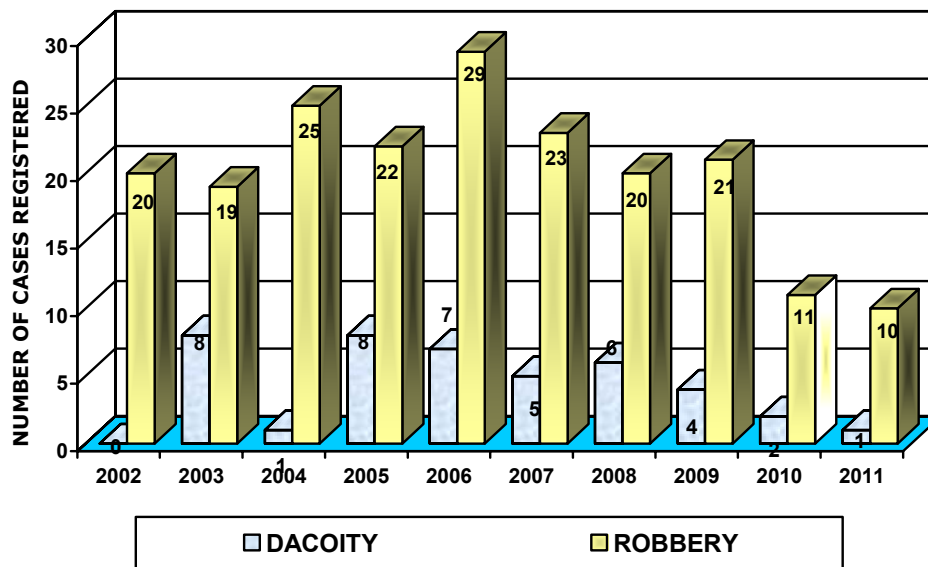
(vi). Dacoity : (Decrease 50%)

Only one incidence under this head was reported in district Solan. No incidence under this head was reported in remaining districts of State. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(vii). Robbery : (Decrease 9.09%)

The incidence of 10 cases of Robbery showed a decrease of 9.09% over the previous year 2010. The highest incidence was reported in Kangra (4) followed by Shimla (2), Chamba, Sirmaur, Solan and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of State. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(viii). Burglary : (Increase 47.41%)

The incidence of Burglary (995) recorded an increase with 47.41% during the year 2011 as compared with 2010. The highest number of Burglary cases (219) was reported in Kangra district followed by Shimla (171), Mandi (100), Chamba (93), Solan (89), Kullu (68), Sirmaur (61) Baddi (56), Una (46) and Bilaspur (43). The remaining districts have reported less than 40 cases under this head. The crime rate was the highest at 27.77 in Solan district and the lowest at 3.17 in Lahaul & Spiti district as against the State average of 14.51 Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(ix). Theft: (Increase 24.34%)

The incidence of Theft (1042) recorded an increase of 24.34% during the year 2011 over the previous year. Shimla district has reported highest incidence (250 cases) followed by Kangra (171),

Solan (115), Mandi (92), Sirmaur (71), Una (68), Kullu (67), Baddi (66) and Bilaspur (56). The remaining districts have reported less than 50 cases. The crime rate was the highest in Solan (35.89) district and the lowest (3.17) in Lahaul & Spiti district as against the State average of 15.20. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.11.

INCIDENCE OF BURGLARY DURING (2002-2011)

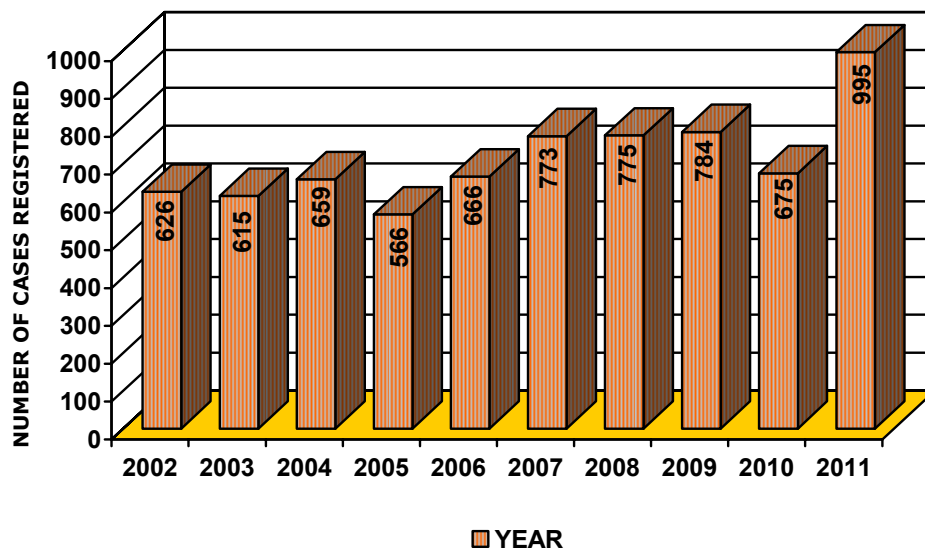
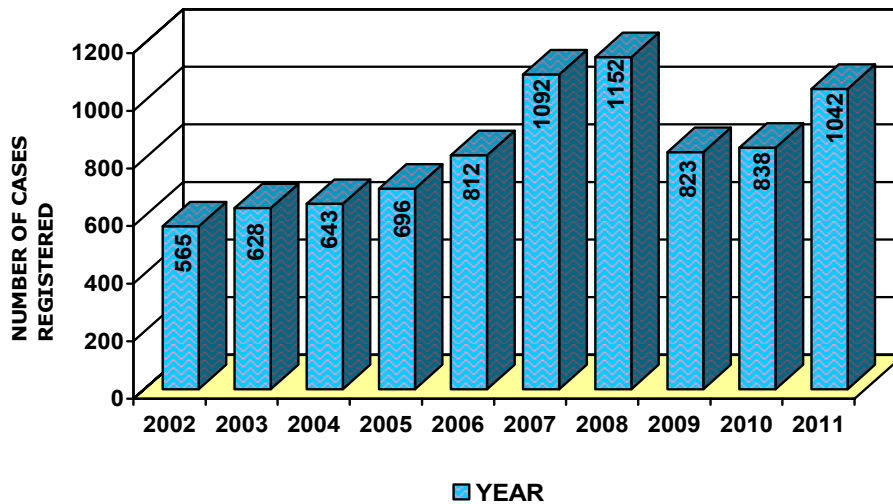

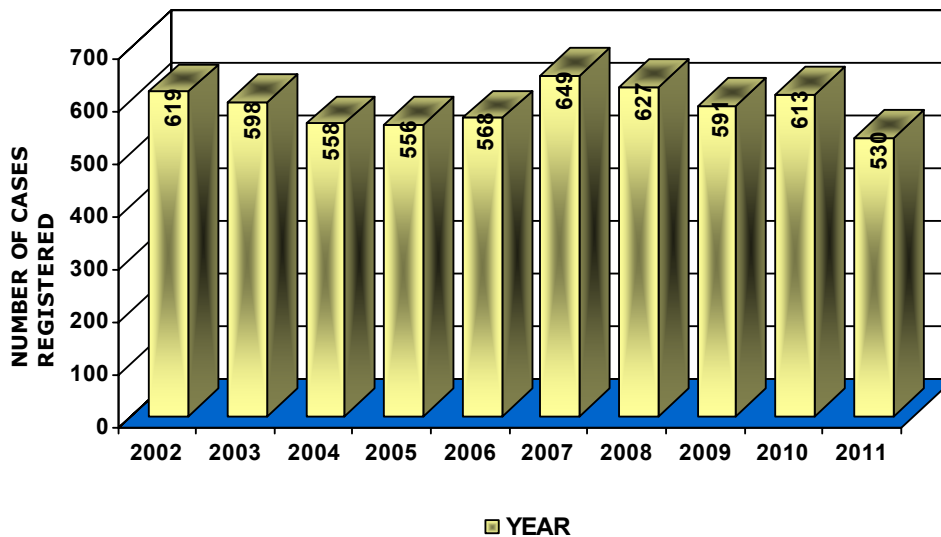
INCIDENCE OF THEFT DURING (2002-2011)



(x). Riots: (Decrease 13.54%)

Incidence of Riots (530) registered during the year 2011 recorded a decrease of 13.54% over the previous year 2010. The highest incidence was reported from Kangra (85) district followed by Shimla(83), Mandi (81),Sirmaur (64), Bilaspur (43), Solan (35), Una (32), Chamba (27), Baddi (26) and Kullu (23). The lowest number of cases was reported in Hamirpur (21) followed Kinnaur (10) district. No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

(xi). Hurt: (Increase 35.54 %)

A total number of 1251 cases were reported during 2011 as against 923 cases reported in the year 2010 showing an increase of 35.54%. Solan district has reported the highest incidence (262) followed by Kangra (186), Hamirpur (182), Baddi (155), Mandi (95), Una (89), Chamba (88), Bilaspur (56), Shimla (47), Sirmaur (41) and Kullu (39). The least number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (9) and

Lahaul & Spiti and GRP (1 each). Previous 10 Years (2002-2011)

INCIDENCE OF HURT DURING (2002-2011)

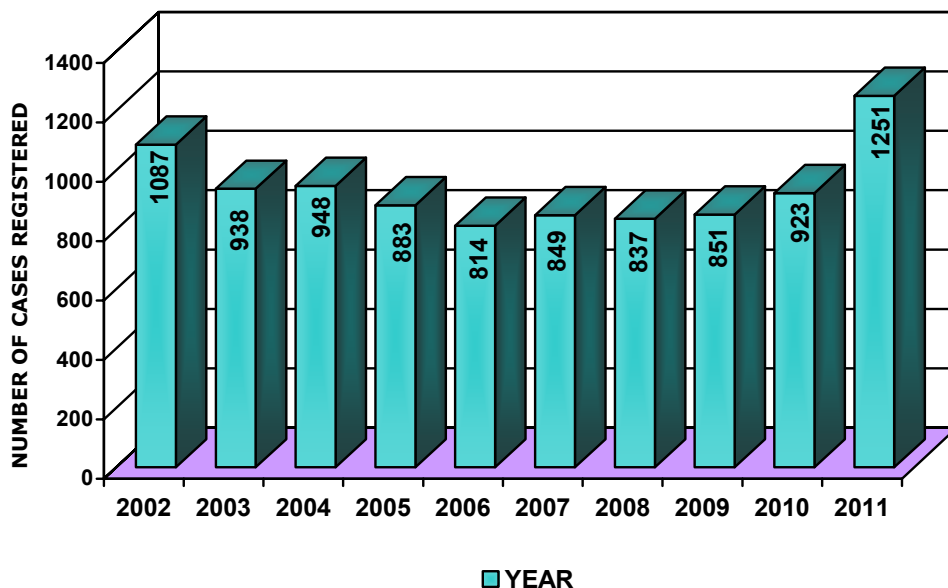
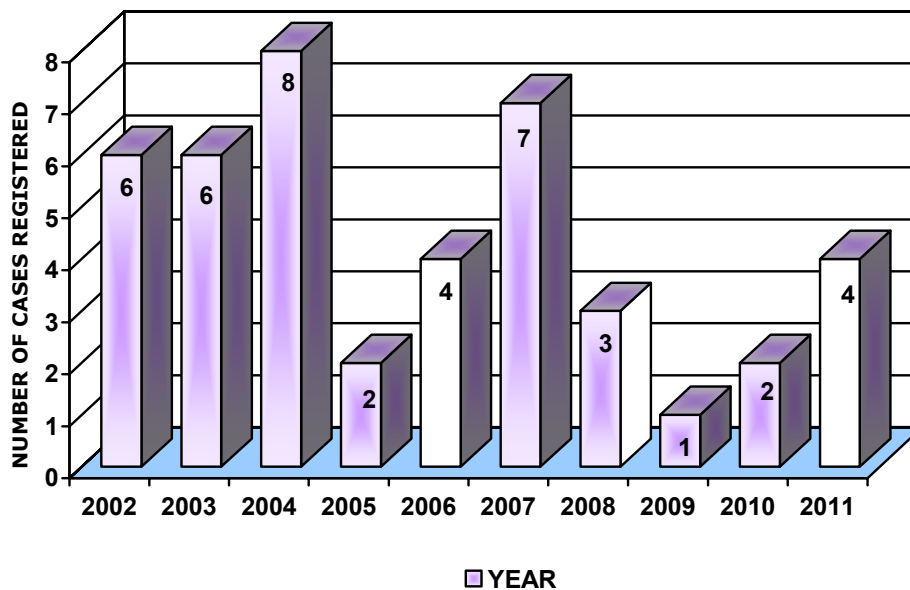


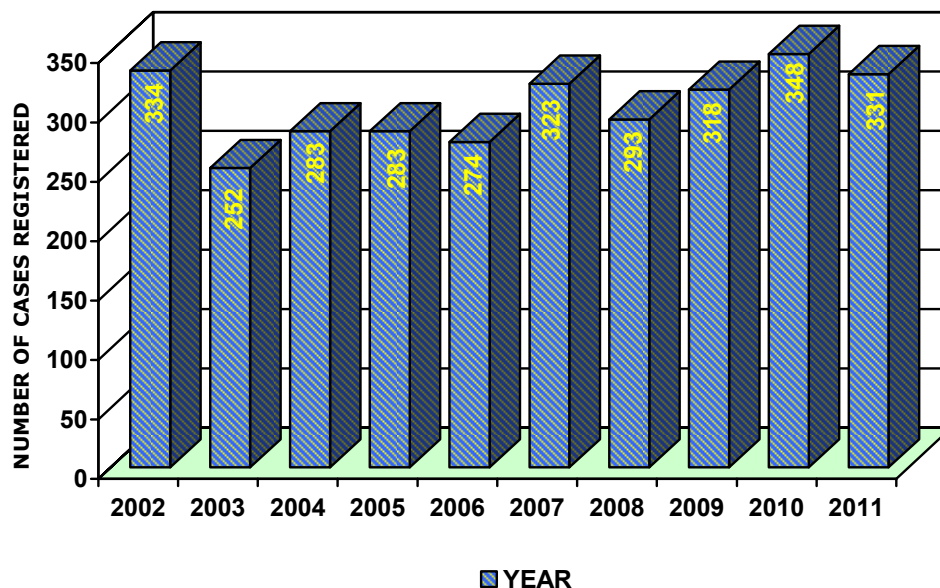
CHART-1.14

(xii). Dowry Death : (increase 50 %)

Incidence of Dowry Death recorded an increase of 50 % over the previous year 2010. A total number of 4 Dowry Deaths cases were registered in Chamba (2), Kangra & Kinnaur (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.14.

INCIDENCE OF MOLESTATION DURING (2002-2011)



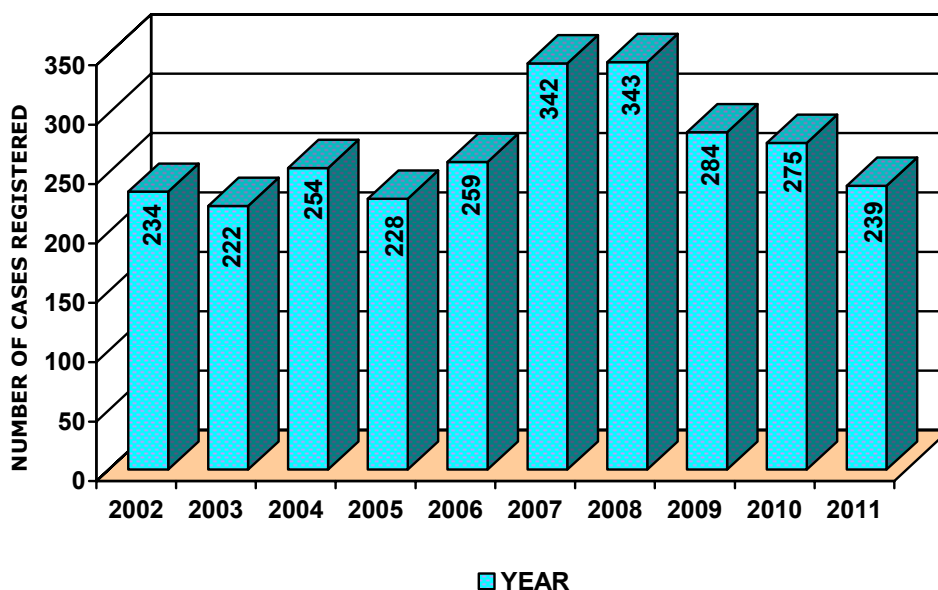
(xiii). Molestation: (Decrease 4.89 %)

331 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 4.89%. 60 cases were reported in Kangra District followed by Mandi (55), Shimla (45), Kullu (38), Sirmaur (33), Chamba (29), Bilaspur (18), Hamirpur and Una (17 each), Solan (8), Baddi (7). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (4) district. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.

(xiv). Cruelty to women: (decrease 13.09%)

239 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 13.09 % over the previous year. 42 cases were reported in Kangra district followed by Mandi (40), Una (39), Sirmaur (23), Bilaspur (17), Shimla and Solan (16 each), Baddi (9). The lowest number of cases were reported in Hamirpur (5) and Kinnaur (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti District. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.

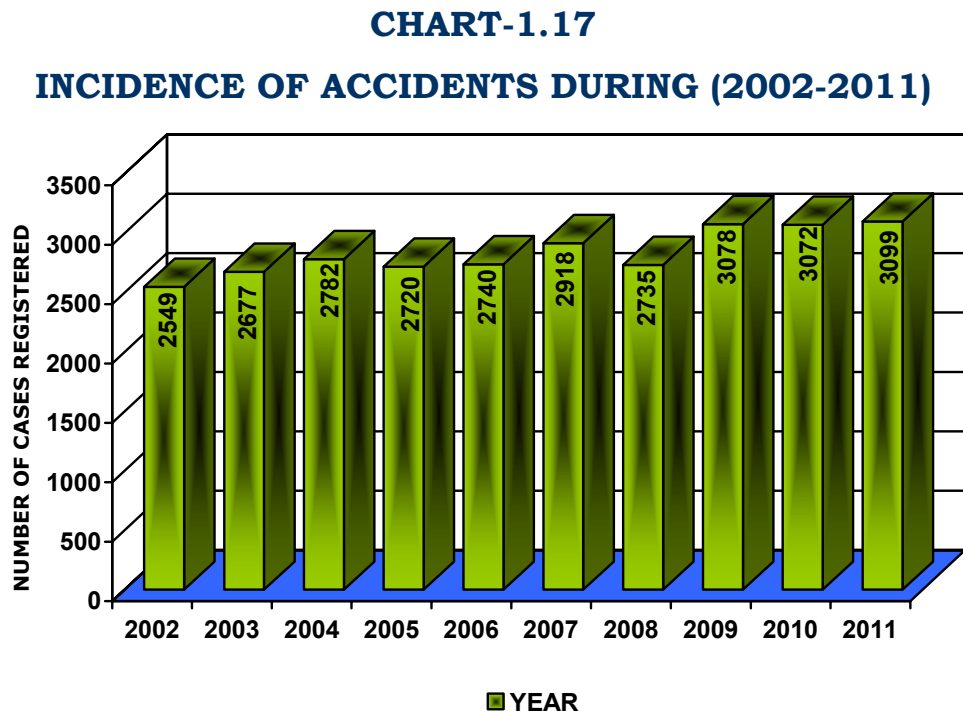
CHART-1.16

(xv). Accidents : (Increase 0.88%)

3099 cases were reported during the year, showing a minor increase of 0.88% as compared to the previous year. 627 cases were reported in Kangra district followed by Shimla (450), Mandi (360), Solan (275), Bilaspur (274), Una (257) and Sirmaur (201). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kullu (196) followed by Baddi (152), Hamirpur (126), Chamba (121), Kinnaur (44), Lahaul & Spiti

(12) and GRP (4). Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17 .



(xvi). Other IPC Crimes: (Increase 9.2 %)

Cognizable IPC Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as “Other IPC Crimes”. As many as 6244 other IPC crimes accounting for 43.63% of the total IPC crimes were registered in the State during 2011. Total 43.63% incidence of other IPC were reported in the State against the total IPC crime.

Incidence of IPC Crimes (Head-wise) along with percentage share is presented in Table-1.6. Ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.19 .

INCIDENCE OF OTHER IPC DURING (2002-2011)

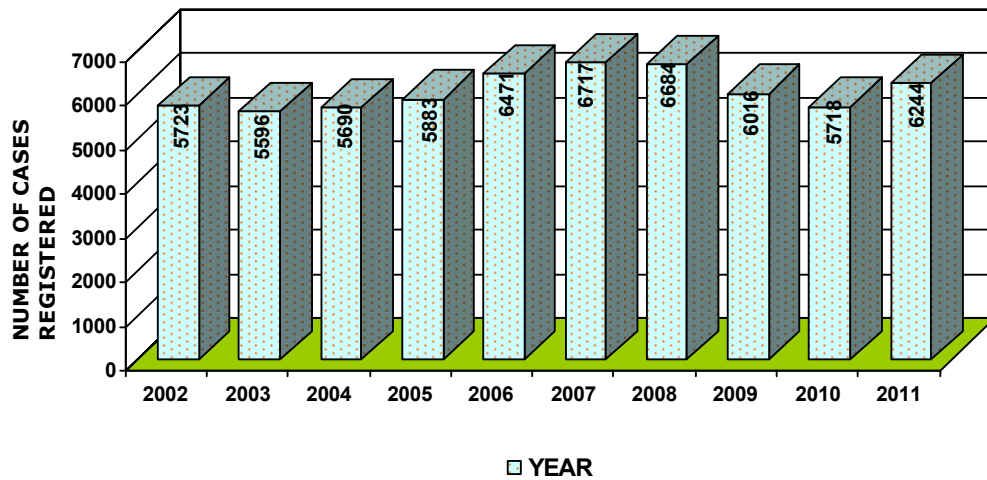

PERCENTAGE OF OTHER IPC CASES AGAINST TOTAL IPC FOR THE LAST 10 YEAR (2002-2011)

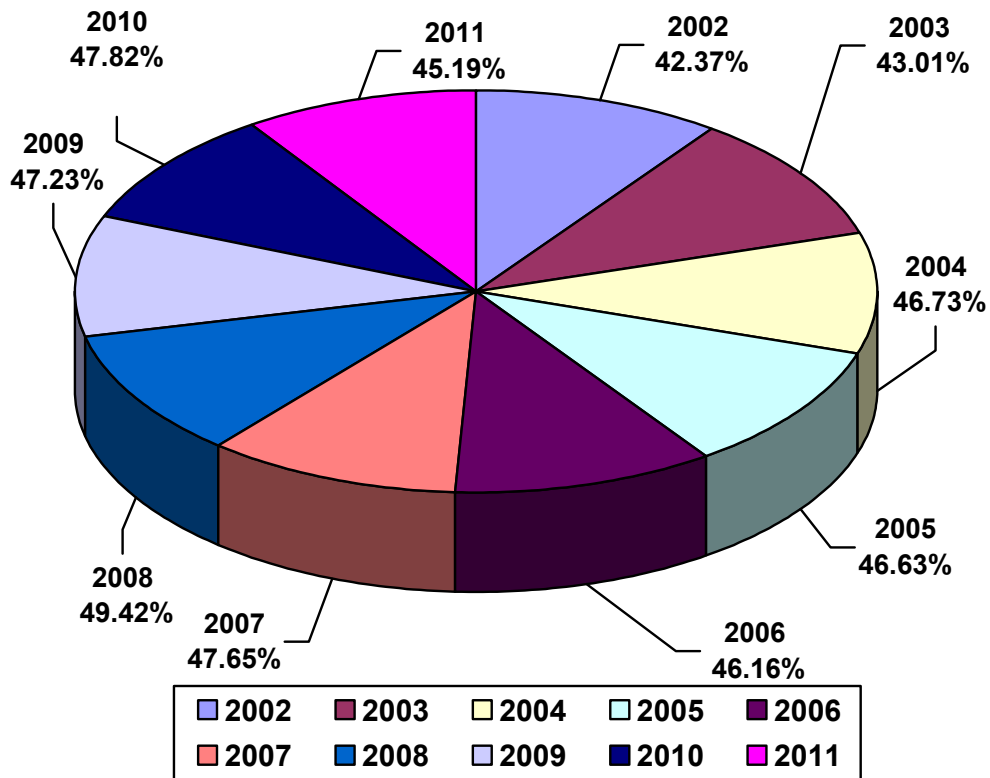
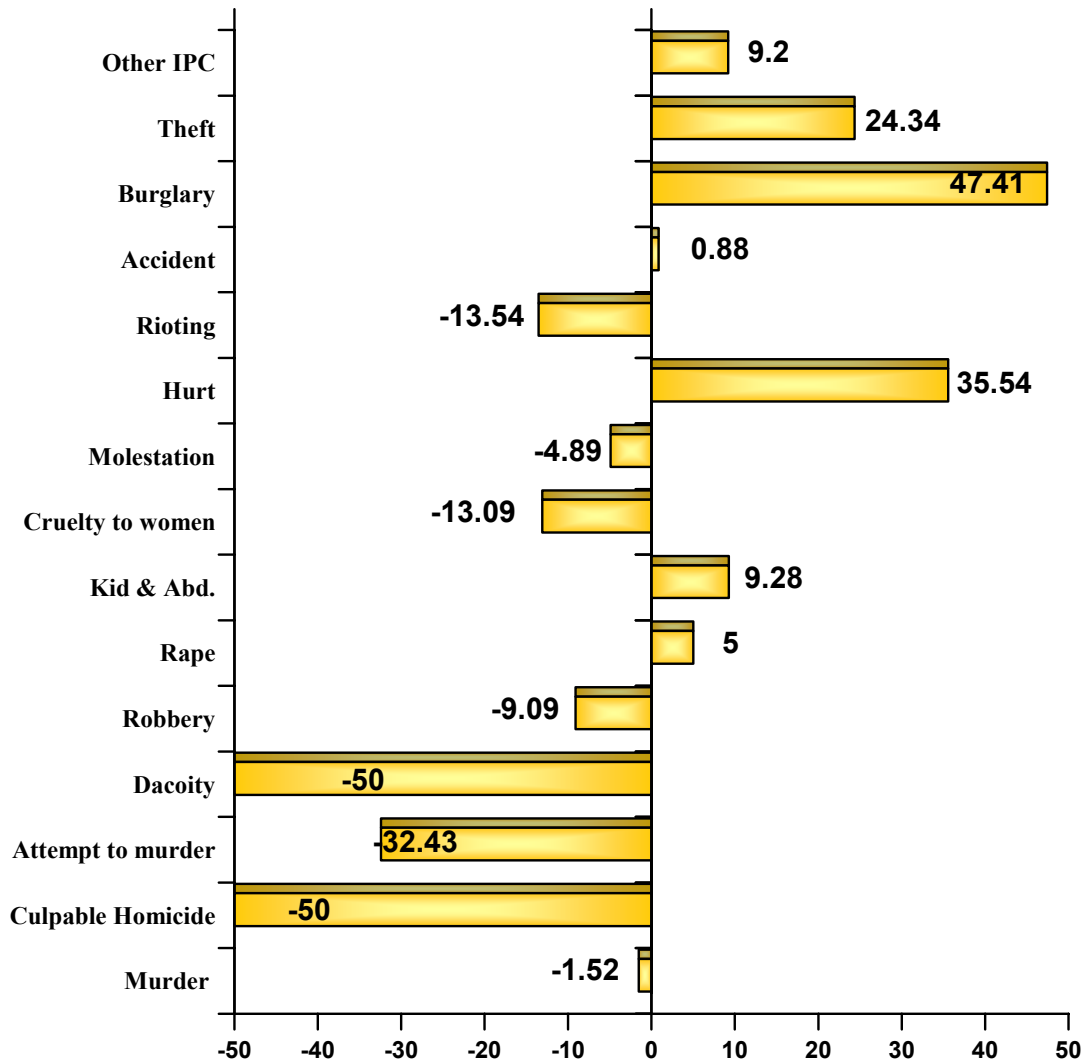

1.8 Crimes Under Local And Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at the Annexure-1. Incidence and rate of cognizable LOCAL & SPECIAL LAW crimes during 2002 to 2011 are presented in Table-1.10.

A total of 4563 cognizable LOCAL & SPECIAL LAW (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2011. The head-wise percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2002 to 2011 is presented in Table-1.11. There is an increase of 21.36% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidence and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in Table-1.12.

Incidence of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws is discussed below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis Of SLL Offences:

(i) Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS) : (Decrease 4.36%)

The Incidence of (570) under the ND&PS Act showed a decrease of 4.36% over 2010. Cases under this Act constituted 12.49% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2011. The highest incidence (200) cases were reported in Kullu district followed by Mandi (106), Shimla (69), Hamirpur (33), Bilaspur (28), Chamba and Kangra (27 each), Baddi and Solan (17 each), Una and PS CID (16 each) and Sirmaur (14). No case under this Act was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti Districts.

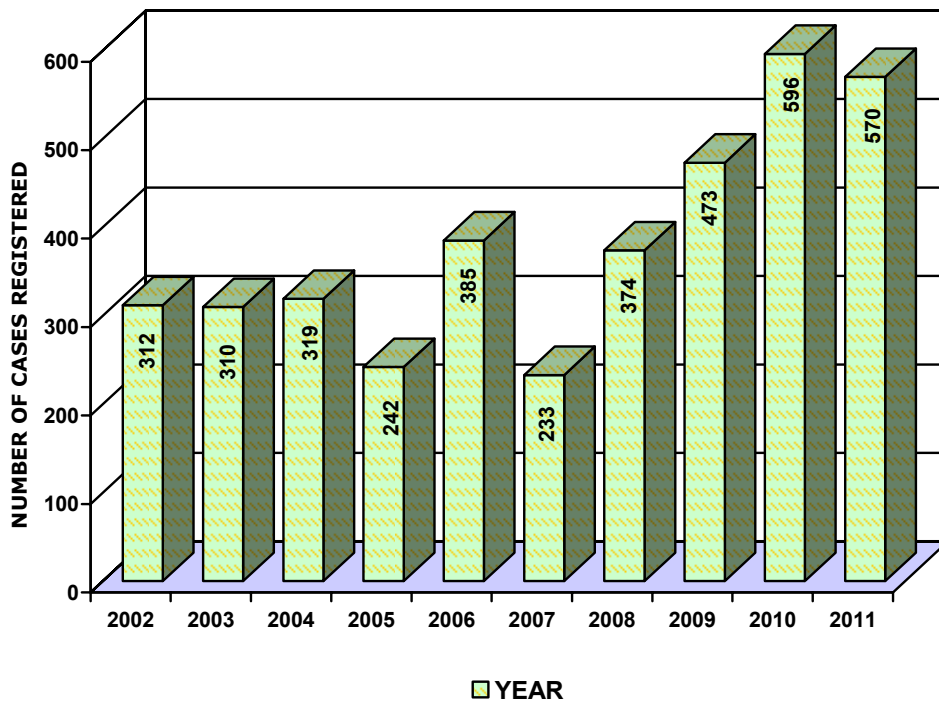
The main concentration on the incidence registered under this Act remains on District Kullu and Mandi with 53.68 % of the total

registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source / area of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Hamirpur. Further couriers of this contraband are mostly laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 71.4 % belong to Himachal Pradesh and 28.6% were outsiders. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (63%). About 32% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 5%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible. Foreigners involved in this activity are mostly Italians and Israelis. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.21

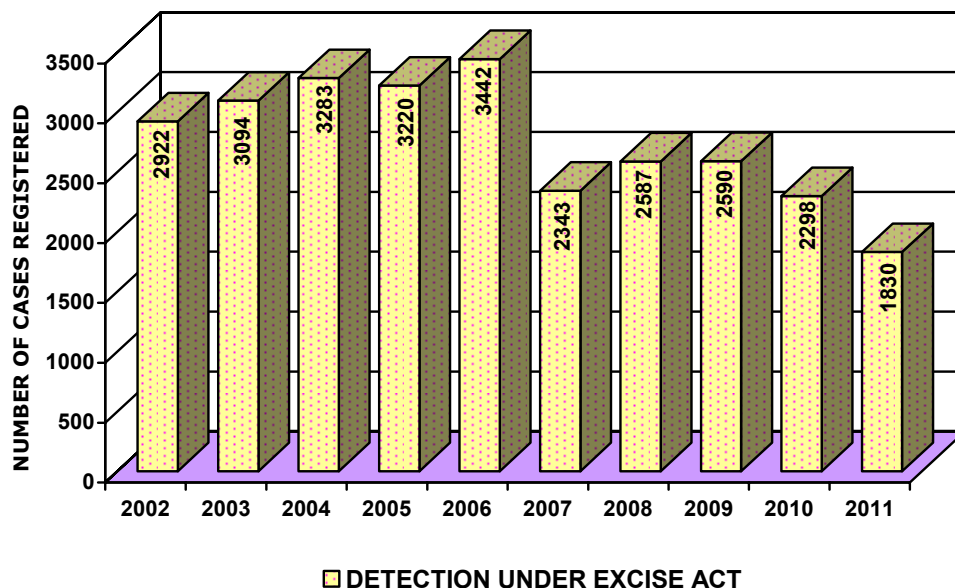

(ii). Excise Act: (Decrease 20.37%)

The incidence (1830) under the Excise Act showed a decrease of 20.37% over 2010. Cases under this Act contributed 40.11% against the total LOCAL & SPECIAL LAW (SLL) reported cases during the year 2011. The highest incidence (527) cases were reported in Kangra district followed by Shimla (264), Chamba (166), Hamirpur (134), Una (122), Bilaspur and Sirmaur (105 each), Solan (101), Mandi (88), Baddi (79), Lahaul & Spiti (70). The lowest incidence under this Act was seen in Kinnaur (32), Kullu (30) CID (4) and GRP (3). Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.22

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING (2002-2011)



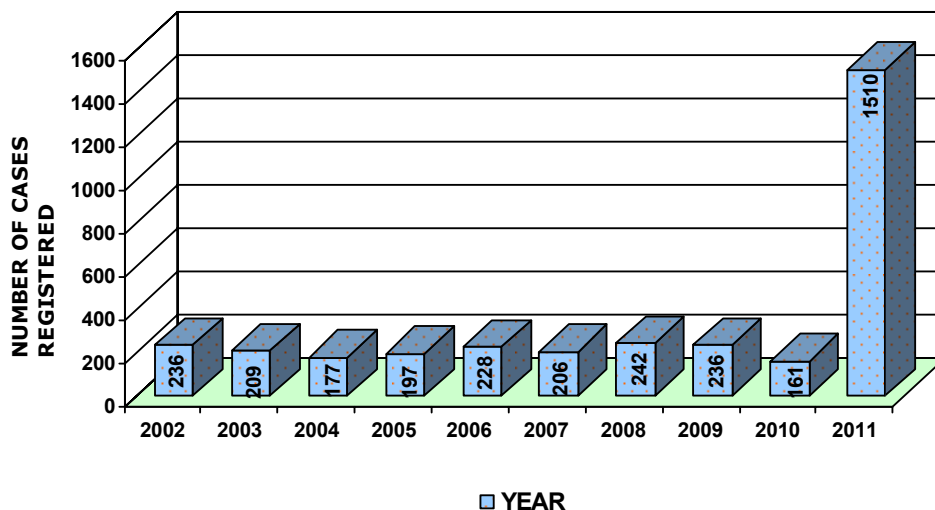
(iii). Forest Act: (Increase 837.89%)

As per direction of Hon'ble High Court of HP, 1510 cases were booked in the state in 2011 under the Indian Forest Act which showed an unusual increase of 837.89% over 2010. Cases under this Act constituted 33.09 % against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2011. Kullu district has reported the highest

incidence (986) followed by Mandi (146), Kinnaur (133) Chamba (83), Kangra (57) Solan (38). The lowest incidence under this Act was seen in Sirmaur (24) Shimla (19), Una (15), Baddi (4), Bilaspur and CID (2 each), Hamirpur (1). No incidence under this head was reported in district Lahaul & Spiti.

The analysis reveals that majority of cases have been registered in Districts Kullu, Mandi, Kinnaur, Chamba, Kangra and Solan. The encroachment on Forest Land, forest produce involved is timber, fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut bark, Brich Bark, Brahmi leave and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.23 .

(iv). Protection of Civil Rights Act

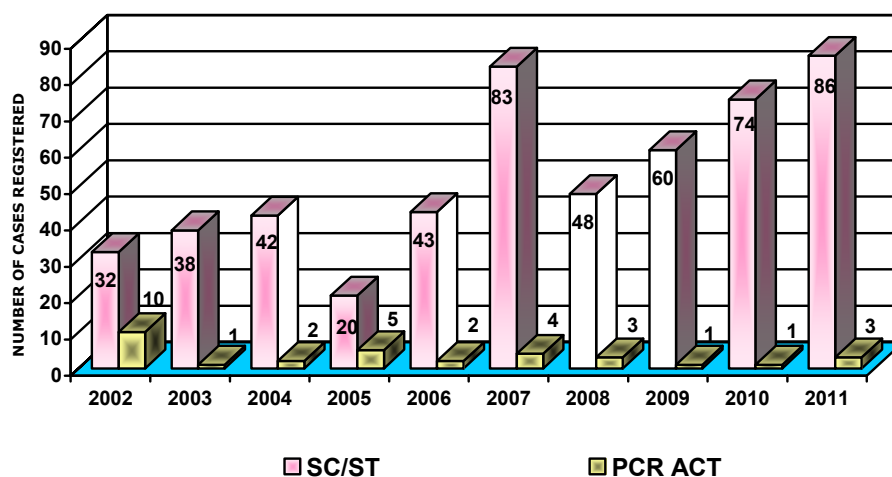
3 cases were registered under Protection of Civil Rights Act showing an increase of 200% over 2010. Kinnaur District has registered the highest number (2) followed by Bilaspur (1). No case under this Act was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(v) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act: (Increase 16.22%)

86 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act showed an increase of 16.22 % over the previous year. The highest incidence (24) cases were reported in Kangra district followed by Shimla (14), Kullu (8), Bilaspur, Mandi, Sirmaur and Una (7 each), Chamba (5). The lowest incidence under this Act was seen in Hamirpur (4), Solan (2) and Baddi (1). No incidence under this Act was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in district Kangra and Shimla. The most common reason for registering cases under these Acts is a feeling of being hurt when one is called by derogatory name. This comprises of 68% of the total cases registered. 13 % of the cases were registered because of land and water disputes. 7% were registered due to not allowing access to temples. The remaining were for election related matters and miscellaneous reasons. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(vi) Other Local & Special Law Cases: (including Arms Act, Gambling Act, Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc)

564 Local & Special Law cases reported come under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown a decrease of 10.48% over the previous year. The highest incidence was reported from district Kangra (99).

During 2011 total number of 4563 cognizable crimes were reported in the state under various heads of (SLL) Local & Special Laws which shows an increase of 21.36% of the previous year.

It is observed that 5 specified crime heads accounted for 87.20 % of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 12.8% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.25

CASES DURING(2002-2011)

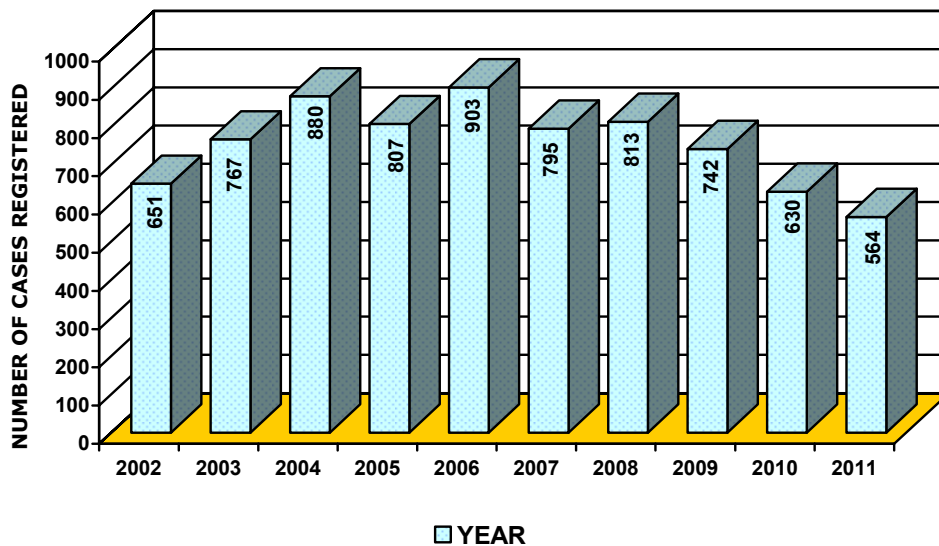
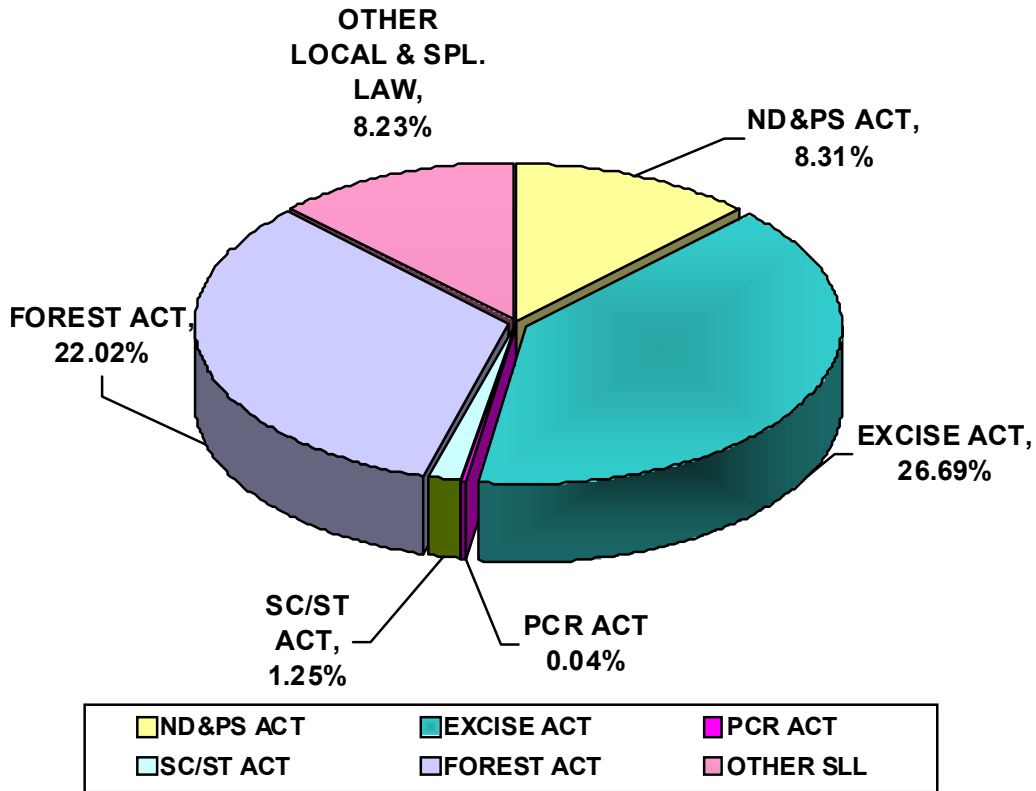

RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (IPC) DURING - 2011

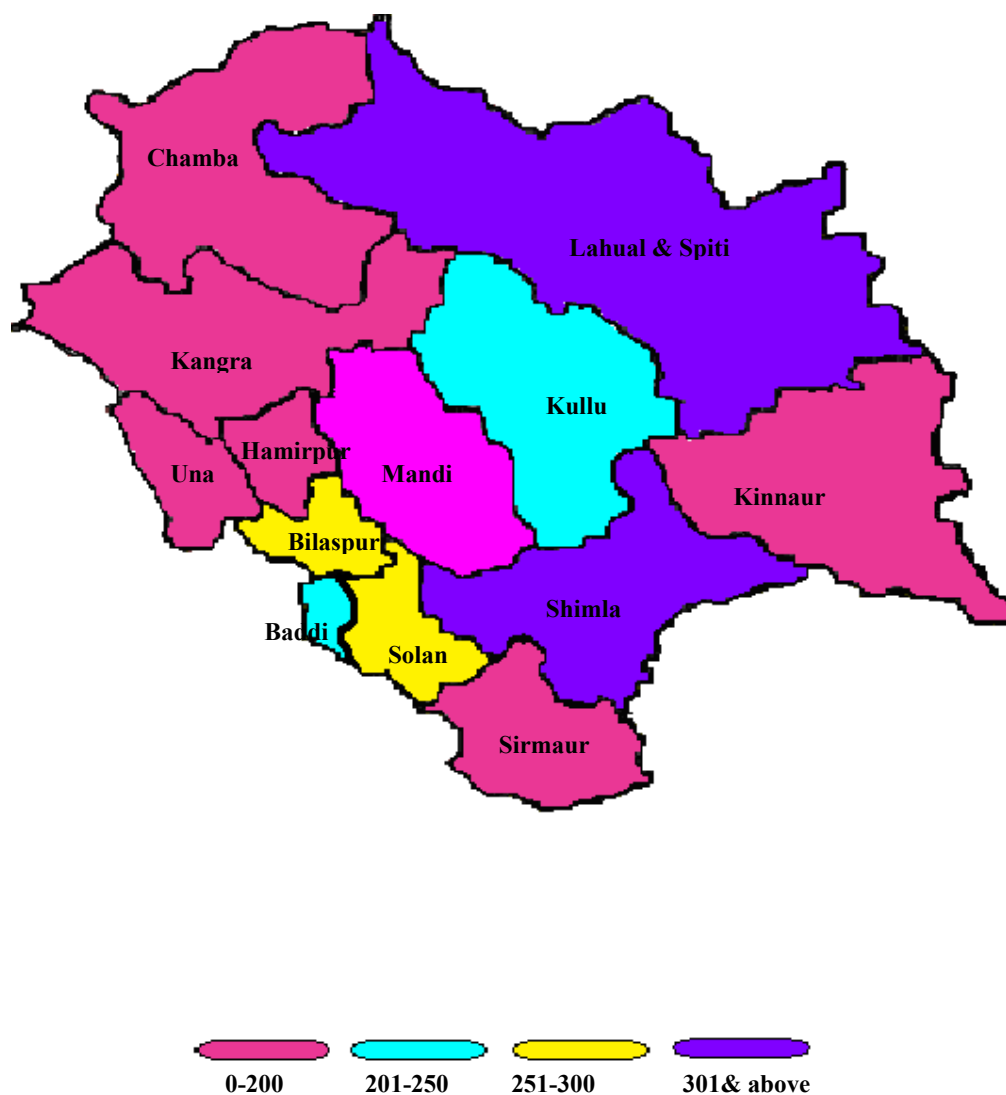

INCIDENCE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (IPC) DURING - 2011

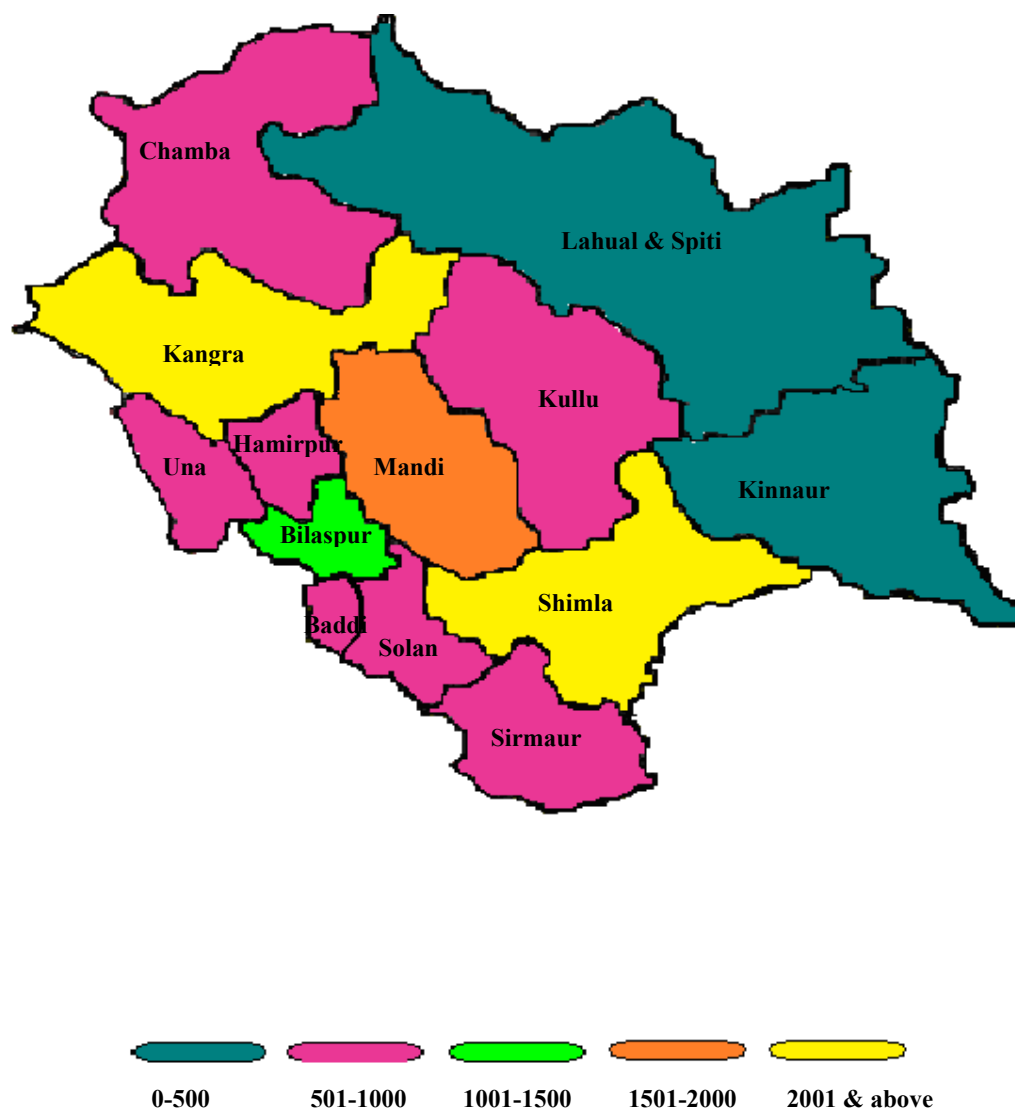

INCIDENCE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (SLL) DURING - 2011

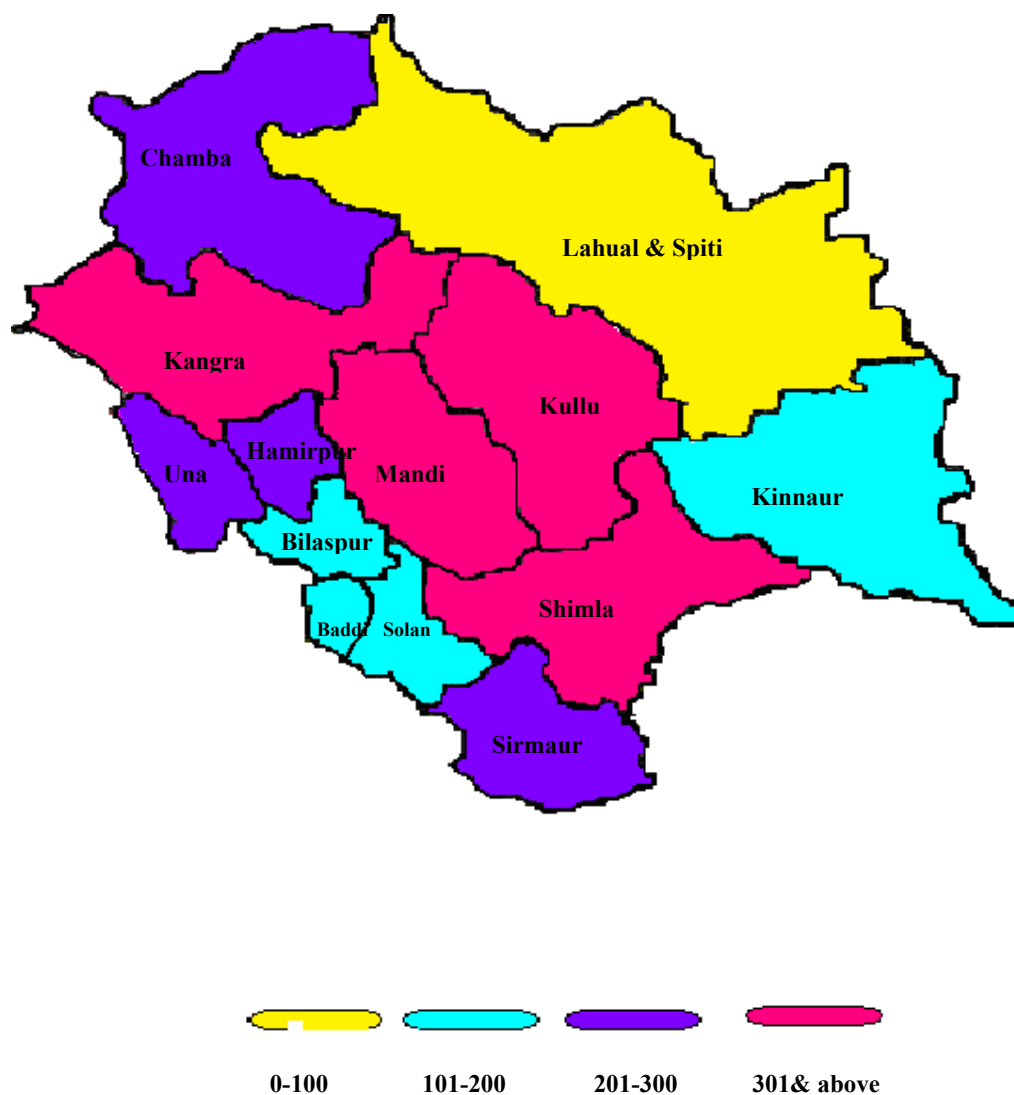

CHAPTER-2

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property has been done for the year 2011 and given as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

During the year 2011, 1042 cases of theft and 995 cases of burglary were found registered which showed an increase of 15 cases in theft and a decrease of 109 cases in burglary over the year 2009. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major head namely:- Auto theft, theft of Cash and Jewellery, Cable theft, theft of electronic items and theft of other material.

Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 4 district of Shimla, Kangra, Solan and Mandi. The analysis further shows that most of the cases took place in rural areas, Shimla being an exception 58 % of the persons involved in these crimes were local residents, 42 % being outsiders.

As far as the age profile goes 55 % of those involved in theft cases are in the age group of 18 to 30 years. 65% involved in burglary are also of the same age group.

(ii) Robbery and Dacoity:

During the year 2011, 10 cases of robbery and 1 case of dacoity were found registered which showed a decrease of 1 case in robbery and 1 case in Dacoity over the year 2010. The cases of robbery is concentrated only in 6 districts namely; Kangra (4), Shimla

(2), Chamba, Sirmaur, Solan and Una (1 each). On the other hand only a single case of dacoity occurred in Solan district.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

During the year 2011, property valued 1925.03 lakhs was reported stolen in 2048 cases as compared to 1619.76 lakhs in 1526 cases for the corresponding year.

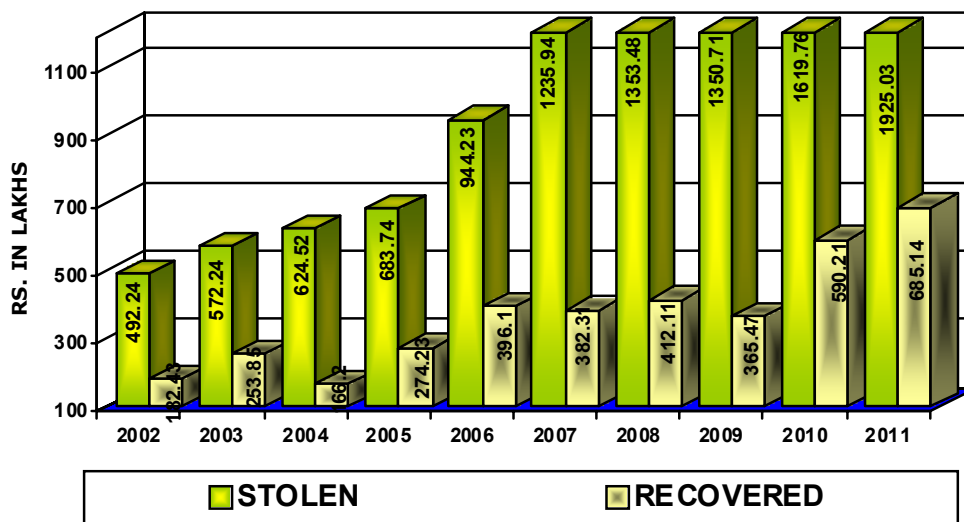
Property worth Rs. 685.14 lakhs was recovered during 2011. The percentage of recovery is 35.60%. The value of property recovered showed a decrease of 0.84% over the previous year.

The details of property stolen and recovered, along with the percentage of recovery from the last 10 years (2002 to 2011) and variation are given in Table 2.1 .

The Chart 2.1 depicts the value of property stolen and recovered during 2002 to 2011.

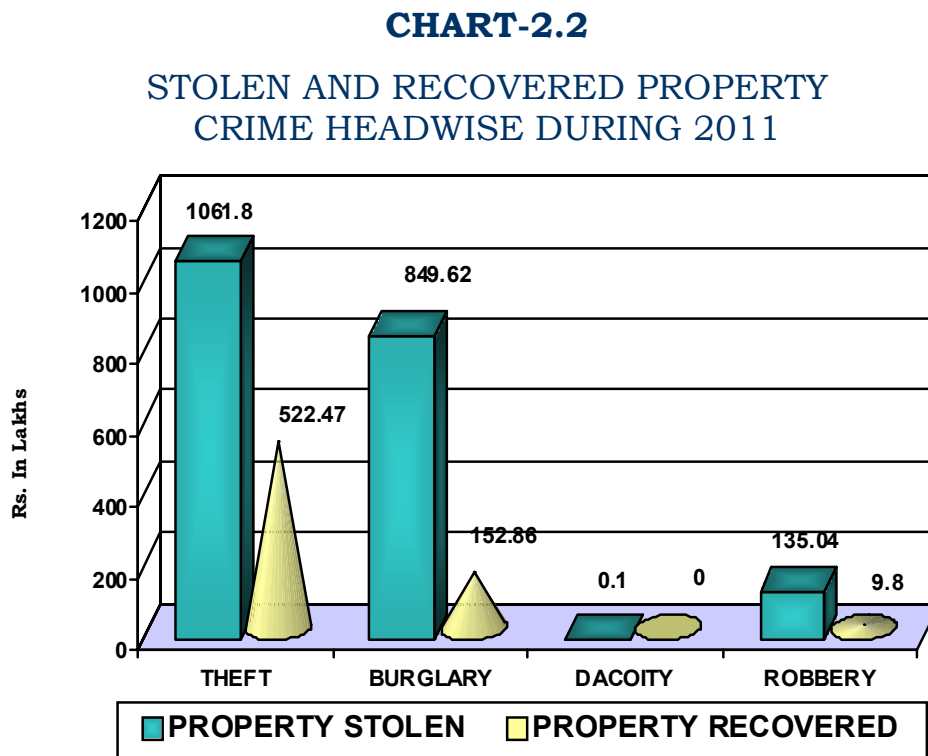
CHART-2.1

Chart 2.2 represents the crime head wise, property stolen and recovered, during the year 2011.



Crime head-wise and district-wise value of property stolen recovered including percentage of recoveries presented in Table 2.3.

The Police District Baddi reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 3,77,25,471) followed by Shimla (Rs.3,33,96,951), Solan district (Rs. 2,44,42,425), Kangra(Rs.2,22,98,779), Mandi (Rs. 1,72,18,499), Bilaspur Rs. 1,47,18,603) and Sirmaur (Rs. 1,10,6,945).

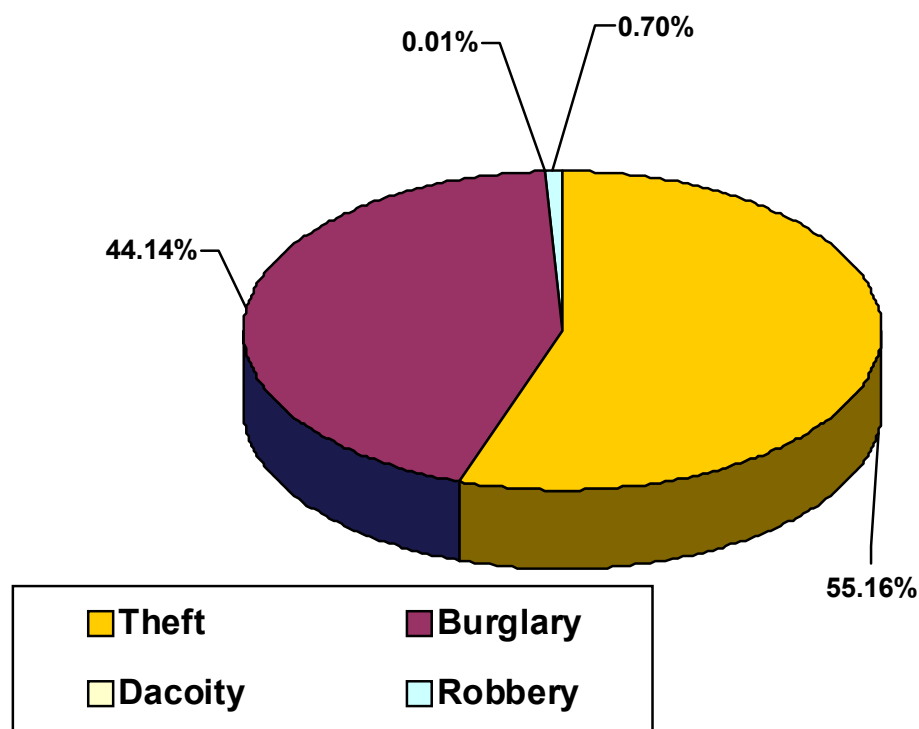
The highest value of recovery was seen from District Solan (Rs. 1,43,26,907) followed by Shimla (Rs. 1,19,15,406), Baddi (Rs. 91,81,516), Bilaspur (Rs. 60,62,723), and Mandi (Rs. 58,29,11).

In Lahaul & Spiti district 100 % of the stolen property was recovered followed by Kinnaur (77.38%), Solan (58.61 %), Hamirpur (50.65 %) and Bilaspur (41.19%).

Chart 2.3 represents the crime head wise percentage of property stolen during the year 2011.

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among 4 different types of property crimes, the maximum value (Rs.1061.81 Lakhs) and share (55.16%) were seen under head Theft. The minimum value of Rs. 0.10 Lakhs and share (0.005%) was seen under the category of crime under Dacoity.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Theft cases (76.26%) followed by Burglary (22.31%) and Robbery (1.43%). No recovery was made under head Dacoity. The Robbery cases have shown a high recovery percentage (72.60%) followed by Theft (49.21%), and Burglary {17.99%}. The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2002to 2011) is presented in Table 2.4 .

2.4 Nature of Property :

Nature of property under head theft and burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of cash and Jewellery, Cable theft, Theft of electronic items. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as Other theft. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in Table 2.5.

2.5 Cultural Property:

Total Rs 24.49 lakhs worth of Cultural Property was stolen during 2011 in 41 Cases. This constitutes 1.27% of total property lost. Statistics of Cultural Property stolen during 2011 are available in Table 2.6. The highest incidence 10 each cases were reported in Shimla and Solan Districts followed by Kullu (6), Mandi and Sirmaur (5 each) and Kangra (3).

Cases, where the most valuable properties were stolen, were reported in Mandi District property worth (Rs.13,36,411), stolen in 5 cases). In Sirmaur District, in 5 cases properties worth Rs.3,59,000/- were stolen.

The value of the property stolen by nature of property district wise during 2011, is presented in Table 2.6

RECOVERED DURING THE YEAR 2011**

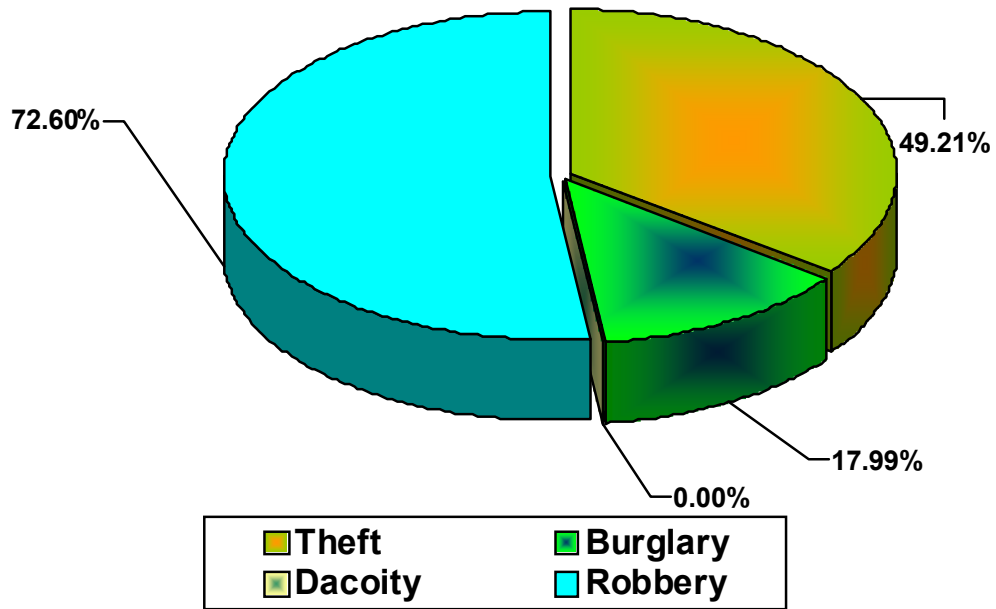

DETECTED(WORKED OUT) -2011**

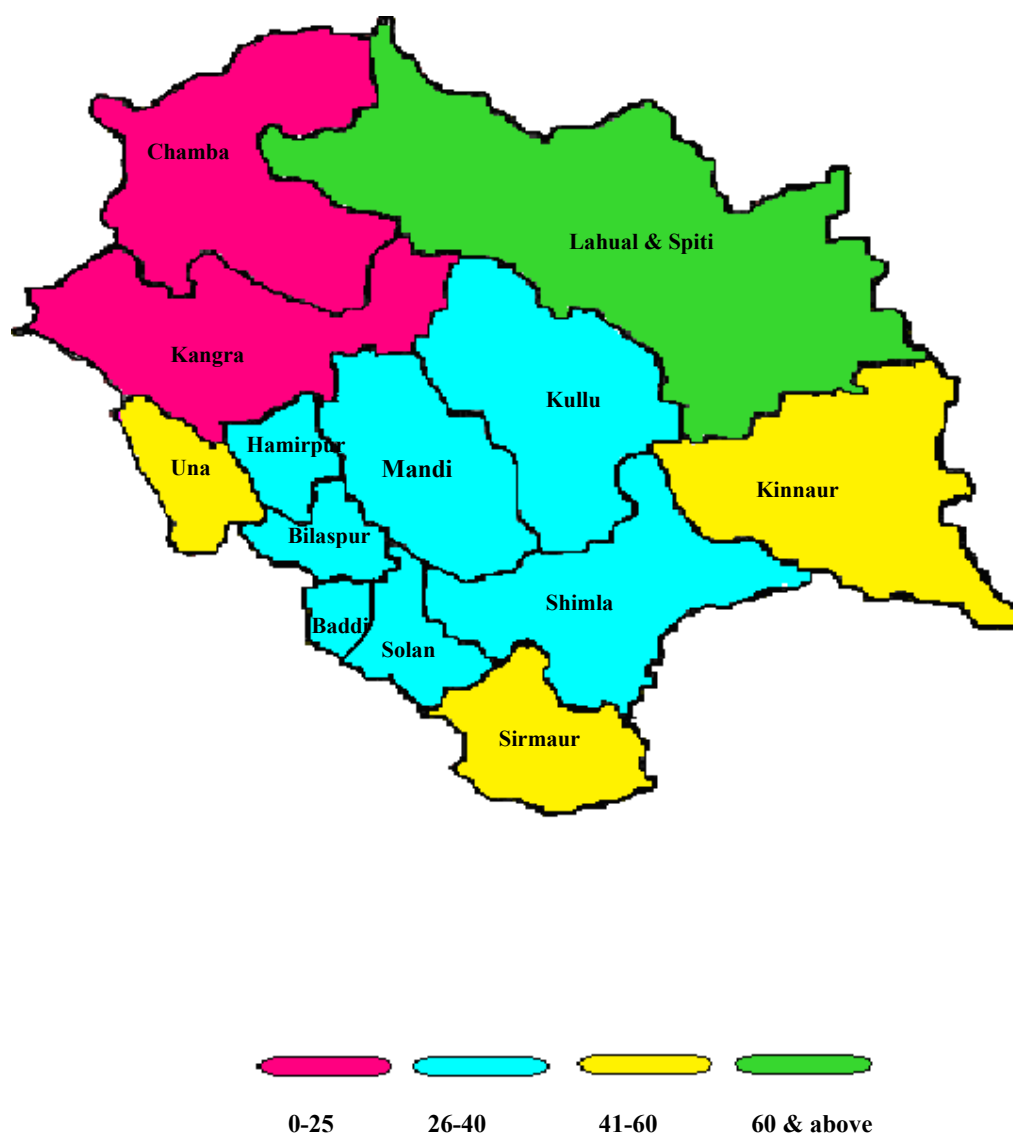

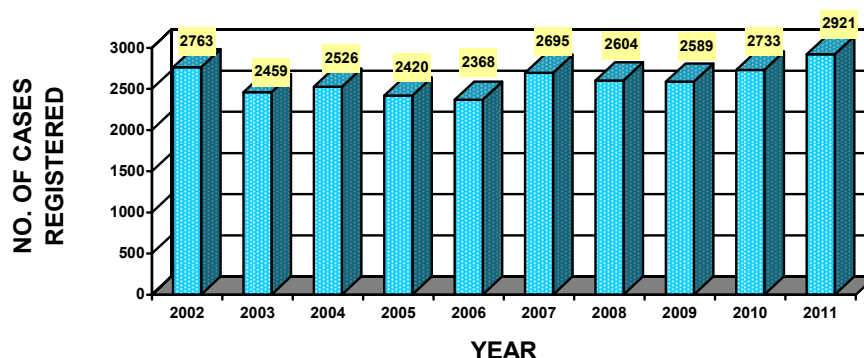

2.6 Crime Against Persons:-

The crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not Amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kid & Abd., Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry deaths.

The analysis reveals that total 2921 incidence of crime against persons have occurred during the years 2011, which shows 20.41% of the total IPC Crime. The highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC recorded in district Baddi with 40.24% followed by Solan (37.75%), Hamirpur (31.02 %), Chamba (29.35%), Sirmaur 23.44% and Una with 22.91%. The district-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.7. The district-wise incidence and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in Chart 2.5

(2002-2011)

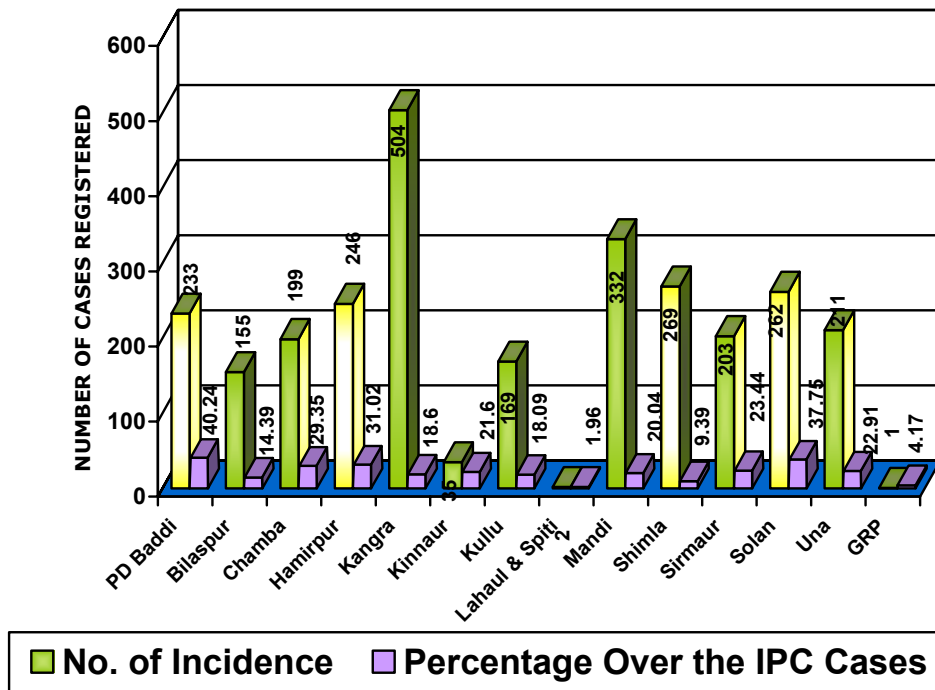


The incidence crime against persons has been recorded highest in district Kangra (504) followed by district Solan (362), Mandi (332) Shimla (269), Hamirpur (246), Baddi (233), Una (211), Sirmaur (203), Chamba (199), Kullu (169), Bilaspur (155), Kinnaur (35) L&S (2)

and GRP (2). The District-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.8.

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidence of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2002 to 2011) has been reviewed. During the year 2011, 2921 incidence has been recorded which showed an increase of 188 cases over the previous year. The head-wise detailed figures for the last 10 years are depicted in Table 2.9. Chart 2.6 depicts the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC Crime

The head-wise reported incidence of crime against persons and its review over the previous year has been analyzed and given as under:

(i) Murder:

During the year 2011, 130 incidence of “Murder” were reported which showed a decrease of 2cases over the previous year. Analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases crime were committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercation was the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.

(ii) Attempt to Murder:

50 incidence of “Attempt to Murder” were reported during the year 2011 against the annual average of about 70 cases. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under head ‘Murder’

(iii) C.H. not Amounting to Murder:

Only 6 incidence of “C.H. not Amounting to Murder” were reported during the year 2011 which showed a decrease of 5 case over the previous year.

(iv) Rape:

168 incidence of “Rape” were reported during the year 2011 which showed an increase of 6 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction:-

During the year 2011, 212 cases were registered which showed an increase of 18 case over the previous year. The analysis shows that about 74.42% incidence of “Kid-Abd.” are reported in 6 districts i.e. Kangra, Shimla, Chamba, Baddi, Sirmaur and Mandi. The remaining 25.58% cases were reported in the rest of 7 districts of the State.

(vi) Hurt:

Total 1251 incidence of “Hurt” were reported during 2011 which showed an increase of 328 cases over the previous year. The analysis shows that about 62.75 % incidence of hurt are reported in 4 districts i.e. Solan, Kangra, Hamirpur and Baddi. The remaining 37.25% cases were reported in the rest of 9 districts of the State.

(vii) Rioting:

During the year 2011, 530 incidence of “Rioting” were reported in the State against the 613 incidence of previous year which showed a decrease of 83 cases over the year 2010. The analysis shows that about 59.05 % incidence of rioting are reported in 4 districts i.e. Kangra, Shimla, Mandi and Sirmaur. The remaining 40.95% cases were reported in the rest of 9 districts of the State.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

During the year 2011, 239 incidence of “Cruelty to Women” were reported in the State against the 275 incidence of previous year which showed a decrease of 36 cases over the year 2010. The incidence under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

(ix) Molestation:

During the year 2011, 239 incidence of “Molestation” were reported in the State against the 348 incidence of previous year which showed a decrease of 105 cases over the year 2010. The incidence under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

(x) Dowry Deaths:

During the year 2011, 4 incidence of “Dowry Deaths” was reported in the State against the 2 incidence of previous year which

showed an increase of 2 case over the year 2010. The incidence under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

2.7 Overall Review of Crime Against Person:

The overall review on the incidences of crime against persons are more in districts Kangra, Solan, Mandi and Shimla as compared to the other districts of the State. The reasons for commission of offences under this category are family disputes, land disputes, enmity with neighbours/villagers, domestic violence & sudden provocation.

Some of the facts that have come out during the study review are:-

- (i) Offences of murder have taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration
- (ii) 91% of the persons involved are locals, the remaining 9% being outsiders.
- (iii) 2% of the accused in this crime are in the age-group below 18 years, 45% of the persons involved in the commission of this crime are in the age group of 18 to 30 years, 44% belong to the category of 30-45 years and the remaining 9% are more than 45 years in age.

2011 (DISTRICT WISE)

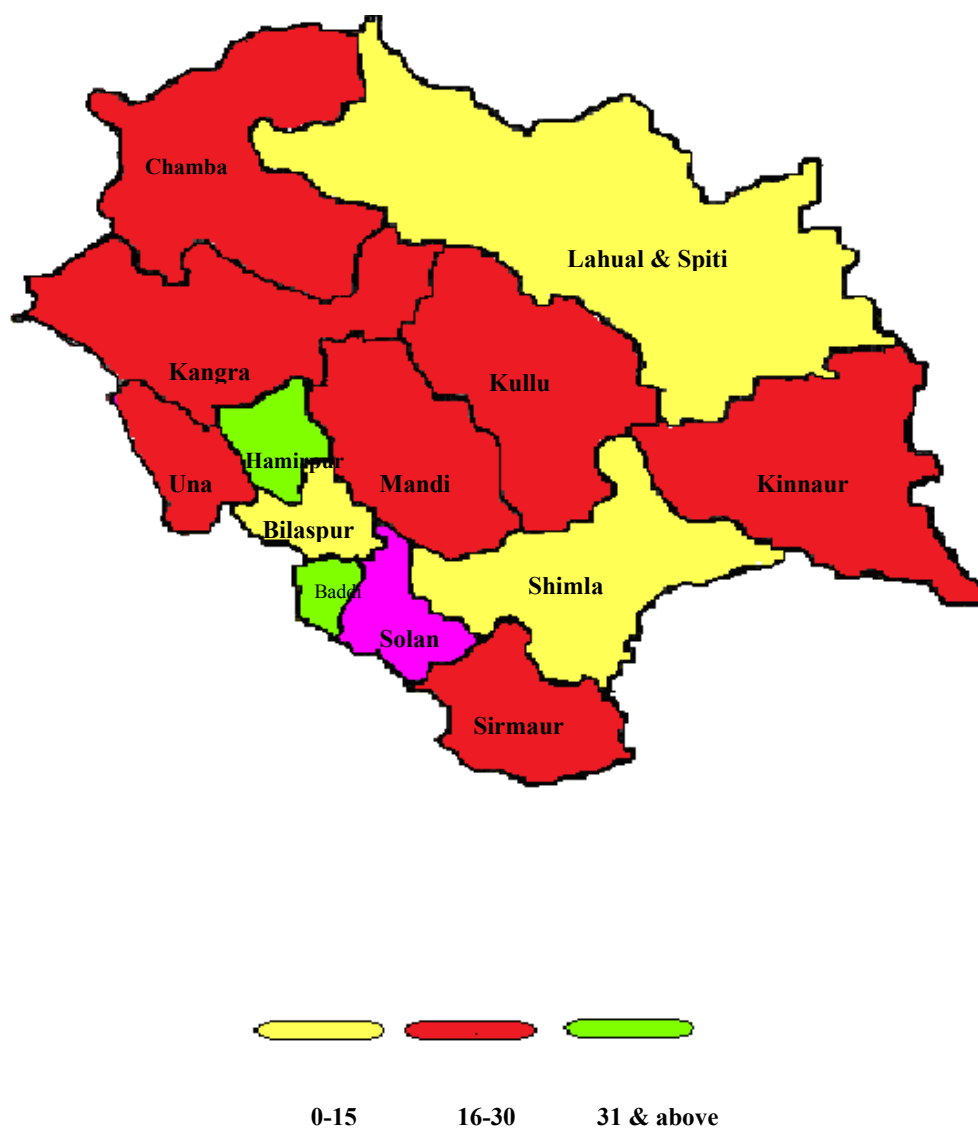

CHAPTER-3

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

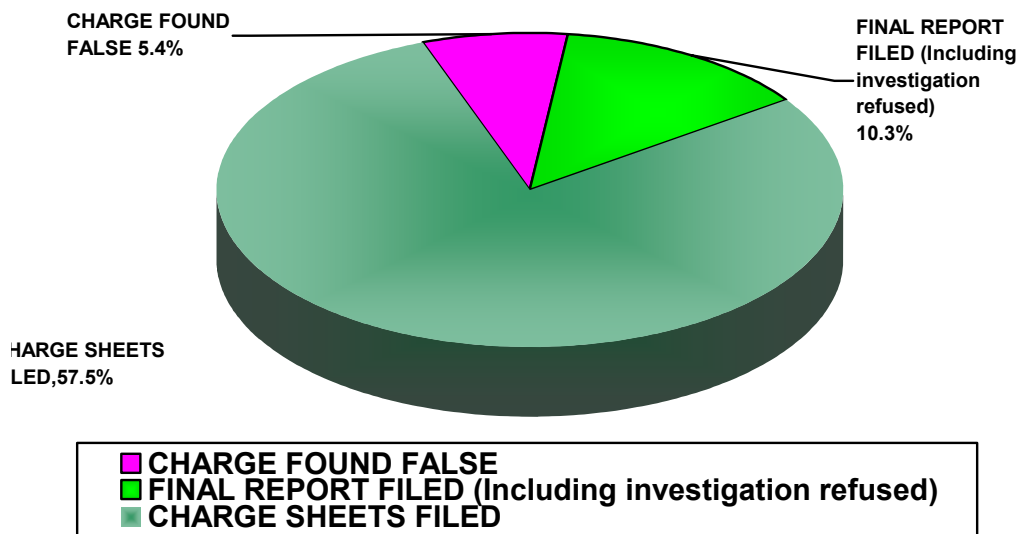
3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2011 total number of 17354 cases including cases pending from the previous years were under investigation. Out of these, approximately 12718 cases were disposed by the Police during the year and 4636 cases remain pending.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise police disposal during 2011. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal, and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of Under Investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2011 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

Less than 55.1% of the cases relating to Cheating, Criminal Breach of Trust were disposed. They represent the lowest disposal rate. The heads under which disposal of cases remained the highest, are Dacoity (100% disposed), Hurt (87.1%), Molestation (83.2% disposed), and Attempt to Commit murder (77.2.9% disposed).

3.1.2 Pendency:

On an average, 26.7% cases remained under investigation. In the following districts, pendency was the highest and the disposal lowest:-

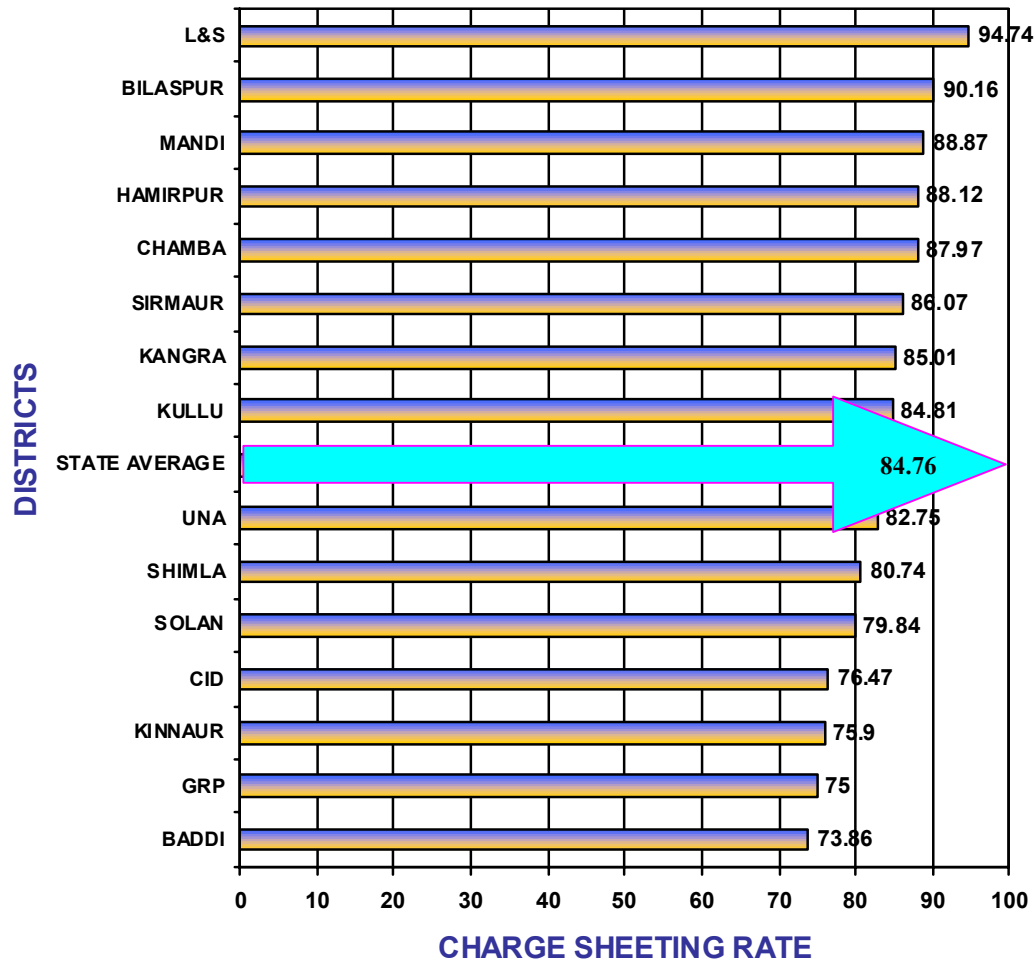
3.1.3 Charge Sheetting Rate of IPC Crimes:

3.1.4 Case Under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by Police under different crime heads is available at Table-3.4. Of the total 5616 cases (including the pending cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 78.9 % cases. Chart-3.3 presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2011

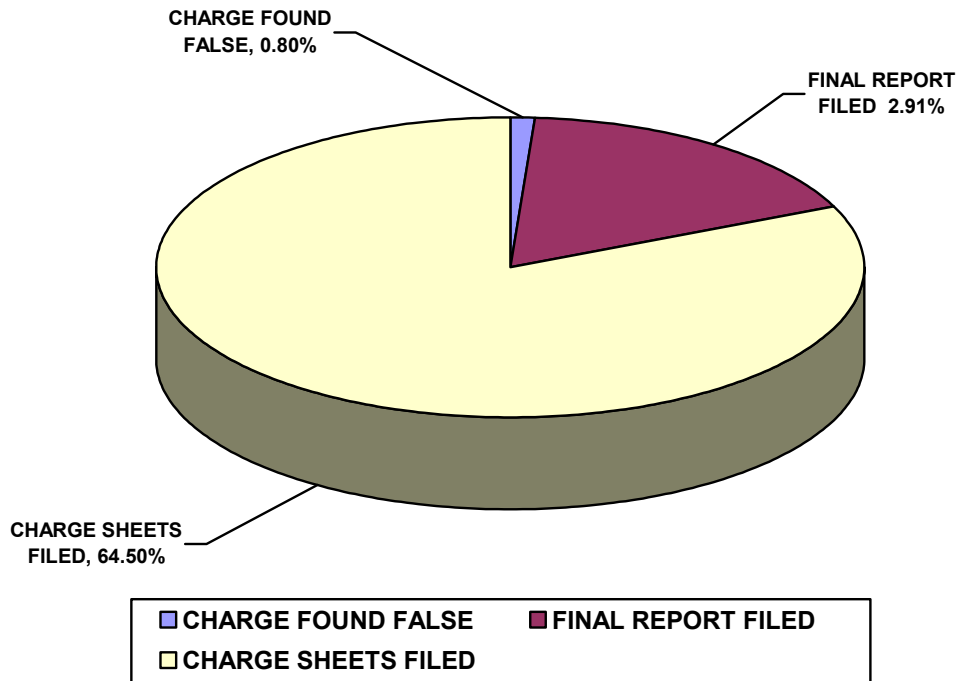


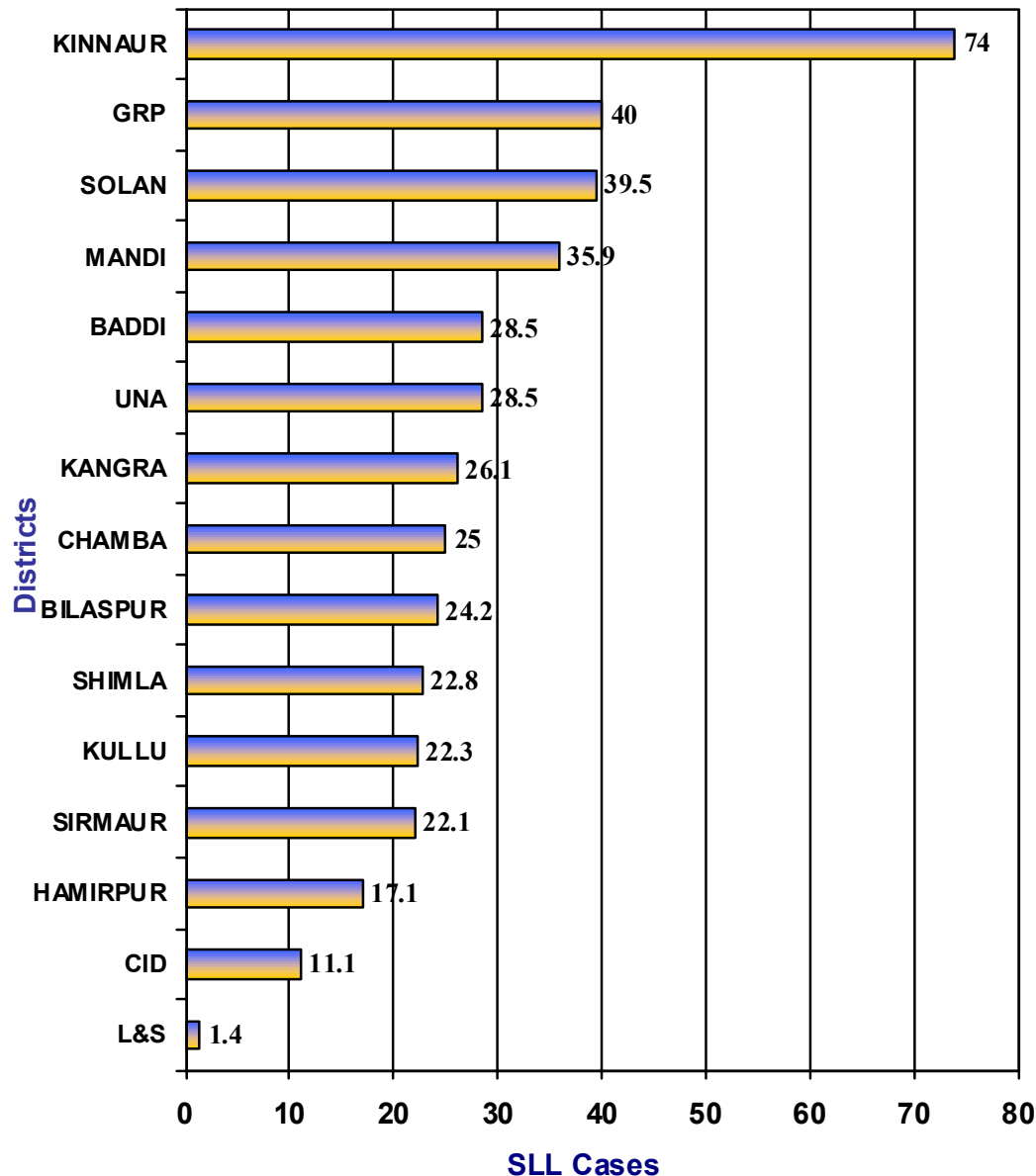

3.2 Disposal By Courts

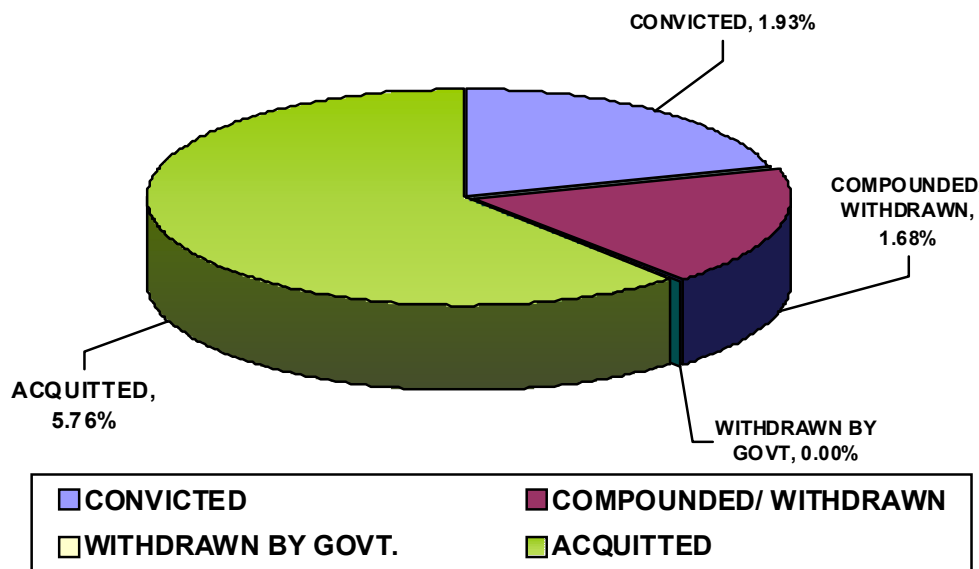
3.2.1 Cases Under IPC:

Disposal of IPC cases by Courts during 2011 is available in Table 3.7. During 2011 there were 68808 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years). 62369 of IPC

cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage of disposals during the year was 9.36 %.

The District wise disposal figures available in Table-3.8 and percentage of disposal is available in Table-3.9. The highest pendency of cases is seen in Bilaspur District (89.3). The largest number of cases is pending trial in Kangra District (11159) which has a pendency of 93.8 %. Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2011.

3.2.2 Cases Under SLL:-

Disposal of SLL cases by Courts during 2011 head wise is available in Table-3.10. There were 23893 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning

of 2011. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 20405. The percentage of disposals is 14.60.

Table 3.11 Shows district wise pendency and its share in the state pendency, Distt. Kangra (9273) followed by Kullu (2067), Shimla (1842) and Mandi (1613) cases. Chart-3.6 Shows percentage disposal of SLL cases by the Courts during 2011.

BY COURTS DURING 2011

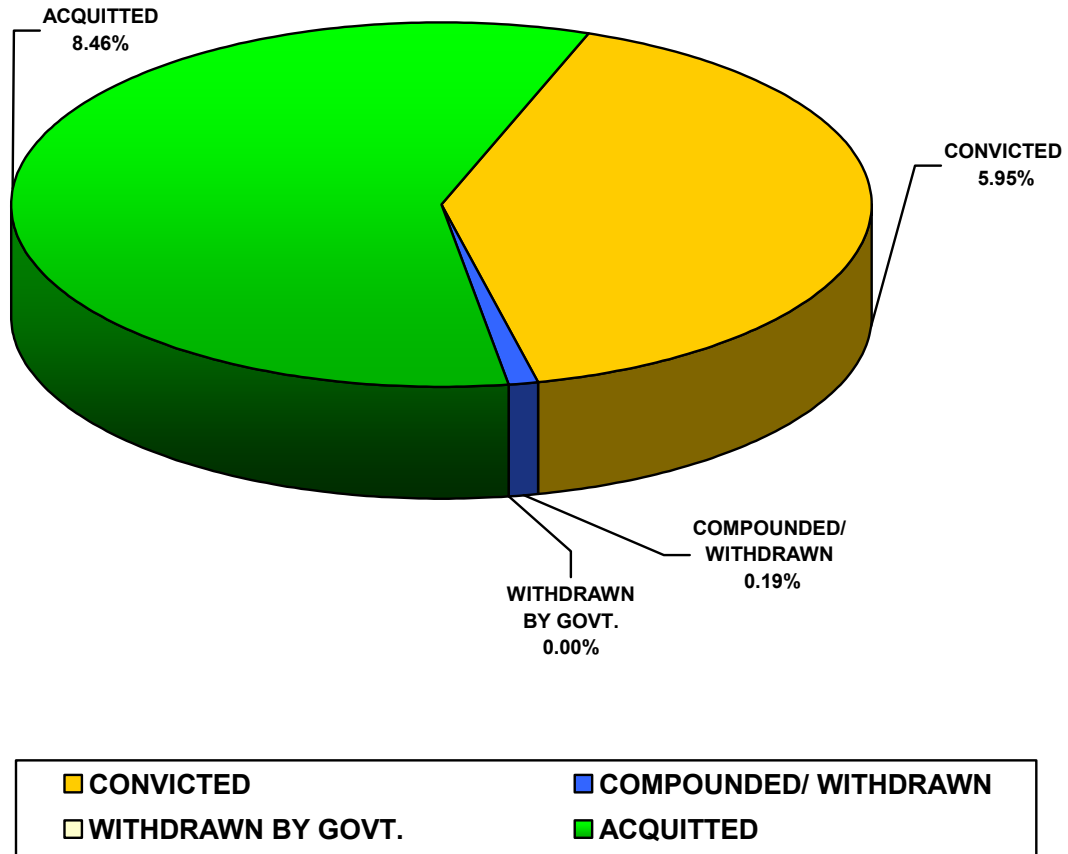

DISPOSAL OF (IPC) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2011

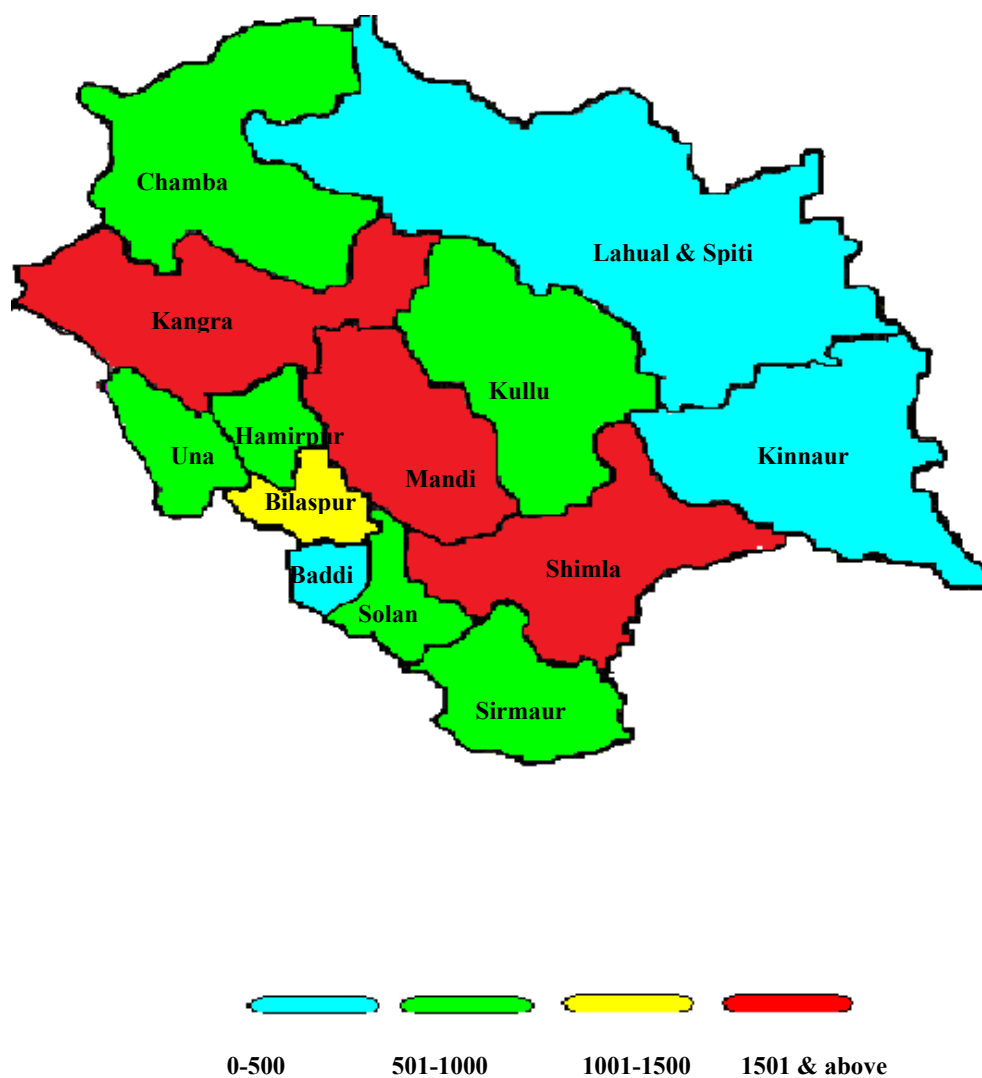

DISPOSAL OF (SLL) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2011

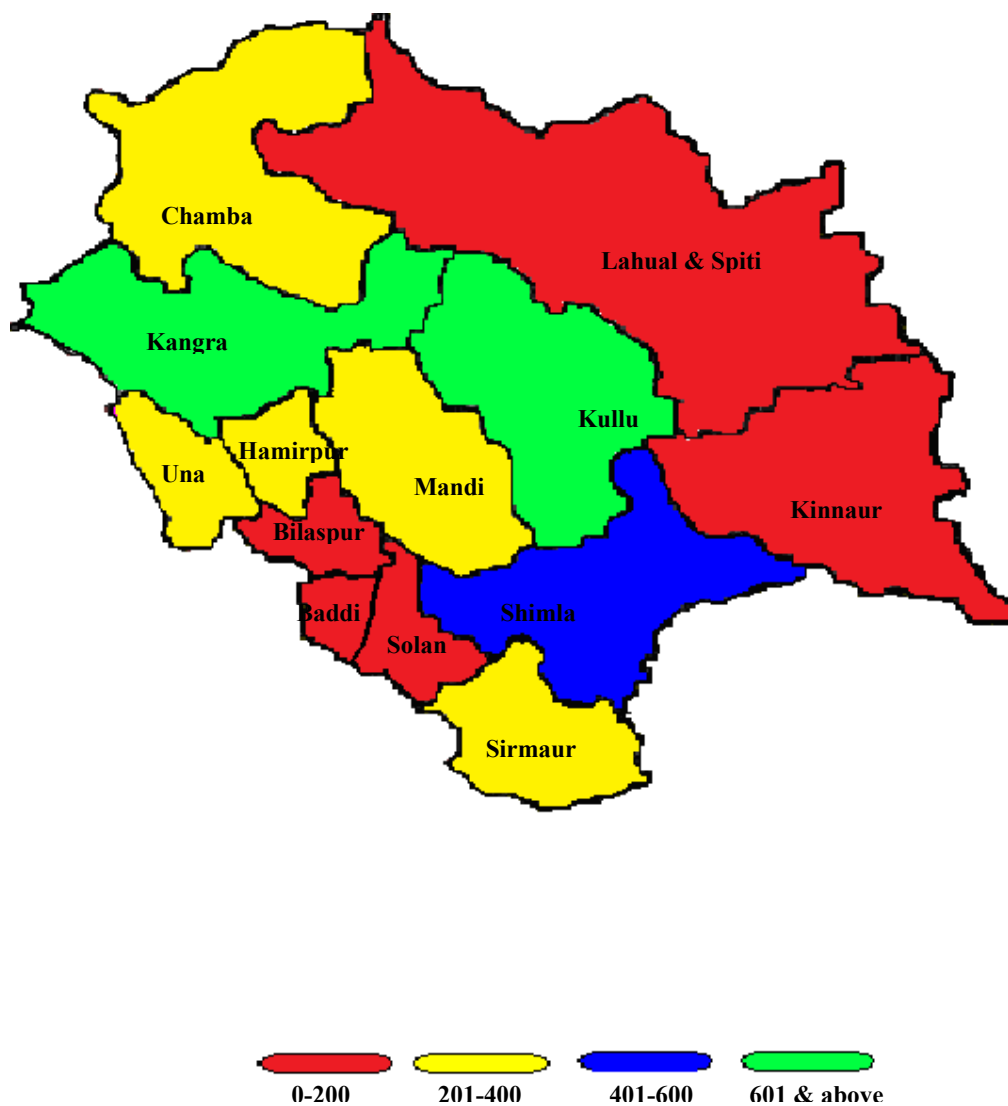

CONVICTED CASES (IPC) DURING 2011

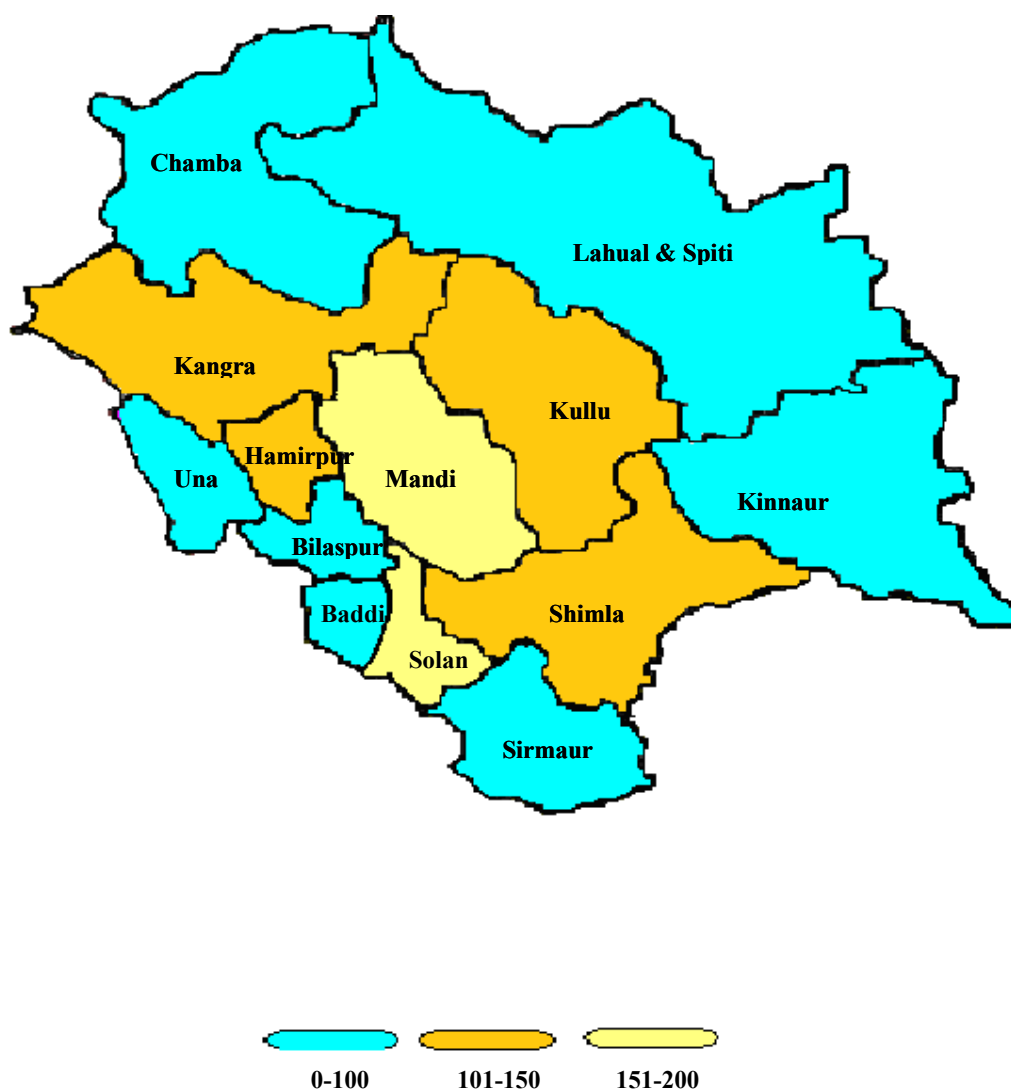

CONVICTED CASES (SLL) DURING 2011

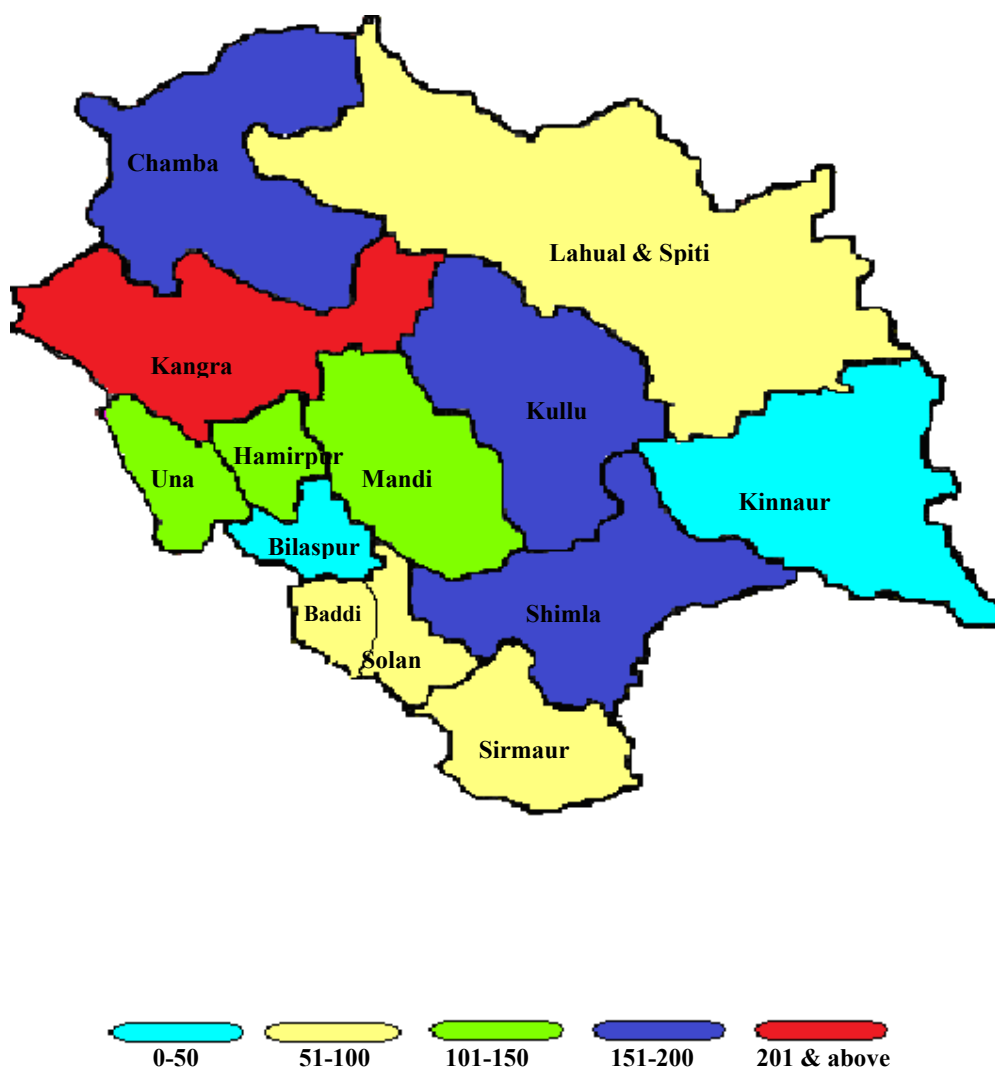

CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. On one hand, special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the resources of the community.

Crime against women has decreased during the year 2011 in comparison to the previous year. However, the marginal increase in reported cases of crime against women for the last two years is being recorded which is probably due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report the unfortunate incidents, which took place with them. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos, social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP, Police Department, Women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better Police response to the malaise. A Women Crime Unit has been constituted at State CID Hdqrs., Shimla to monitor as well as to ensure quick disposal of cases of crime against women. 2 AHTU's have also been established in Shimla & Kangra in first phase. No particular area is prone to the incidence of such crime in this state. No special organized gang is operative in the state to commit crime against women. In a nutshell, a complete sense of security is prevailing among women folk and they are performing their daily chores without any fear.

- (v) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363,366, IPC)
- (vi) Molestation (Sec.354 IPC)
- (vii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (viii) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (ix) Eave Teasing (Sec.509 IPC)
- (x) Chain Snatching
- (xi) Dowry (Prohibition) Act
- (xii) Immoral Traffic (P) Act

4.3 Incidence of Crime Against Women:

Head wise incidence of reported Crimes Against Women during 2010 and 2011 along with percentage variation are given below has been calculated and presented in Table 4.1.

The cases of Cruelty to Women and molestation together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (51.17 %). There were substantial number of instances (17.15%) of Kidnapping and abduction of women and girls and (15.08 %) rape.

The district wise incidence and rate of crimes against women during 2011 is presented in Table 4.2 and Chart 4.3 and Chart 4.4 .

WOMEN DURING 2011

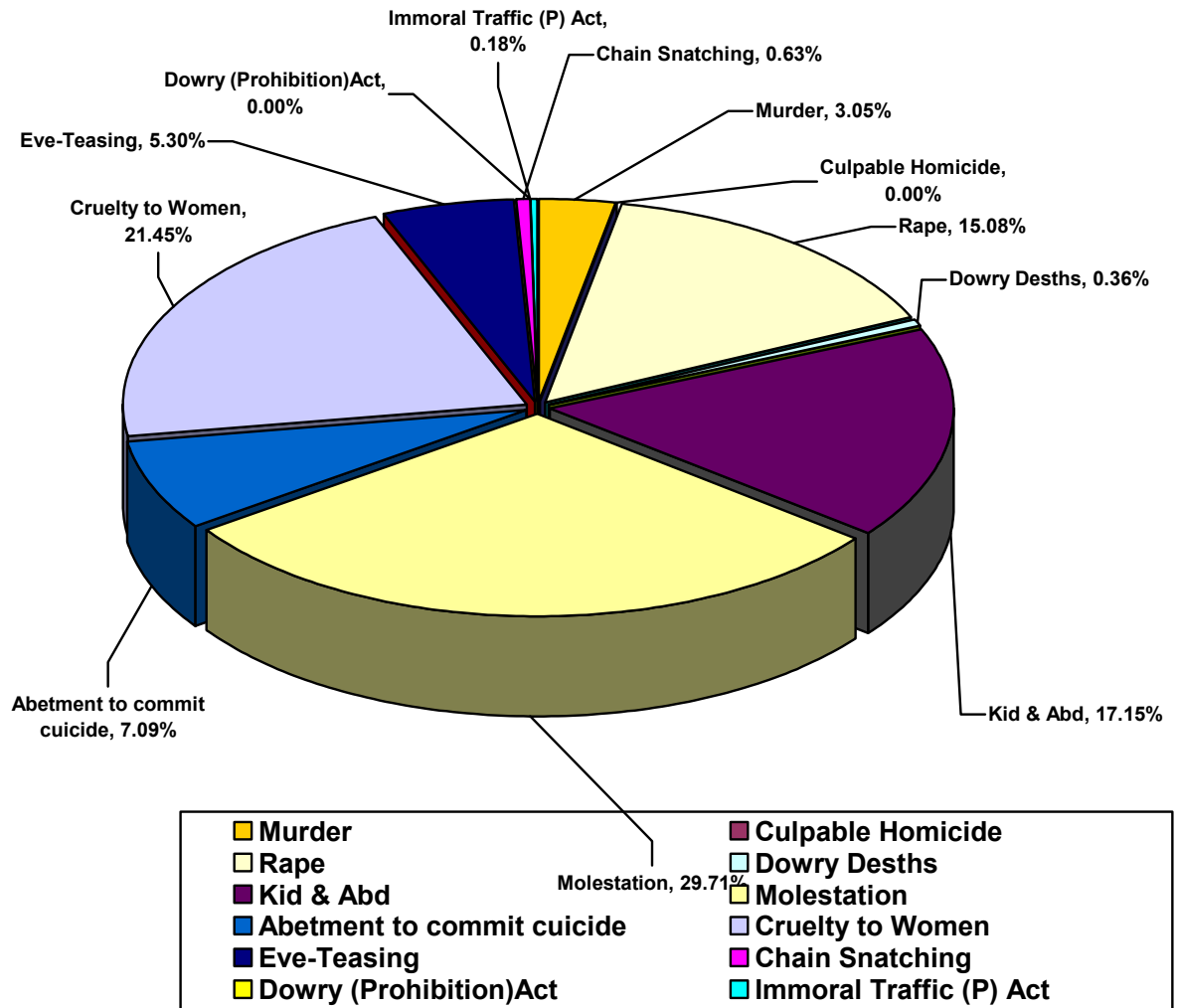
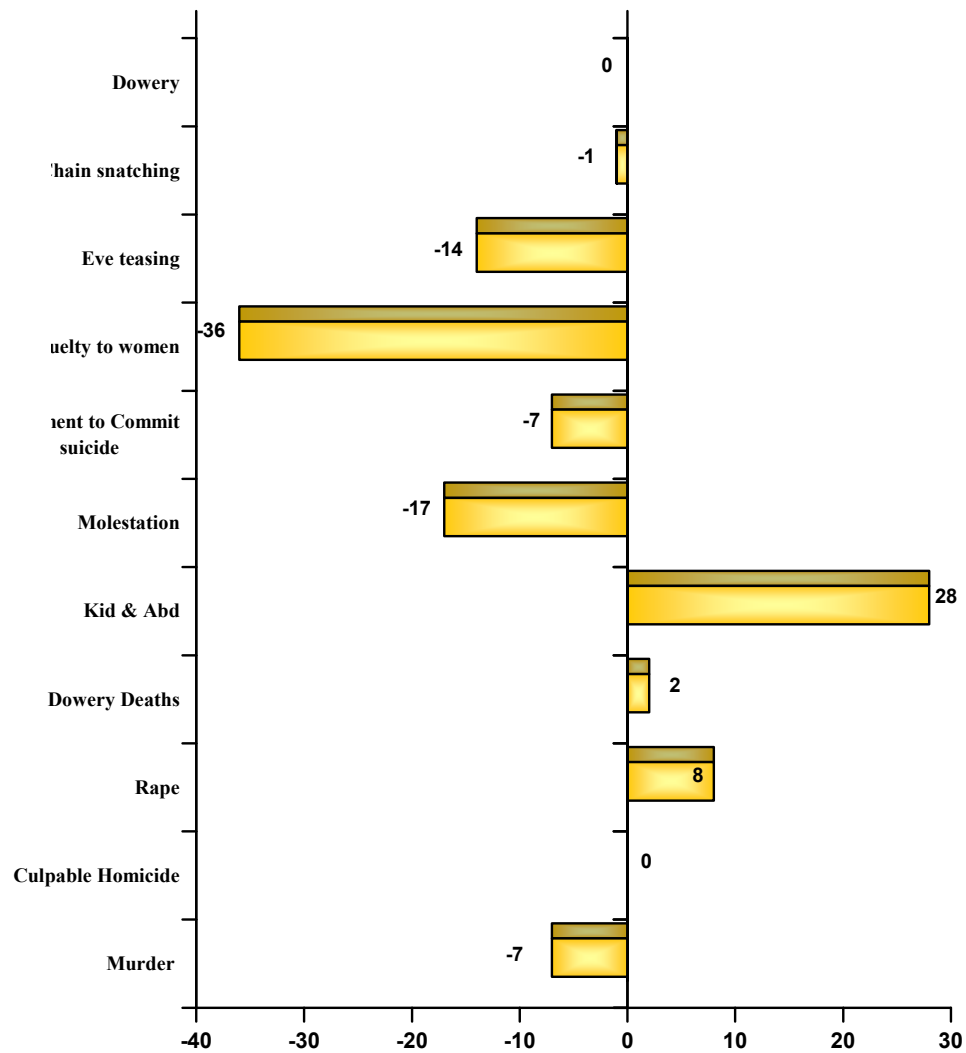

DISTRICT WISE REGISTRATION AND RATE OF CRIME DURING 2011

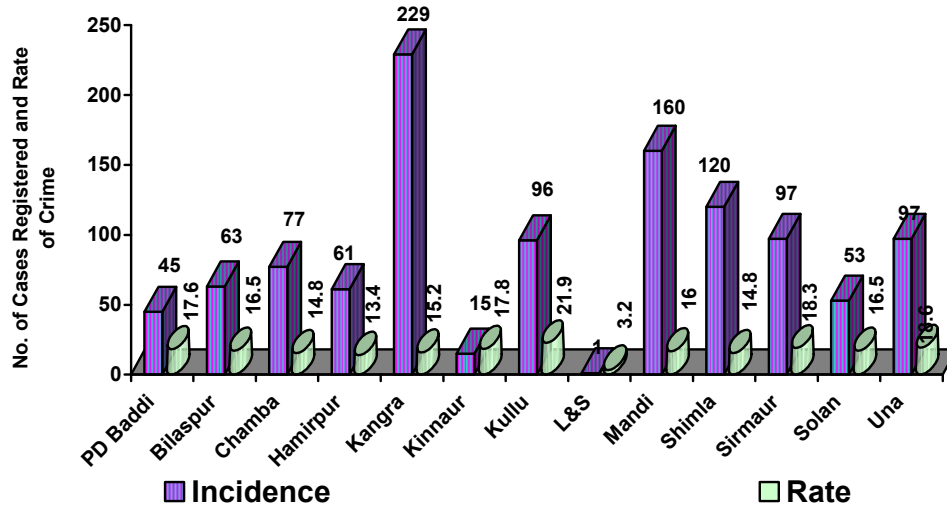
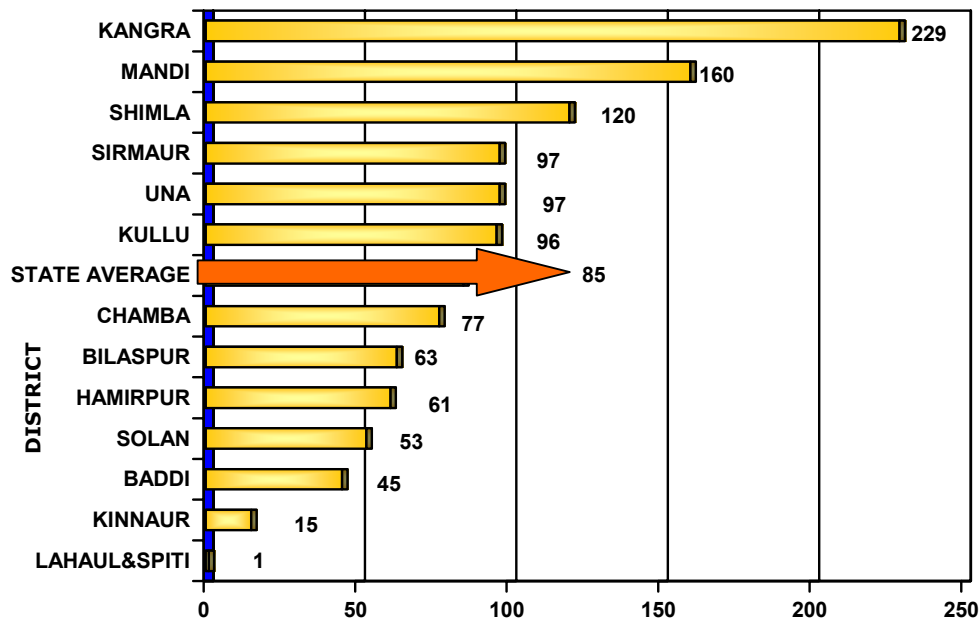
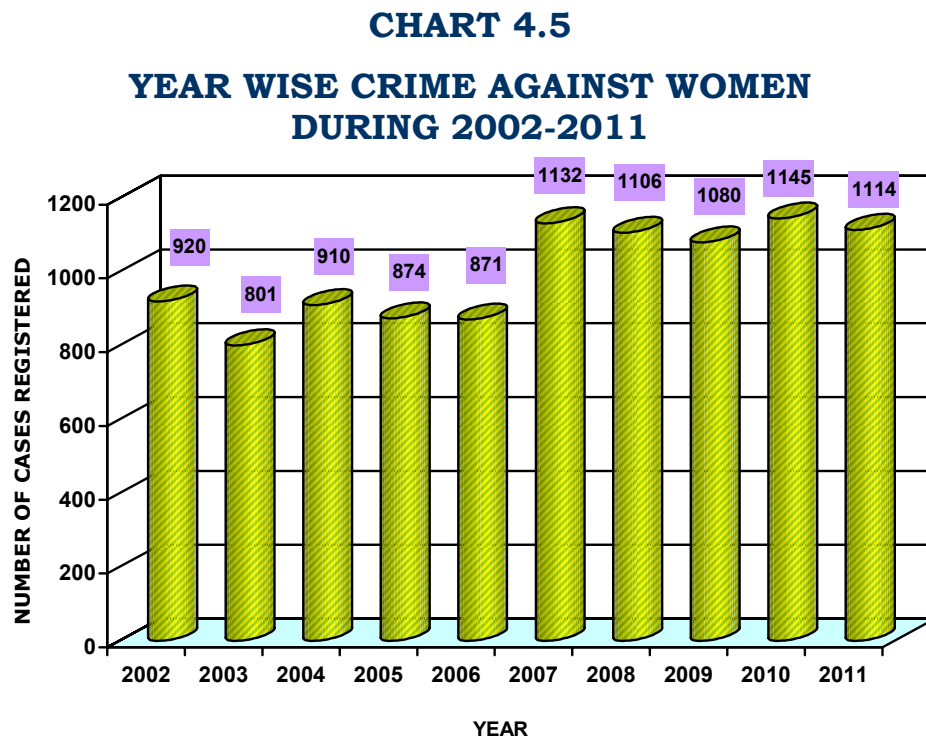


CHART 4.4

The head wise and district wise incidence, their rate and percentage has been calculated and presented in Table 4.3.

The total figures of crime against women for the last 10 years (2002-2011) are presented in Table 4.4 and Chart 4.5.



From the analysis of Crime Against Women reported in districts, it is seen that cases of Murder, Rape, Dowry Death, Kidnapping & abduction are found reported more in the State during the year 2011. The district remained most prevalent in these incidents is Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, Sirmaur, Bilaspur, Una, Hamirpur and Kullu. The cases of murder remained highest in the District Kangra, Shimla and Baddi.

The district which indicate the lowest incidence of crime against women are Lahaul & Spiti (1), Kinnaur (15), Baddi (45) and Solan (53).

4.4 Head wise incidence of Crime Against Women:

The brief explanation of head wise status of crime against women during the years 2011 is given as under:

(i) Murder: (Increase 25.93%)

Incidence of Murder cases (34) registered during the year 2011 showed an increase of 25.93 % over the previous year. Kangra (6 cases) district reported the highest incidence of Murder under this head followed by Shimla (5), Baddi (4), Chamba, Kullu, Sirmaur and Una (3 each), Mandi, Solan (2 each), Bilaspur, Hamirpur and Kinnaur (1 each). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district.

Reasons:-

1. Property disputes amongst family and relationship to capture the property of women.
2. Land disputes, Enmity with the villagers or other family members.
3. Domestic violence, Torture by In- laws due to various reasons.
4. Illicit love affairs especially in hotels etc to destroy/elope the evidences after rape.
5. Sudden provocation during scuffle.

(ii) Culpable Homicide:

Under this head no incidence was reported in the state, hence no more review is required for comparison.

(iii). Rape : (Increase 5 Percent)

Total 168 cases of Rape were reported which has shown an increase of 5 percent during 2011 over previous year 2010 (160

cases). The highest incidence of rape was reported in Kangra (32) followed by Mandi (26), Shimla (22), Kullu (20), Sirmaur (12), Solan and Una (11 each), Baddi, Bilaspur (8 each), Chamba, Kinnaur (6 each), Hamirpur (5). The lowest number of case was reported in Lahaul & Spiti (1) district.

Reasons:-

1. Illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties and later on matter disclosed.
2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents the matter of marriage do no reach to the compromise resulting in registration of cases.
3. Due to enmity fake registration of rape cases.
4. Rape cases firstly with the consent and later on when caught and seen by husband or any relative the case is registered.
5. Cases of minor girls rape cases are committed forcibly without consent of the girl.
6. In some cases of adult woman sexual intercourse with consent and friendship but case is reported when the matter comes in to the open.
7. Rape in relationship

(iv). Dowry Deaths: (Increase 50%)

Incidence of Dowry Death recorded an increase of 50 % over the previous year 2010. A total number of 4 Dowry Deaths cases were registered in Chamba (2), Kangra & Kinnaur (1 each) districts. No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(v). Kidnapping & Abduction: (Increase 17.2%)

During the year 2011, 191 incidence of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered which showed an increase of 17.2% over the previous year. Kangra district reported the highest incidence (55 cases) under this crime head followed by Shimla (24 cases) Chamba (18 cases), Sirmaur (17), Mandi (16), Badd9 (15), Solan (13), Kullu (12), Una (10), Hamirpur (7) and Bilaspur (3). Lowest incidence under this head was reported in district Kinnaur (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district.

Reasons:-

1. Maximum cases are registered due to the reasons that during the young age boys and girls are indulged in love affairs and than the girl is subjected to kidnapping and abduction by the boys to alluring for marriage. Later on due to refusal of parents the matter is not settled, resulting the case is registered.
2. In the first instance the girls and boys are innocent about the consequences of the act of omission due to feeling of enjoyment provocation. Later on the matter of marriage is not settled, hence cases are registered.
3. In some cases boys and girls are fled away because their parents do not give their consent to marry.
4. In some cases kidnapping abduction is forcibly without consent of a girl where the girl is minor for the purpose of marriage or sexual intercourse.

(vi) Molestation:(Decrease 4.89%)

331 Cases of molestation were registered during the year 2011 showed an decrease of 4.89% over the previous year. Kangra district recorded the highest (60 cases) followed by Mandi (55 cases), Shimla (45 cases), Kullu (38 cases), Chamba (29 cases), Bilaspur (18),

Hamirpur (17), Una (16), Baddi & Solan (7 cases each). The lowest 4 cases reported in Kinnaur District and no case was found registered in district Lahaul & Spiti.

Reasons:

1. To outrage the modesty of women and girls.
2. Due to increasing trend of obscene films and literature in the market.
3. Due to obscene publication and presentation of material by print media.
4. Due to increasing educational activities, educational institutions and obscene activities by the anti- social elements near educational institutions and residential areas.

(vii) Abetment to Commit Suicide:(Decrease 5.81%)

The minor decreasing trend is seen under this head with 5.81% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra district (17 cases) followed by Hamirpur (14), Mandi (9), Sirmaur & Una (8 each), Bilaspur (7), Chamba (6), Shimla (3), Baddi, Kullu & Solan (2 each). The lowest incidence was seen in Kinnaur (1) district. No incidence was reported under this head in district Lahaul & Spiti.

(viii) Cruelty to Women : (Decrease 13.09%)

239 cases of Cruelty to Women was registered during the year 2011, showed a decrease of 13.09% over the previous year. The analysis revealed that highest number of cases (42) were registered in Kangra district followed by Mandi district (40 cases), Una (39), Sirmaur (23), Kullu (21), Bilaspur (17), Shimla & Solan (16 each), Chamba (10), Baddi (9), Hamirpur (5). The lowest incidence was seen in Kinnaur (1) district. No incidence was reported under this head in district Lahaul & Spiti.

Reasons:

1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
2. Harassment and torture of women by her in laws i.e. husband, mother in law, father in law etc.
3. Harassment of women in family that she is not capable to do the house hold and agriculture activities.
4. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to the illicit relationship of the husband with other woman in the family or relationship.
5. Torture/harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
6. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father in law and mother in law of the victims.

(ix) Eve Teasing: (Decrease:19.18%)

The decreasing trend is seen under this head by 19.18% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Hamirpur, Kangra & Mandi (12 each) districts followed by Bilaspur (9), Shimla & Una (5 each), Chamba (3). The lowest incidence was seen in Sirmaur district (1). No case was reported under this head in Baddi, Kinnaur, Kullu, Una and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

(x) Chain Snatching: (Decrease : 12.5 %)

7 cases under this head were reported during the year as compared to the 8 cases registered during the previous year which showed 12.5 % decrease. Highest incidence under this head was reported in Una (4 cases) followed by Kangra (2), Solan (1) districts. No case of chain snatching was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.

(xi) Dowry Prohibition Act:

No case under this head was reported in the State during this year and previous year.

(xii) Immoral Trafficking:

Only 2 cases were registered under this head during the year 2011 in Kangra district. No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.

In view of the above, it is pertinent to mention here that the trends of offences pertaining to Crime against Women, do take place some times at various places in this state. Hence no particular districts/ area is prone for committing such offences. Also no specific gang is active / involved committing such offences.

INCIDENCE OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING-2011

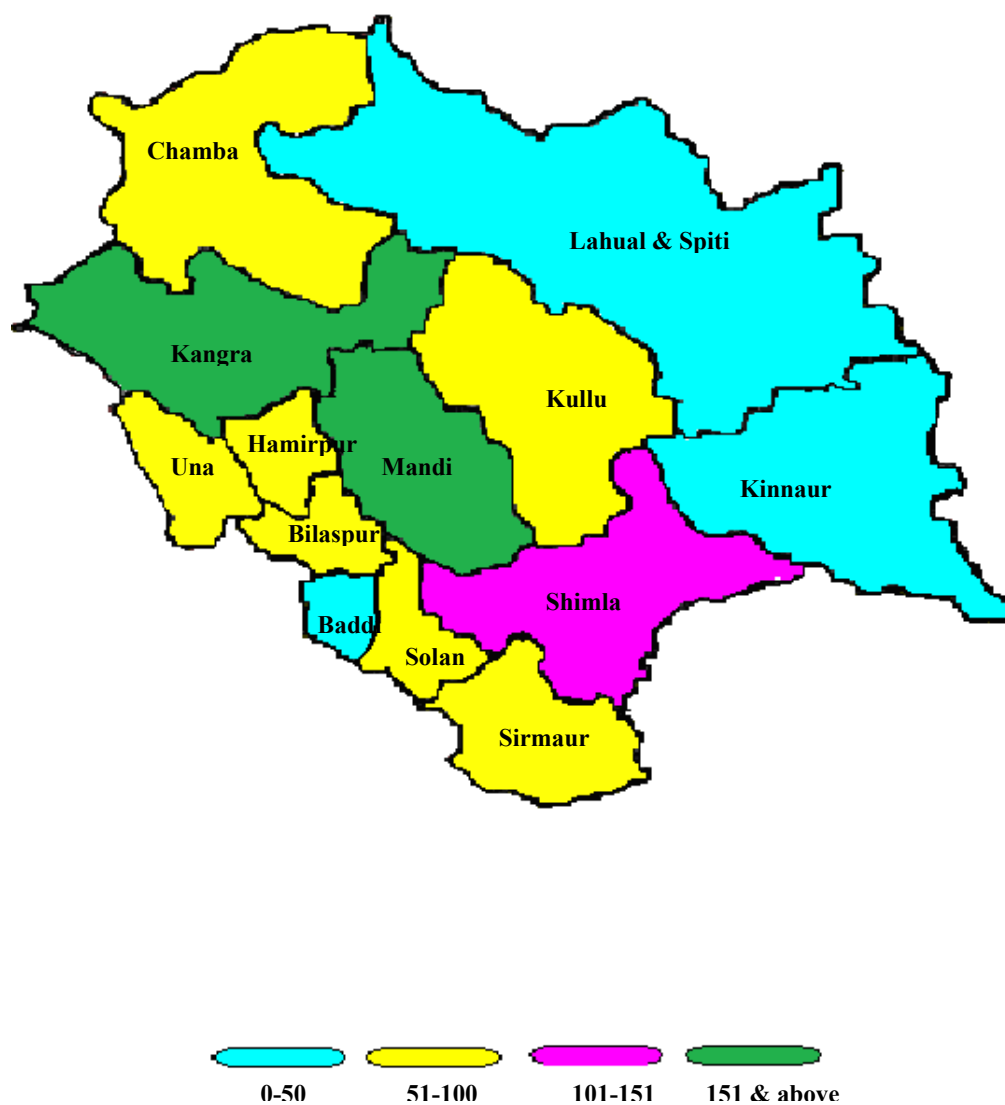

CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Includes violations under certain sections of Indian Penal Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

- i). Murder
- ii). Infanticide
- iii). Rape
- iv). Kidnapping and abduction.
- v). Foeticide
- vi). Abetment to Suicide
- vii). Exposure and abandonment
- viii). Procurement of minor girls (below 18).
- ix). Buying of minor girls for prostitution (below 18).
- x). Selling of minor girls for prostitution (below 18).
- x). Child Marriage Restraint
- xi). Other crimes committed against Children .

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and Chart 5.1 depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2011.

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME COMMITTED AGAINST CHILDREN DURING 2011

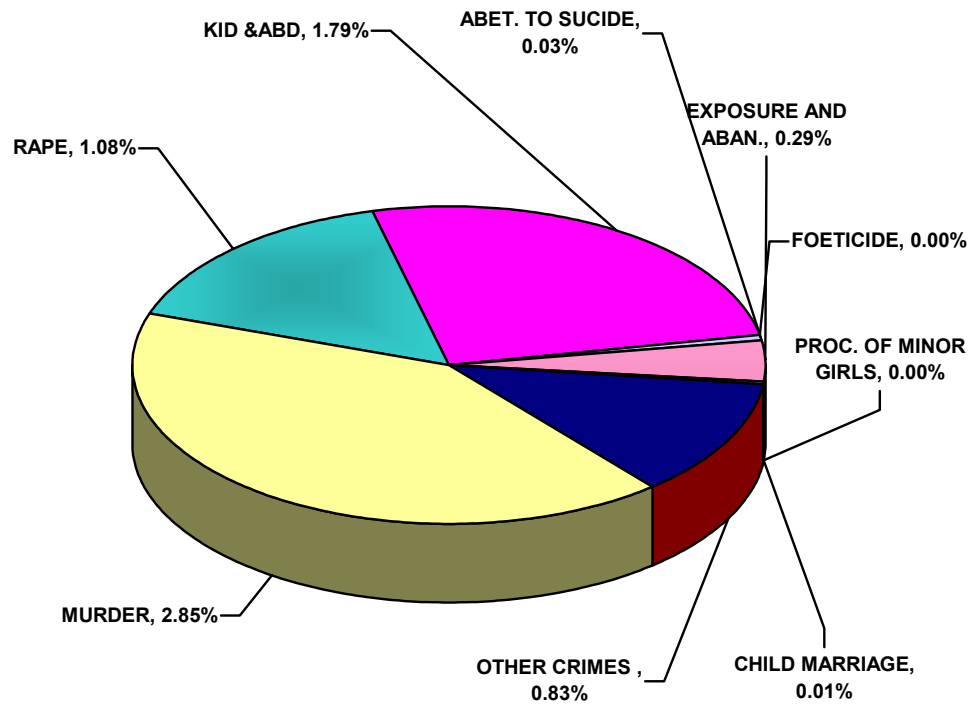
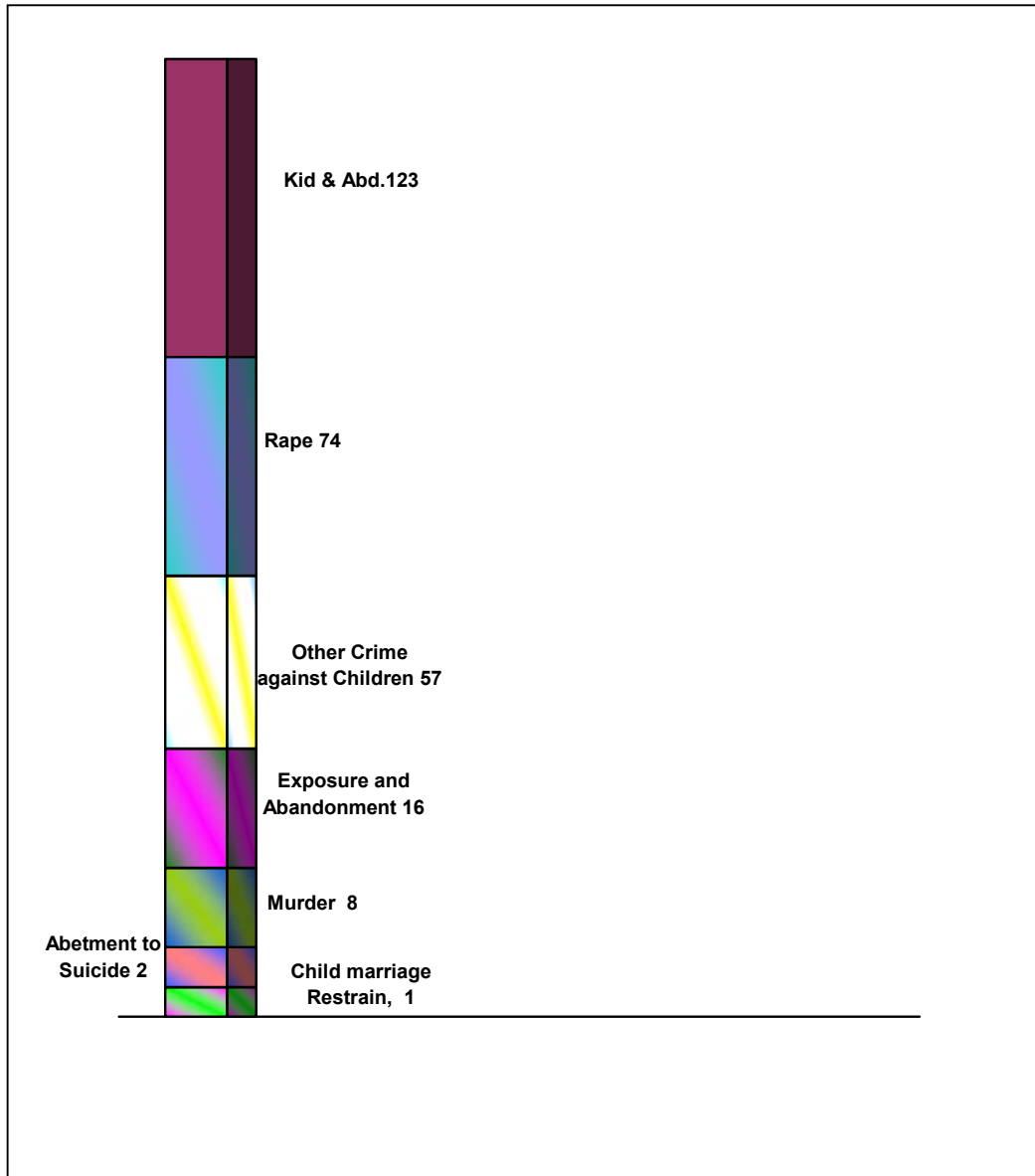


CHART 5.2

5.3 Incidence:

Table 5.1 shows the incidence and rate of Crime Against children, District wise including its rank.

Totally 281 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. “Kidnapping & Abduction” constituted the largest category 123 cases (43.78%) were reported during the year. The maximum number of kidnapping & abduction was reported in Kangra district (28 cases), followed by Mandi (16) and Baddi & Kullu (10 cases each).

The second most prevalent crime against children was Rape which accounted for 74 cases (26.33%). The “Rape” cases were reported highest in District Kangra (13 cases) followed by district Kullu & Shimla (12 cases each), Mandi, Solan & Una (6 cases each).

There were 8 incidents of “Murder” of Children. Baddi (2), Chamba, Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kullu, Shimla and Sirmaur districts reported 1 case each.

2 cases of “Abetment to Commit Suicide” was reported in districts Kullu and Shimla (1 each) during the year 2011.

Total 57 cases of “Other Crimes” against children were reported during the year. The highest incidence of other crimes were reported in Mandi district (14 cases) followed by Kangra (12), Hamirpur and Sirmaur (5 cases each), Bilaspur (4), Chamba (3), Solan and Una (2 cases each), Kinnaur and Shimla (1 case each). No incidence under this head was reported in Baddi and Lahaul & Spiti district.

No incidence under “Procuration of Minor girls”, Buying of Girls for Prostitution” , “Selling of Girls for Prostitution” and Child Marriage Restraint” was reported in the State during the year 2011.

The incidence and percentage contribution of State regarding crimes against children head wise and district wise presented in Table.5.2.

CHAPTER-6

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

Total 22728 persons (17488 under IPC & 5240 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2011 in 18875 cases (14312 IPC + 4563 Local & Special Laws) which is a decrease of 3.48 % when compared with the arrests of 23548 persons ((18768 under IPC & 4780 under Local & Special Laws) in 2010.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:

During the year 2011 as many as 22728 persons were arrested in 14312 cases registered under IPC as against 18768 persons in 2010. Chart 6.1 depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2009-2011.

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC DURING 2009-2011

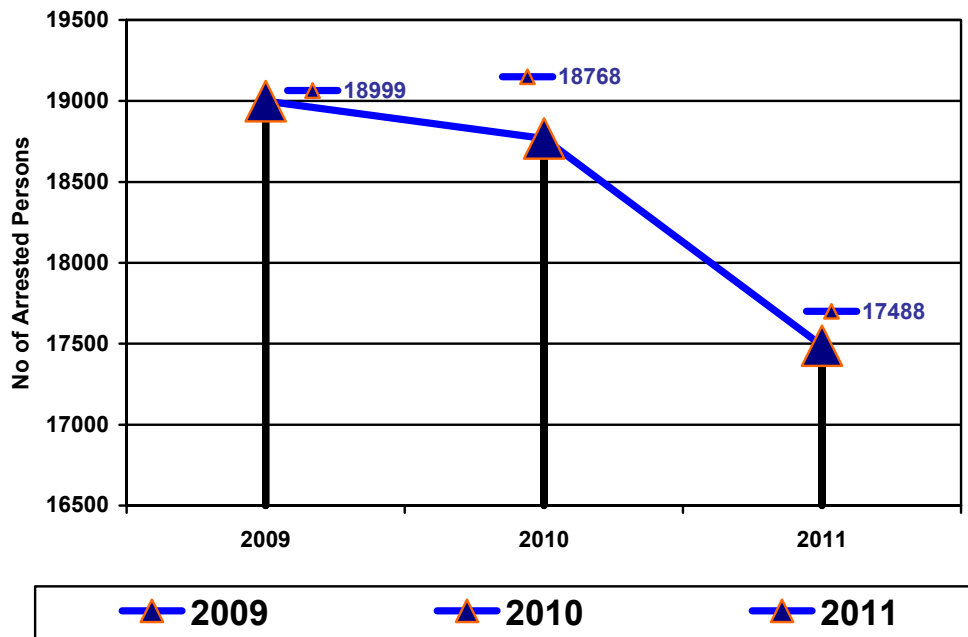


Table 6.1 gives details of arrests made under IPC crime during the last 3 years 2009-2011.

Table 6.2 gives Age-group wise and gender wise break up of persons arrested in districts.

Kangra district tops in arresting 2643 persons in 2709 cases during 2011 followed by Mandi by arresting 2554 persons in 1640 cases and district Shimla by arresting 2391 persons in 2866 cases.

In Baddi district 579 cases were registered and arrested 821 persons. Chamba district has registered 678 cases and arrested 1131 persons. Similarly in Hamirpur district, 1183 persons were arrested against the registration of 793 cases during the year 2011. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in Table 6.3.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC crime during the years 2011 and Chart 6.3 depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC Crime cases during the year 2011 in descending order.

CRIMES DURING 2011.

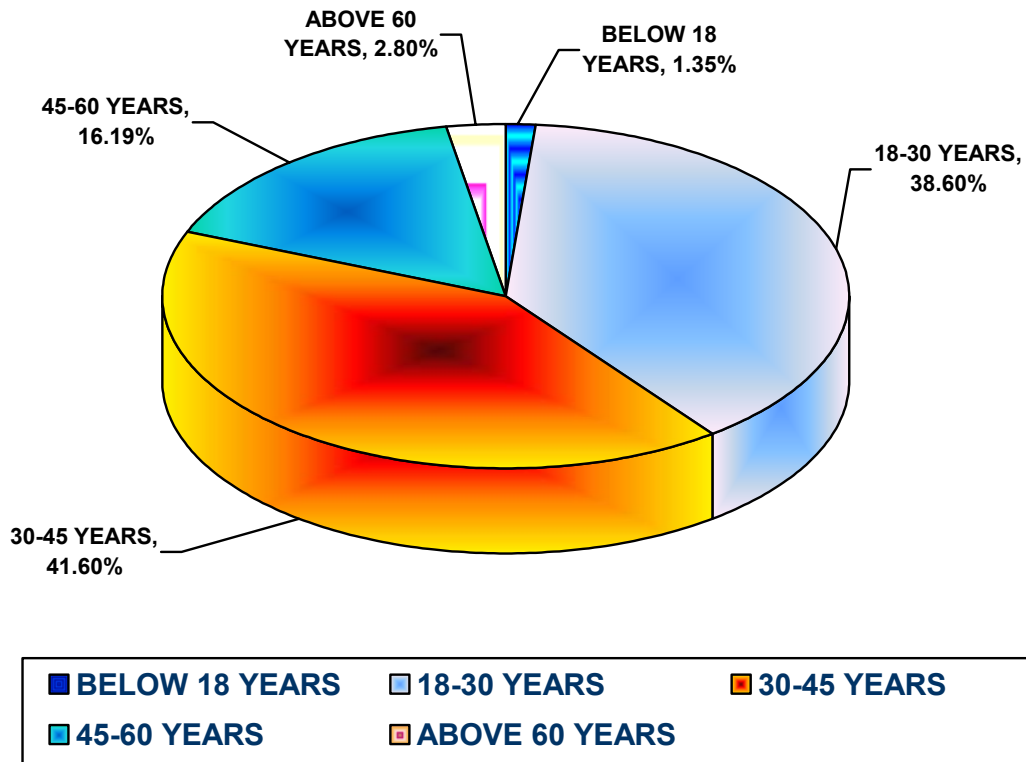
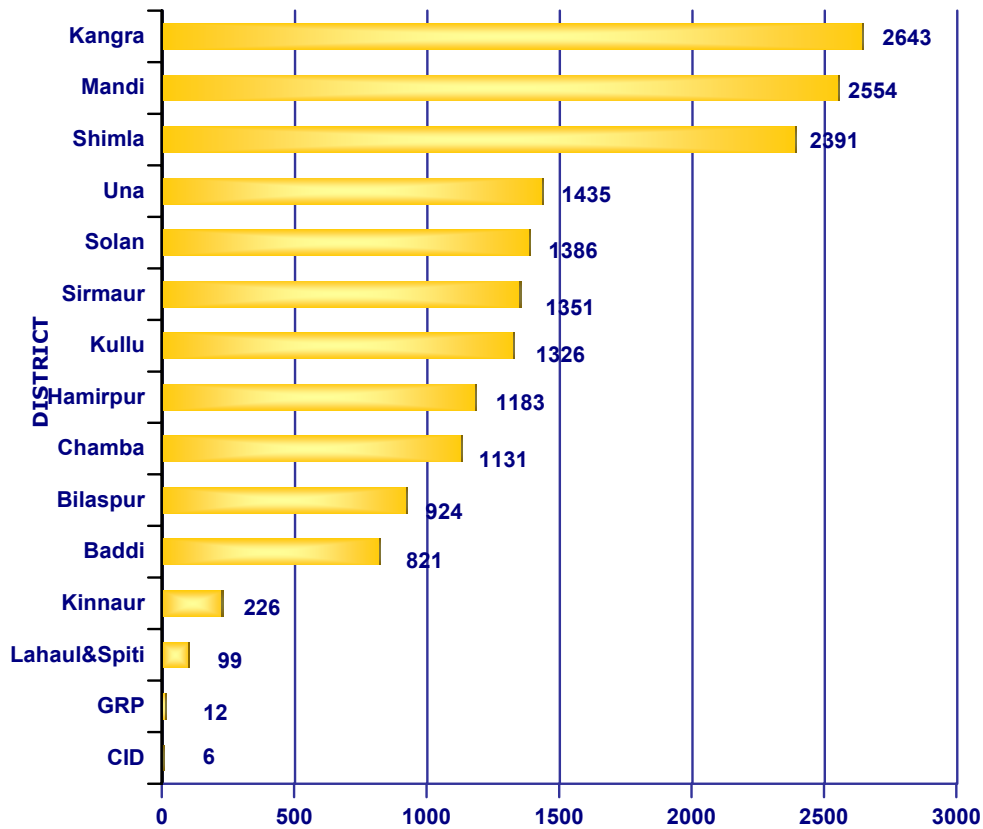

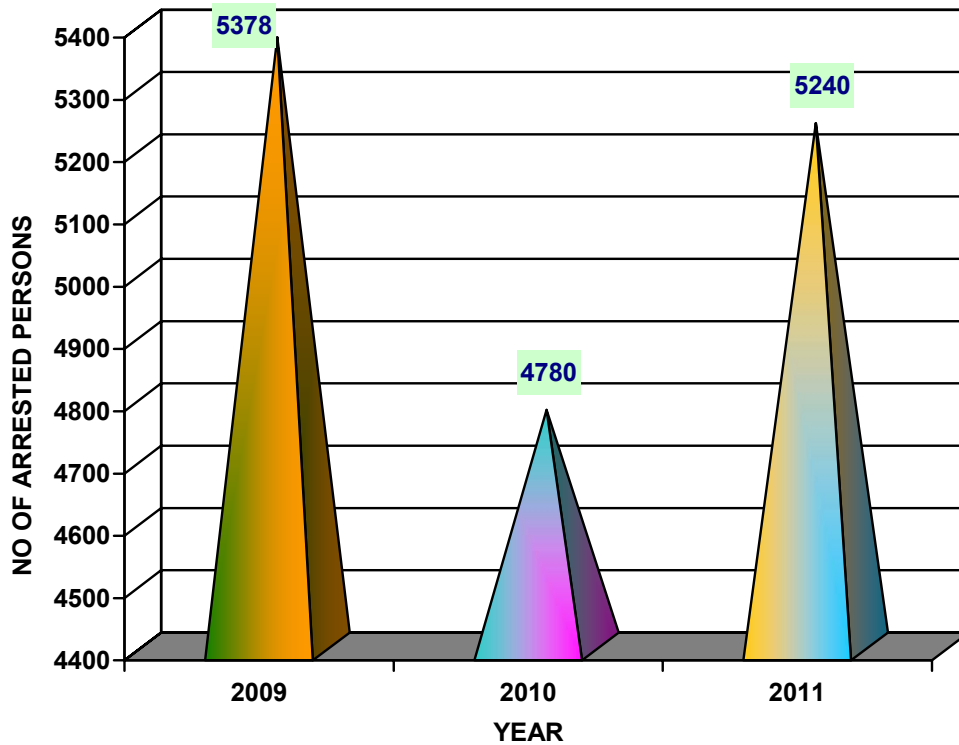

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2009-2011

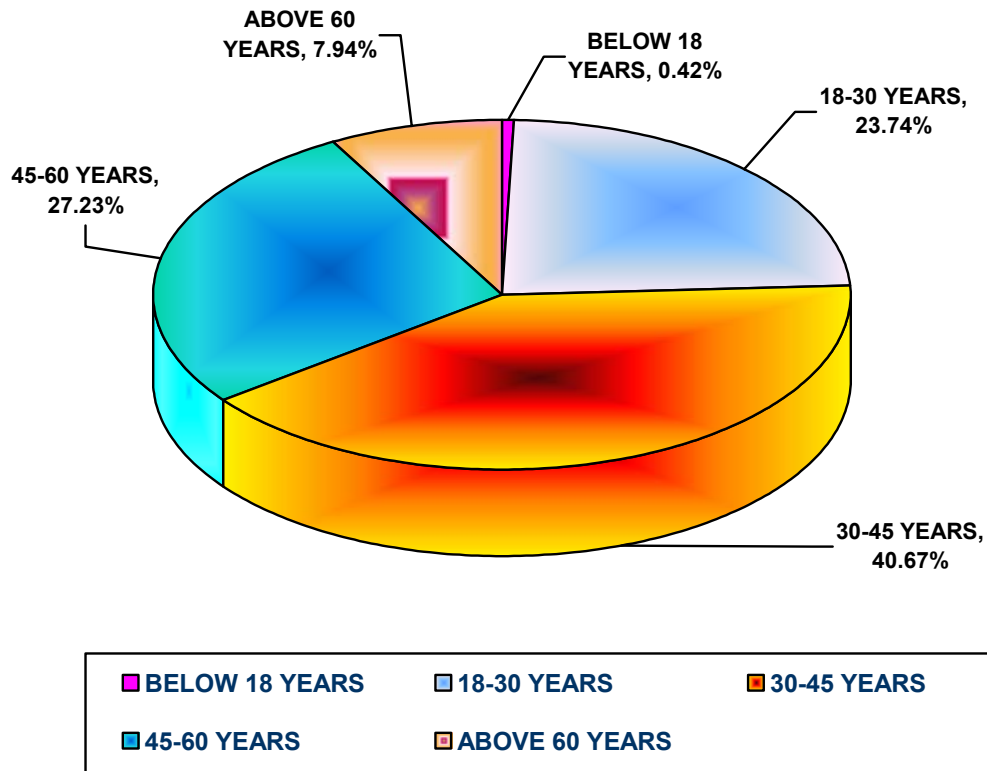

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2011

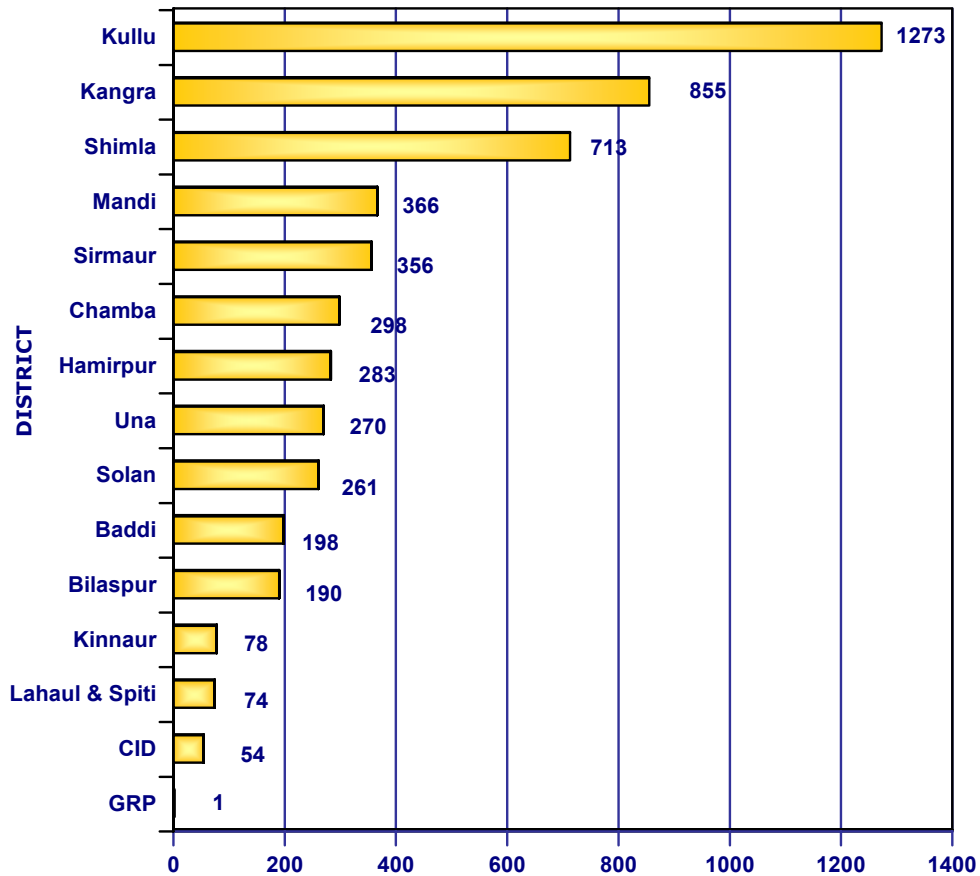

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC) CRIMES – 2011

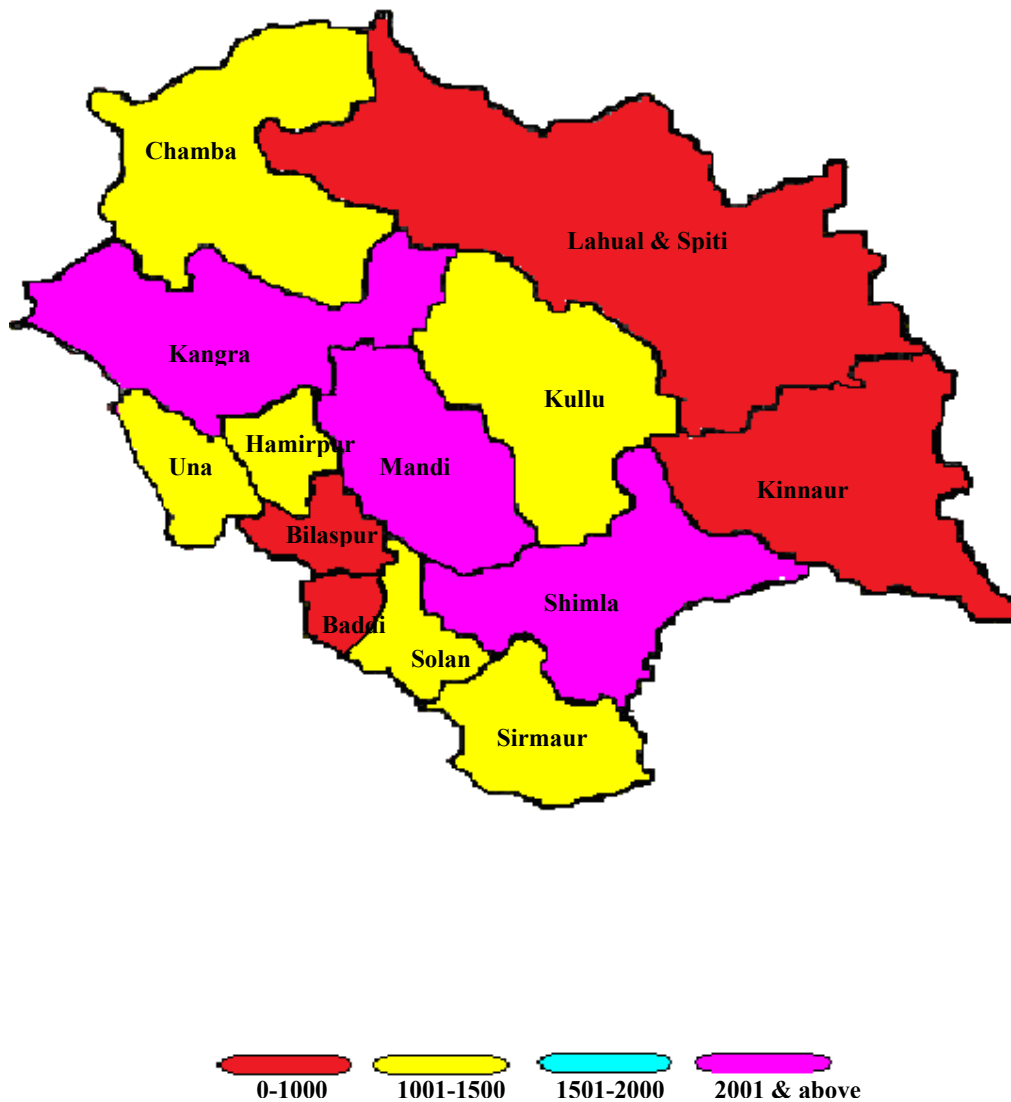

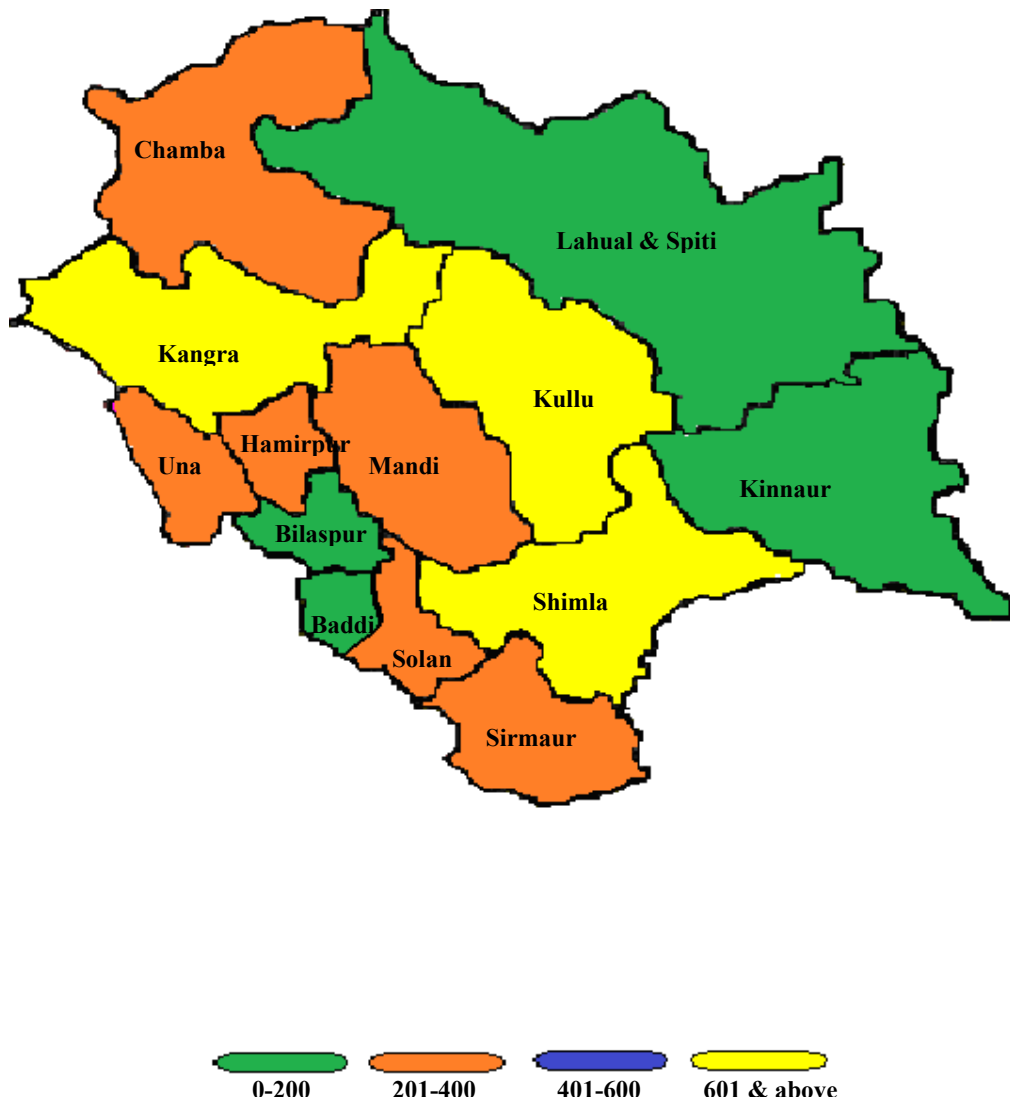

CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place of and on.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to support programmes for social, economic and educational to advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion race , sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To Uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, Special social enactments

have come into force from time to time including privileges by way of reservations for them

The major legal enactment sponsored by Centre is:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the constitution 65th amendment Act, 1990, National Commission for SCs and STs was constituted w.e.f. 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes Identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Hurt
- (iii) Rape
- (iv) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (v) Dacoity
- (vi) Robbery
- (vii) Arson
- (viii) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act,1989.

The crime under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:

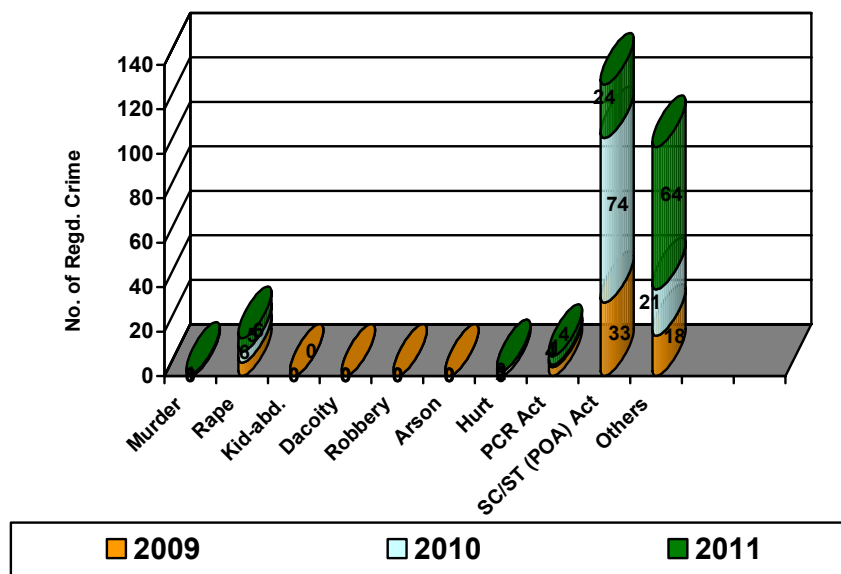
As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh the Scheduled Castes constituted 28.30 % of total population in the State whiles Scheduled Tribes constituted only 4.08 %. Kangra district with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Caste (18.60%) followed by Mandi (17.39%) and Shimla with (12.50%) while the Chamba district represented significantly high share of Scheduled Tribes (72.59%) followed by Kinnaur (23%) and Lahaul & Spiti (9.90%).

7.5 Incidence of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidence of these crimes (IPC+SLL) was reported to be 99 in the State during 2011. The Head wise details of crime against weaker section for the last 3 years including % change over the previous years is presented in Table 7.1. The Chart 7.1 depicts the head wise pictorial position of the crime incidence. The district wise and head wise incidence including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in Table 7.2.

The above data reflects that the incidence of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes has been increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incidence has been found registered during the year 2011. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been found registered during the years are given below:

(i) Murder:

During the years 2011, only 1 incidence of murder was reported under crime against weaker sections in Hamirpur district.

(ii) Rape:

During the years 2011, 6 incidence of rape was reported under crime against weaker sections showed an increase of 1 case

over the previous year 2010. In Shimla and Bilaspur districts 2 each cases were found registered with the highest followed by Kangra and Una (1 each). No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iii). SC/ST Protection of Civil Rights Act:

During the years 2011, 4 incidence of PCR Act was reported under this head which showed an increase of 3 cases over the previous year 2010. In district Kinnaur 2 cases were found registered with the highest followed by Solan and Bilaspur (1 each). No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv). SC/ST(Prevention Of Atrocities) Act, 1989:

During the years 2011, 24 incidences were reported under this head showed a huge decrease of 50 cases over the previous year 2010. Kangra district with the 10 cases remained on the top in registration under this head followed by Una (4 cases), Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Shimla and Solan (2 each), Baddi and Kullu (1 each). No incidence under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(v) Other IPC:

During the years 2011, 64 incidences were reported under other heads against the 21 registration for the previous year. Of the total cases 64.6 % cases were found registered under this head during the year 2011. In district Kangra 14 cases were found registered with the highest followed by Shimla (12), Kullu, Mandi and Sirmaur (7 each), Bilaspur (6), Chamba (5), Una (3), Hamirpur(2) and Solan (1). No case under this head was registered in Baddi and Lahaul & Spiti districts

CHAPTER-8

SUICIDAL DEATHS

8.1 General :

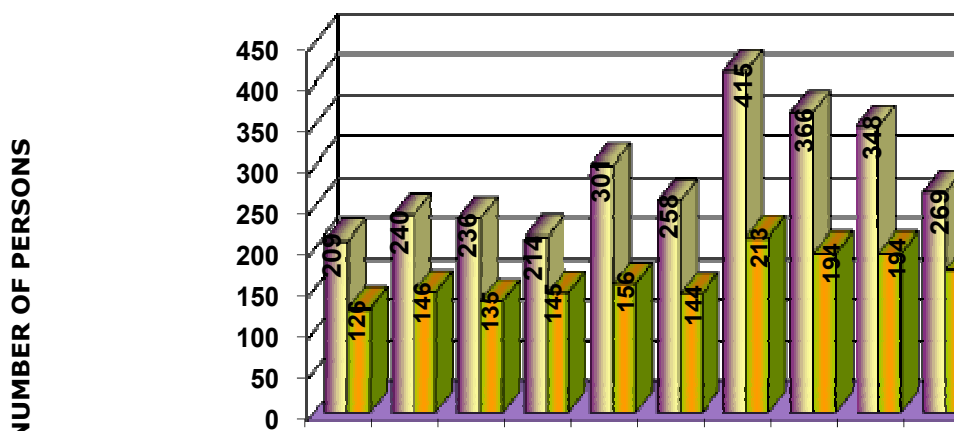
According to Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The 'suicide' word has its origin from Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'cardere' [kill]. It is a step which is taken by one normally in an emotionally or mentally weak moment when he or she feels coping with life is impossible

The number of Suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2011 was 443 as against 542 in 2010 indicating decrease of 18.27%.

Kangra District recorded the highest number of suicides during 2011 (116) followed by Hamirpur (58) and Shimla (52). Remaining districts reported below 50 cases of suicides. Suicides during 2002-2011 is presented in Chart 8.1

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2002-2011

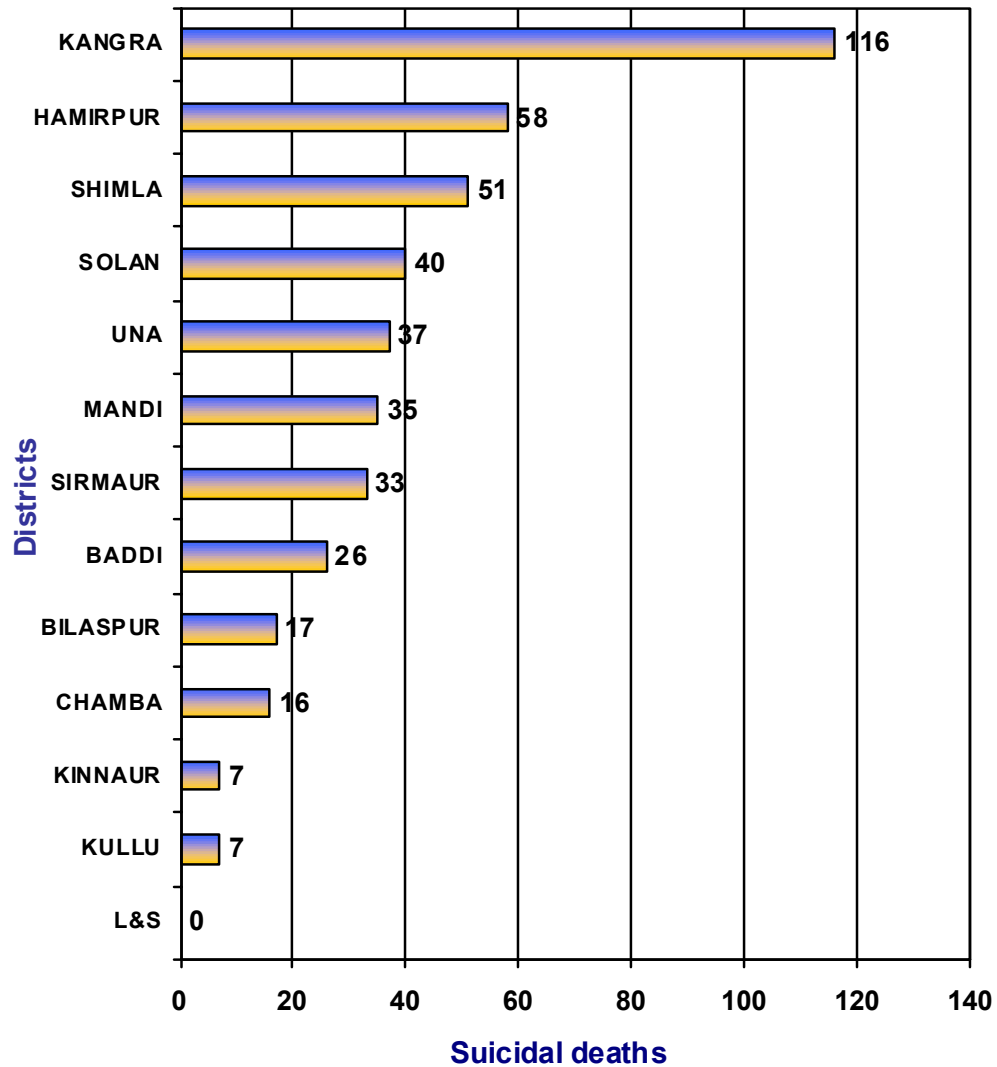

From the above table it is revealed that there has been decrease of over 18.27% (from 542 to 443) in suicide cases during the year 2011 over the year 2010. The major decrease has been witnessed in the districts of Bilaspur (from 84 to 17), Hamirpur (from 97 to 58), Kinnaur (22 to 7). However, there has been major increase in Kangra (from 89 to 116), Baddi (from 20 to 26)

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in the districts of Hamirpur, Kangra, Baddi and Solan has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned the years 2011. In other words, these 4 districts are more prone to suicidal deaths as compared to other 9 districts of Himachal Pradesh.

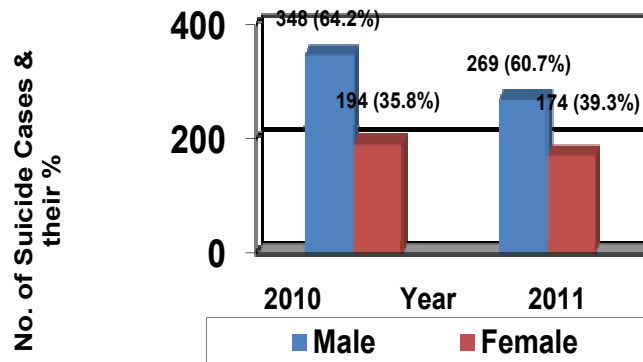
It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (64.21% males as against 35.79% females in 2010 and 60.7 % males as against 39.3% females in 2011).

It is further revealed that there has been decrease of 22.7% in the male suicide cases (from 348 to 269) as against 10.31% decrease

in the number of female suicide cases (from 194 to 174) during the year 2011 as compared to the year 2010.

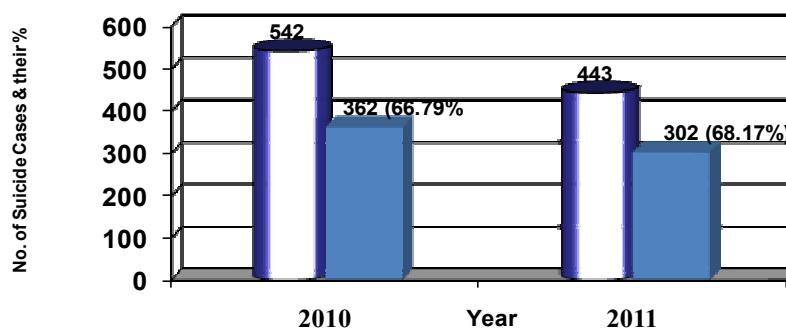

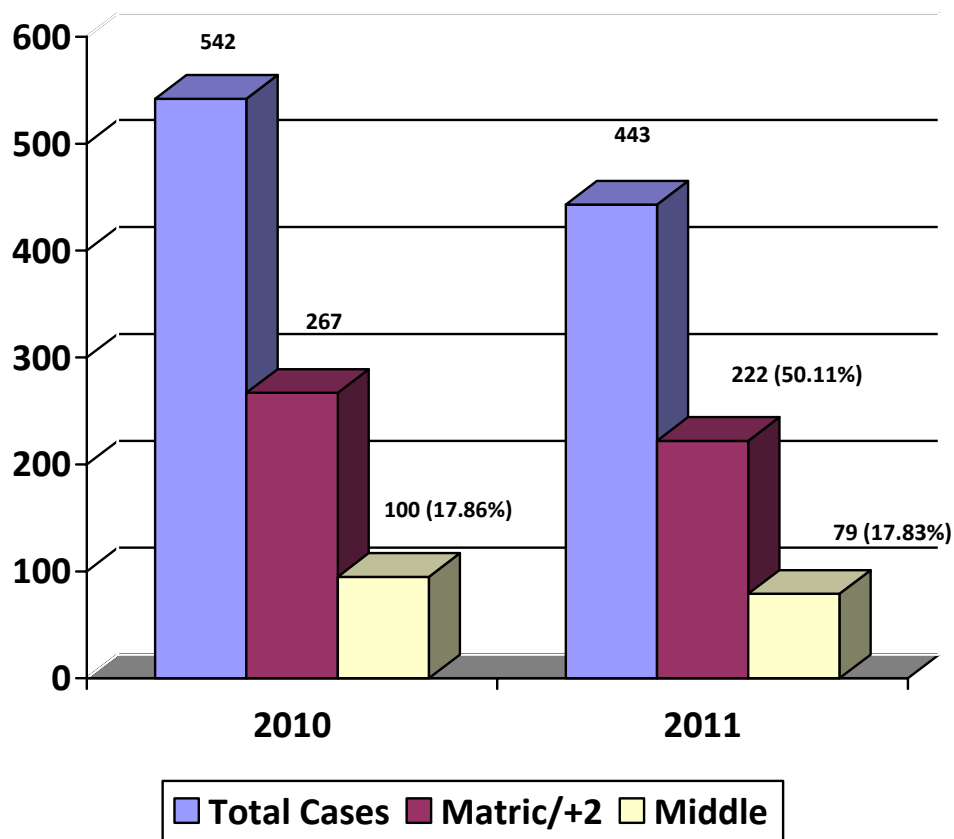

Analysis of the above table reveals that the most of the suicide victims belong to the group who has studied upto the **Matric/+2 level** (49.27% in 2010 and 50.22% in 2011). These are followed by those who have studied upto the **Middle level**.

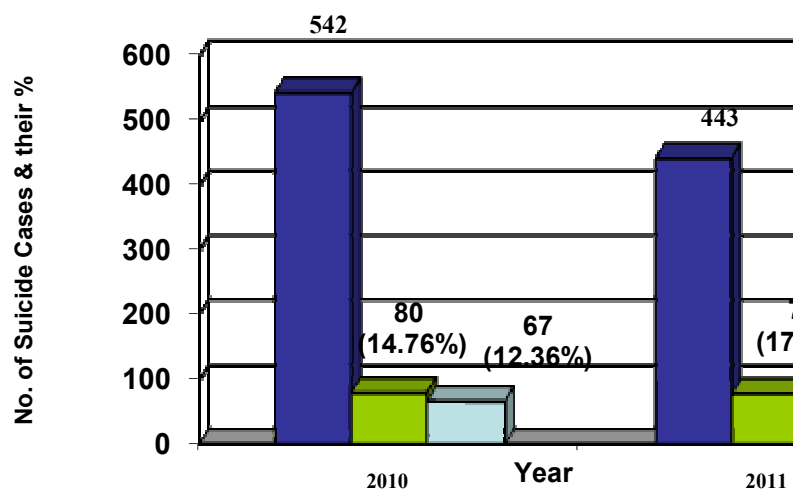

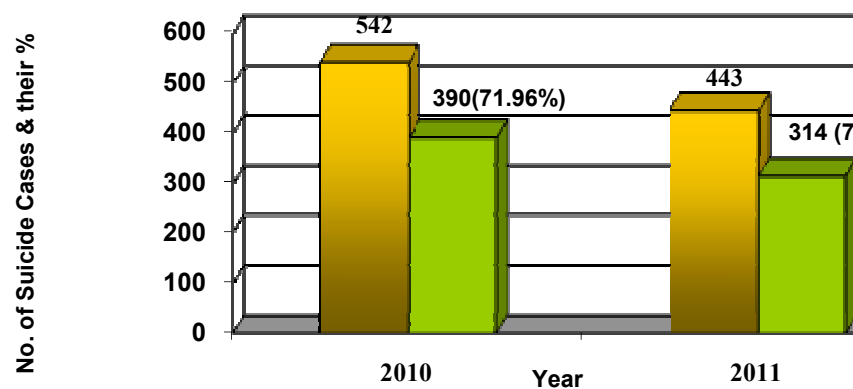

The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 15-29 and 30-44 years. Thus it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 15 to 44 years of age (71.96% in 2010 and 70.89% in 2011) This fact can be co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.

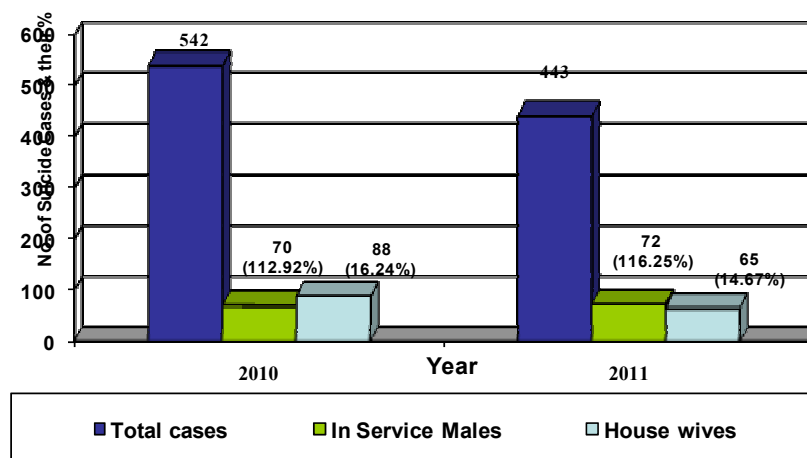

Another aspect that is brought forth is that those who committed suicide were mostly in service profession in case of males and **housewives** in the case of females. (in 2010, 12.92% males were in service and 16.24% females were housewives and in 2011, 16.25% males were in service and 14.68% females were housewives). This fact can again be co-related to the age profile falling within 15-44 years.

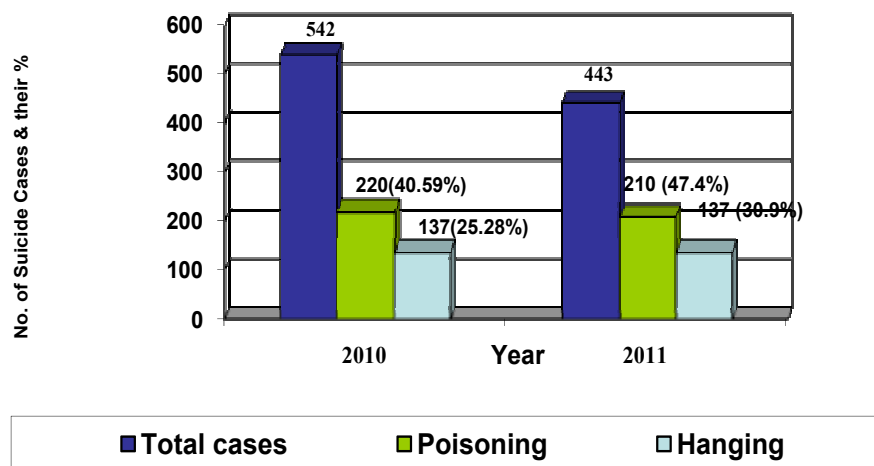

The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **consuming poison**. (40.59% in 2010 and 47.40% in 2011.) This is followed by hanging (25.28% in 2010 and 30.91% in 2011).

8.11. Conclusions:

- (i) There has been a decrease in the suicide cases, both in male & female cases during the year 2011 as against the year 2010.
- (ii) The districts of Hamirpur, Bilaspur Kangra were found more prone to suicidal deaths as compared to the other 10 districts of the state.
- (iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems' followed by 'Illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 5 % to total suicide cases.
- (iv) Most of the male suicide victims were in service and female suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form major group of suicide

victims as this group contributes only 5% to total suicide cases.

- (v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 15 to 44 years.
- (vi) The most popular means for committing suicide remained taking 'poison' followed by 'hanging'.

SUICIDES – 2011

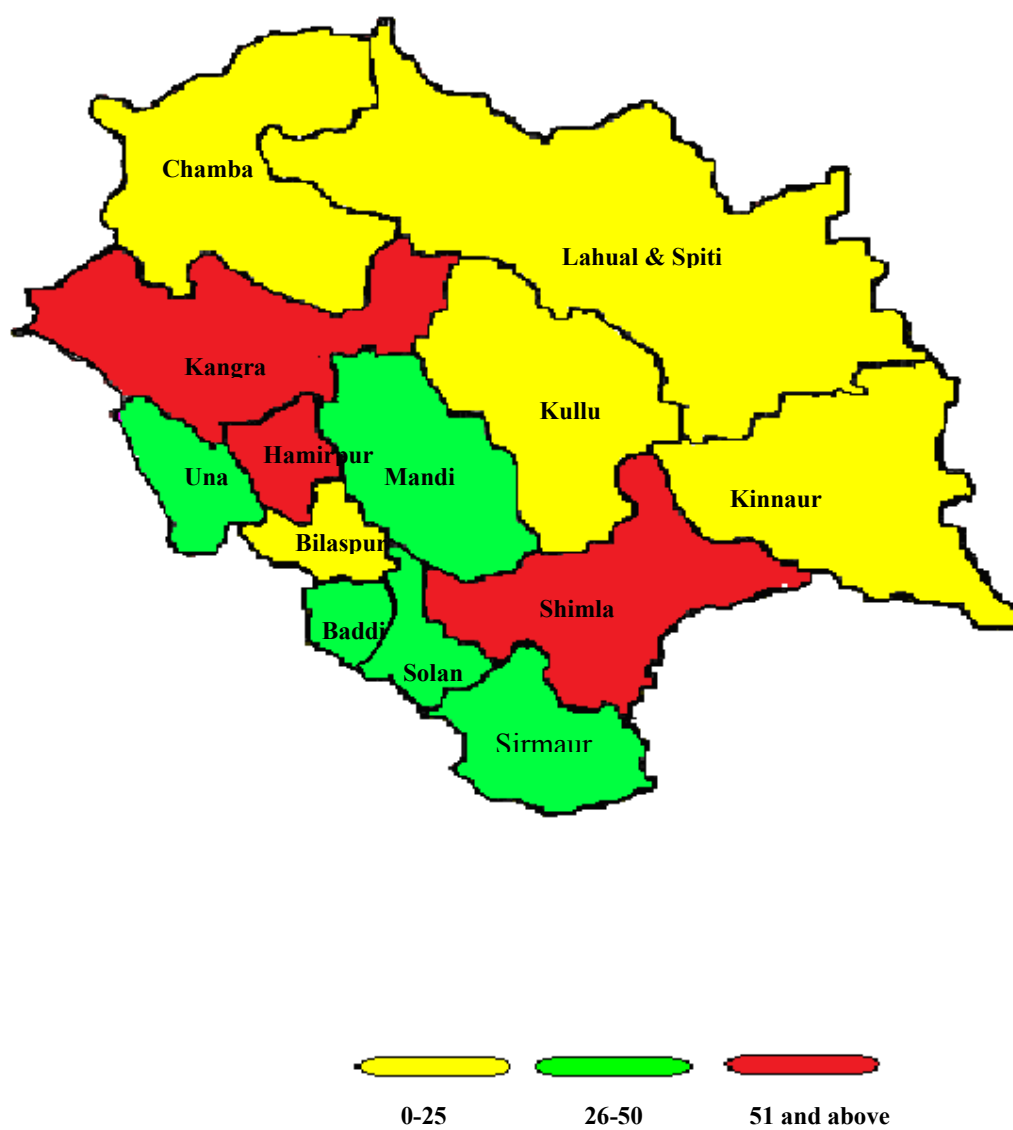

CHAPTER-9

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in Table-9.1

CAR/JEEP/TAXI/TEMPO account for the largest number of accidents. During the year 2011, 44.5 % of the road accidents were attributed to CAR/JEEP/TAXI/TEMPO. During the year 2010, 35.9% road accidents involved light vehicles (LMVs). District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2010-2011 is presented in Table-9.2. 3099 road accidents were reported during the year 2011 out of which 2372 fatalities, 727 accidents were fatal.

9.2 Accidental Deaths :

CAR/JEEP/TAXI/TEMPOS were responsible for 44.5% of accidental deaths during 2011. Out of 1083 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 482 were involved in accidents with these type of vehicle. Table-9.2 gives details of road accidental deaths for the year 2011 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. Shimla District reported the highest (149) accidental deaths followed by Chamba (133), Kangra (129) and Mandi (113). Chart-9.1 depicts road accidents occurred during 2002–2011.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the years 20011 is presented in Chart-9.2.

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2002-2011)

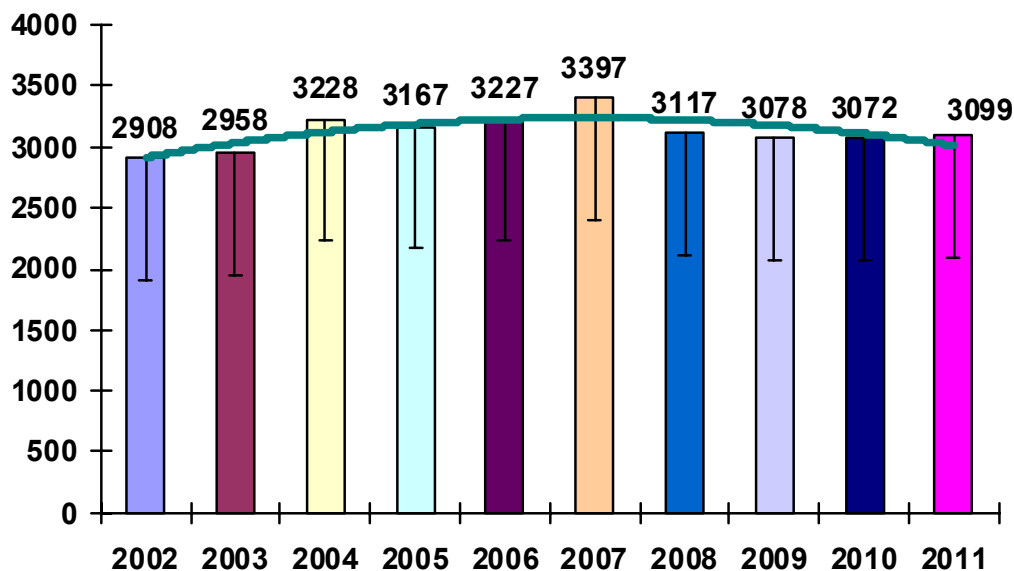

(ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2011)**

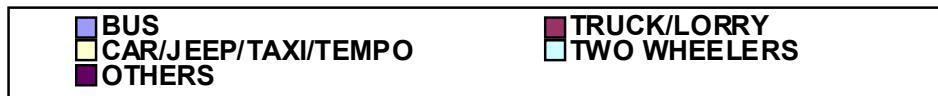
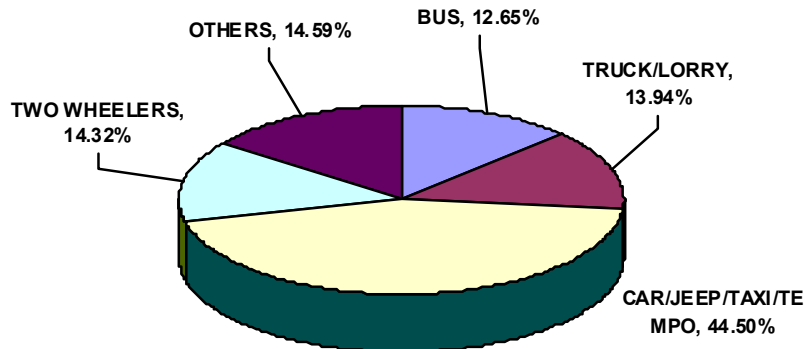

ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING -2011

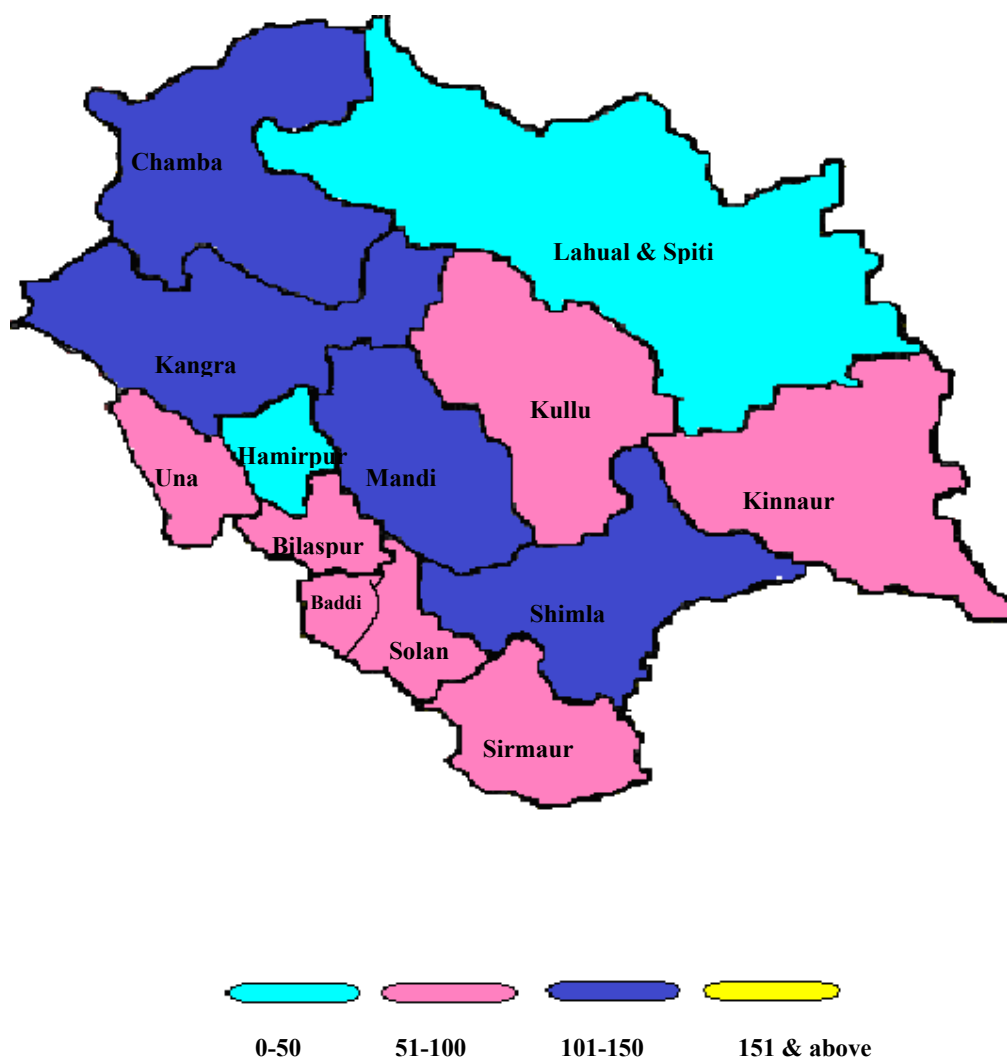
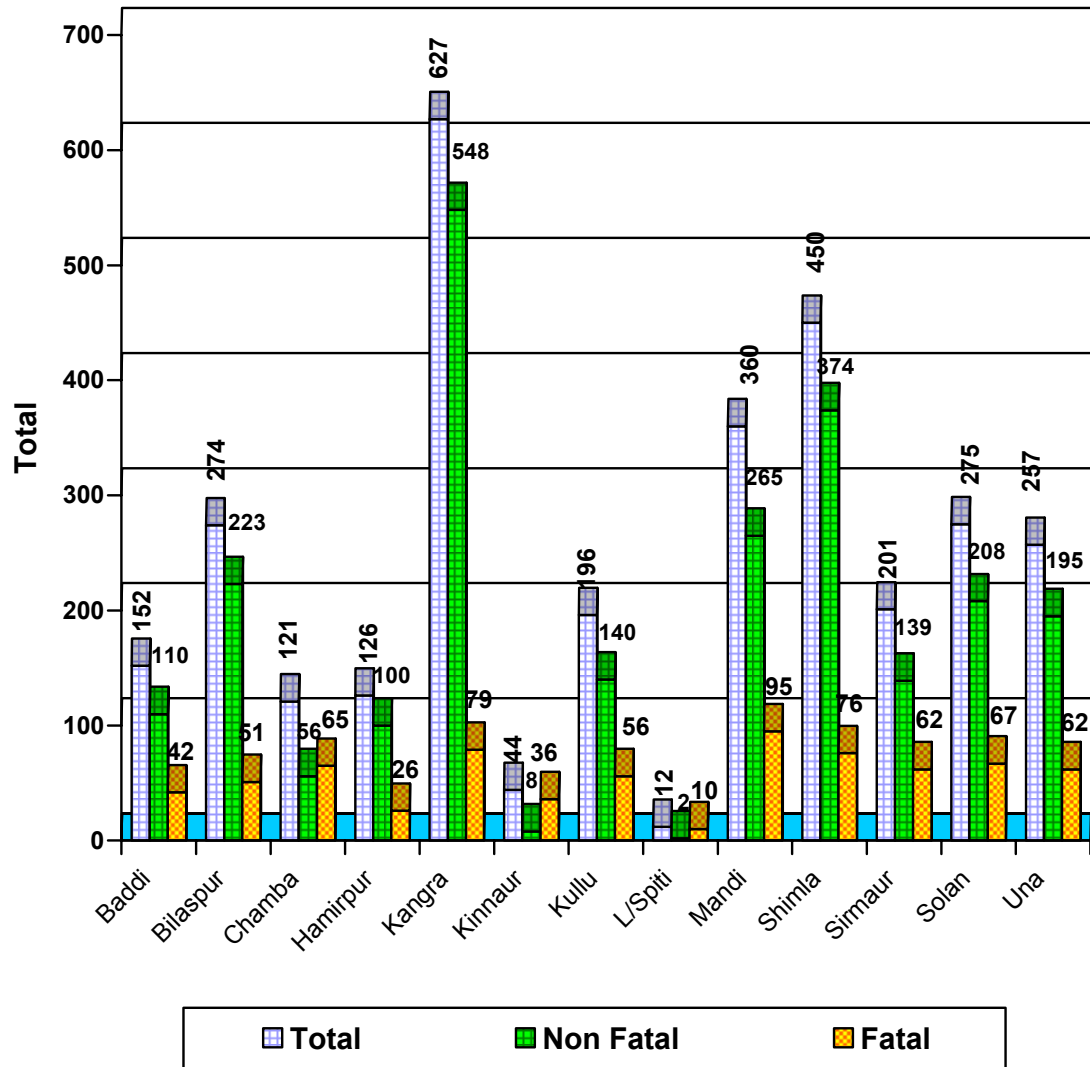

CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIMES

10.1. Definition of Cyber Crime:

“Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer.”

Computer and Tele-communications are the key areas of cyber crimes. In cyber crimes, the Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of cyber crime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for cyber crime when it becomes a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale net-works and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defence and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.

- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a protected computer programmes
- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
- (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
- (x) Computer espionage
- (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
- (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected computer programmes.

10.3. Incidence of Computer Crime:

During the year 2011, 20 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act+IPC) were registered in the State which showed an increase of 2 case over the previous year 2010. Chart 10.1 depicts the incidence of Cyber Crimes reported from 2009-2011. Table 10.1 carries the district-wise details of cases registered under IT Act and IPC. Table 10.2 gives the details of Cyber Crimes registered and persons arrested under I.T. Act and IPC during 2009-2011 :-

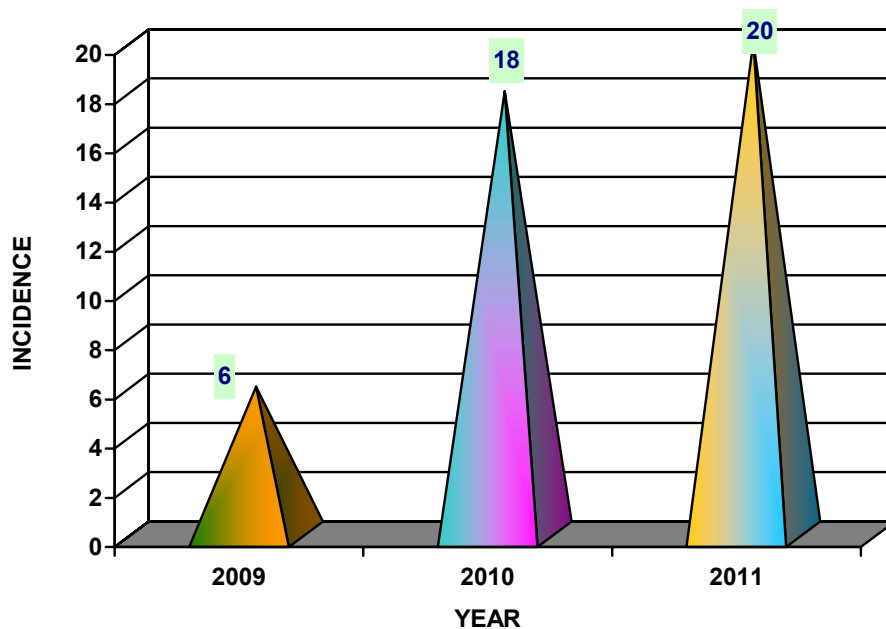

CHAPTER-11

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCE (ND&PS) ACT.

11.1 General:

A drug is a substance intended for use as a medicine for the alleviation of human and animal suffering either alone or in the form of a medical preparation. A drug when modify one or more of its functions. This would include not only medication meant for the treatment of the patients but also other pharmacologically active substances. In other words a drug is a substance that can cause change in man's body or way of thinking and feeling.

In Himachal Pradesh there are total 17495 villages out of which 402 villages of the following five Districts are the natural habitants of cannabis where it grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis at national and international level.

11.2 Narcotic Drugs:

In general, Narcotics drug can be defined as a awareness of sensory impulses, especially pain, by the brain. In large doses it caused stupor (Condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like pethidine.

11.3 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Phycho means “Soul” and “Trope” means ‘Turning’, and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The term psychotropic drug include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinals.
- 2) Hypnotics: Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) Stimulants: These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) Tranquillizers: Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.
- 5) Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates, opiates.

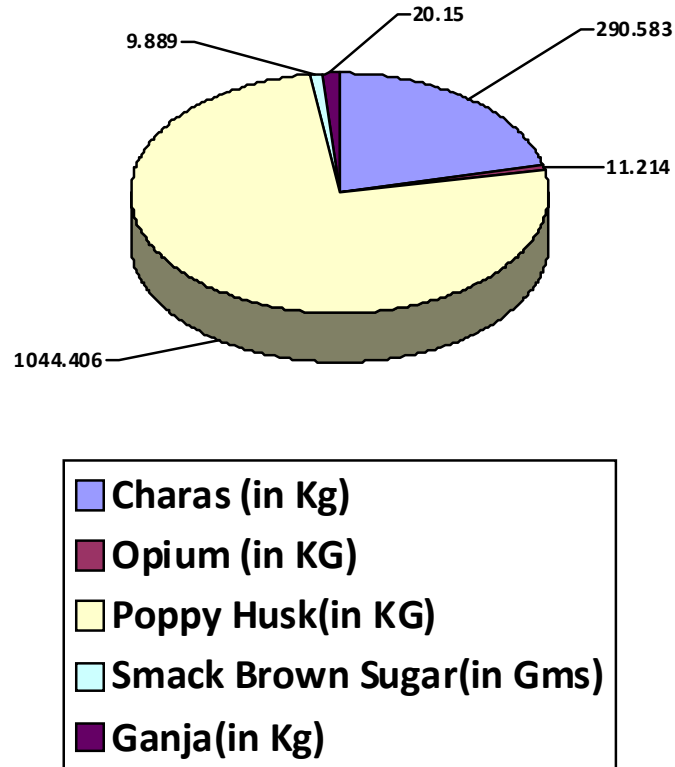

The drug-wise detection during the year 2011 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the chart 11.1. The major detection of poppy husk (1044.406Kgs) has been made during the year 2011 followed by charas (290.583 Kgs.). Detection of other drugs i.e. Opium is 11.214 Kgs., Smack 9.886 gms and ganja 20.150 Kgms has been made during the year 2011

11.6 Detailed Analysis :

The incidence of (570) under the ND&PS Act showed a minor decrease of 4.36% over 2010. Cases under this Act constituted 12.50% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2011. The highest incidence (200) cases were reported in Kullu district followed by Mandi (106), Shimla (69), Hamirpur (33), Bilaspur (28), Chamba and Kangra (27 each), Baddi and Solan (17 each), Una and PS CID (16 each) and Sirmaur (14). No case under this Act was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti Districts.

The main concentration on the incidence registered under this Act remains on District Kullu and Mandi with 56.88 % of the total

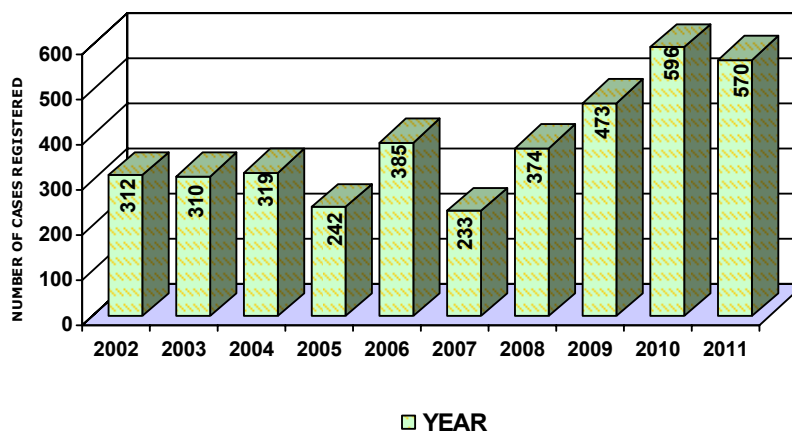
registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source / area of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further couriers of this contraband are mostly laborers and poor people.

The main concentration on the incidence registered under this Act remains on District Kullu and Mandi with 53.68 % of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source / area of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Hamirpur. Further couriers of this contraband are mostly laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 71.4 % belong to Himachal Pradesh and 28.6% were outsiders. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (63%). About 32% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 5%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible. Foreigners involved in this activity are mostly Italians and Israelis. Previous 10 Years (2002-2011). Crime under this head is presented in Chart-11.1

CHAPTER-12

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in the Himachal Pradesh during the year 2011 was 18448 while actual strength is 15350. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 307, which includes 89 IPS, and 169 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 29. The strength of executive force is 16397 which includes 2008 NGOs: Inspectors (259), Sub-Inspectors (649) Asstt. Sub-Inspectors (1100). The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 14389, (HCs- 2750 and Const.-11639). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III is 654, Class-IV 645 and other Whole time, Daily Wagers and Part Timers) is 416. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in Table 12.1.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2011, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 13 Districts (including one Police District at Baddi), 26 Police Sub-Divisions, 102 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP). Detailed summary is given in Table 12.2.

12.3 Police Housing:

The details of different types of available Police housing are depicted in Table 12.3.

12.4 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in Table 12.4. During the budget year 2011-2012 Himachal Pradesh Police Budget account for 2.03 % of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipments with Himachal Pradesh, during 2011 are presented in Table 12.5. There are 89 HF Sets, 959 VHF Sets, 1407 Walkie Talkies and 23 other equipments available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 474 Motor Cycles, 200 (Gypsy/Jeep/Bolero/Tata Mobiles), 145 Heavy Vehicles and 32 Vans & others. The district wise detail summary is given in Table 12.6.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge sheeting Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and chaland to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1960).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Include Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law :

A law applicable to a particular subject.
